





The weather lately has been lovely. If the saying holds true, guess that means that March will go out like a lion, which is okay, as blustery cold weather is great for quilting.

Please give a round of applause for our members

who donated philanthropy quilts at our February meeting: Karen Brixner, Melanie Ellsworth, Anna Lancia, Trudy Ooms, Julie Reyes, and Linda Simpson.

Last month I wrote briefly about quilting with a spray-basted "quilt sandwich" (the front, batting and back). Now I am featuring another technique.

Last month we received a beautiful scrappy strip quilt that was quilted on a Viking Eden Rose domestic sewing machine by Anna Lancia. Anna pinned the "quilt sandwich" together Ask her at the meeting how she does this. The quilting was done following the pieces of fabric, not sewn "in the ditch". The thread matched the fabric on both sides – it is white on the top you see, and black on the bottom where the backing was black. It turned out lovely, and will make someone very happy.

Keep those sewing machines whirling! See you at the March meeting!!!




2025 MEMBER CHALLENGE

An update on the Challenge Quilt for 2025. The theme for this year is 'Houses Around the World - Everyone Needs a Home'

The possibilities are endless when you start thinking about where and how people live. Think Little House on the Prarie, log cabins, teepees, Amsterdam Row houses, Chinese sampans, Tibetan yurts, your own home or dream home, high rise condos, doll houses, dog houses, bird houses, tree houses, light houses, RVs etc, etc!



Just a few rules and requirements. One entry per member, must have three layers and maximum size with a perimeter of 180 inches. Your quilt can be any shape and no hanging sleeve is needed. The judging will be Viewers Choice and there will be awards for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place.

The quilts will be displayed at the Kaleidoscope Quilt Show on October 18th. A date and place for the turn in of quilt entries and completed entry form will be announced in September.

FIELD TRIP

Field Trip Possibility

We are working with this store to set up a time to go up. If you have knowledge of other stores we could visit please let us know. Textile Collections, , a family-run wholesale fabric distributor in Downtown Los Angeles with over 30 years of experience in quilting cotton fabrics has contacted us about coming up and shopping with them. We normally only sell by the bolt, but we are opening our doors to select visitors (like Quilt Guilds!) to purchase by the yard from our flat fold selection which is currently several thousand bolts. We would need to make an appointment to make sure they had someone on hand to cut fabric. They sell minky



normally at \$6.87/yard if you buy the bold but could go as low as \$4 -6/yard if the whole bolt is bought. If interesting in purchasing by the yard it would 25% more \$5-\$7/yard. You can go to their website www.textilecollections.com set up an account no resale number is needed. We will have a brief discussion at our meeting to see if anyone is interested in going.

Workshop: Inspired by Architecture

Kaleidoscope will be sponsoring a workshop with David Owen Hastings on March 18th, 2025. The cost is \$75. I already started taking signups at the October meeting. If you would still like to attend the workshop please send me an email so I can secure you a place in the workshop.

David will guide you through a creative process for designing your own modern abstract quilts, taking inspiration from architectural photos to develop dynamic and unique quilt designs.

MONUMENTAL INSPIRATION WITH UNLIMITED POSSIBILITIES

Working from photos of architectural elements, David will guide you through the steps to design a minimal, modern fabric quilt... inspired by architecture! You will learn the quilt-as-you-go method, sewing the top pieces, batting and backing simultaneously. You'll then add texture and complexity with David's unique approach to walking foot machine quilting where the quilting lines become a major design element. Learn to connect multiple quilted units with a great gusset join technique, then add a simple face binding for a modern finish.

WORKSHOP DETAILS

Experiment with different elemental geometric shapes, including gentle curves

Explore spare, simple compositions for a modern look

Think about figure and ground

Consider the sewing lines as a key design element

Select 1-2 photos, and break them down into elemental shapes with tracing paper and pencil

Assess which compositions work well, and choose one to translate into fabric

Discuss color and value choices and decide on a palette

Map out pieces for one composition

Label and cut out cardboard pattern pieces, or cut pieces improv style

Audition colors and placement

Translate pattern pieces into fabric, leaving a generous amount of extra fabric for seam allowances

Build composition with the quilt-as-you-go method, trying out multiple fabrics, stepping back to assess the effect of each

Add texture and surface design with layered walking foot quilting motifs

Using the same photo, create a small series of completely quilted units

Connect multiple quilted units with a great gusset join technique

Face bind your quilt for a modern look

A complete supply list with example architectural photos will be emailed to each participant. Class sizes are limited to ensure one-on-one time.

This is an all-levels workshop. You should be comfortable using your sewing machine, and it should be in good working order. Basic knowledge of walking foot quilting is helpful, but not necessary. I look forward to sharing and sewing with you!
