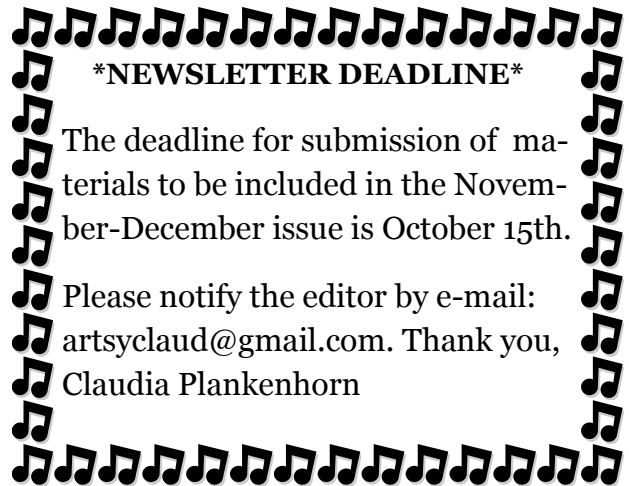

The prep sheet lists paints and brushes you need to bring to class. The paints are all Deco Art Americana with the exception of Titanium White which is a Traditions paint. The Liquid Glass and Glamour Dust are optional items. Glamour Dust is just dust. Debbie's use of these will be explained.

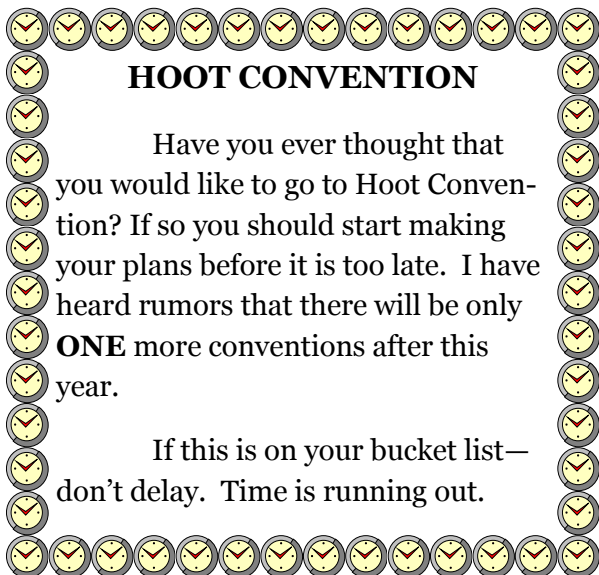
