

#### FIELD TRIP

#### Field Trip Tuesday July 22nd

We are planning a field trip to Textile Collections, a family-run wholesale fabric distributor in Downtown Los Angeles with over 30 years of experience in quilting cotton fabrics They normally only sell by the bolt, but they are opening their doors to select visitors (like Quilt Guilds!) to purchase by the yard from their flat fold selection which is currently several thousand bolts. They sell minky normally at \$6.87/yard if you buy the bold but could go as low as \$4-6/yard if the whole bolt is bought. If you are interested in purchasing by the yard it would 25% more \$5-\$7/yard. You can go to their website <a href="https://www.textilecollections.com">www.textilecollections.com</a> and set up an account, no resale number is needed. We will have signups at the next meeting.





An applique quilt has a top layer made of a single layer of fabric with additional pieces stitched on top. It was more popular with wealthier quilters, since nicer fabric had to be purchased and more time was spent adding intricate detail.

How many of you remember dressing up for Easter? Each year my grandfather would buy me a new dress, and my brothers got new shirts. My favorite dress was dotted Swiss – I don't know if that is even available any more. And, of course, white gloves for little girls went without question.

I delivered 20 quilts to the Veterans Home in Chula Vista, and 47 quilts to Ronald McDonald House!



In the last couple of months, I have been sharing about machine quilting with a domestic sewing machine. The two main ways to prepare your "quilt sandwich" for quilting is by pinning, or spray basting. There is a great tutorial by Patsy Thompson on spray basting, answering a lot of questions Here is the link: <a href="Patsy Thompson Spray Basting">Patsy Thompson Spray Basting</a> [In case the above link does not work for you, just go to your internet provider and type in: Patsy Thompson spray basting.]

When I tried this method, I did it outside. I bought a 4x8 piece of insulation board from Home Depot and

leaned it up against a shed in the back yard. It would be better to affix the insulation board to the shed wall – I'm working on that. The photo on left shows the backing pinned to the board. Next step was to lightly spray the backing fabric all over. Measure and put a pin at the center top – so you will be able to place the next two fabrics correctly.

The next step was to place the batting on, pinning it at the top, matching centers, and then smoothing it out, easing out any wrinkles. After this was done, the batting was spray basted.



Finally, the quilt top was put in place, and like in the steps before, the wrinkles were smoothed out. When done, I trimmed off the excess fabric and removed the quilt from the insulation board.

The last photo is the quilt sandwich being quilted with a walking foot. Kathryn Diamond is right in saying that the walking foot is a great tool for quilters.



Keep those sewing machines whirling! See you at the meeting.

**Microwave Bowls** - We could use food fabric or other appropriate novelty prints and or matching tone on tone for interior. The











































































## **2025 MEMBER CHALLENGE**


