We have the room reserved until 3:00 p.m. Bring your own lunch and drink if you will need something.


Directions: San George Estates 10 E. South Stage Road, Medford

You need to make your way to Hwy 99 in Medford. If you are coming via the freeway, you take the South Medford exit and turn right onto Garfield St. Get into the left lane to Hwy 99 and turn left. Income: Dues, Bunco party, Recycling, Raffles & donations


Expenses: Rent, Insurance, monthly teacher fees, annual 2-day seminar, storage room and Christmas party

## Painting Tip from Judi

When using Painter's Tape to mark off a border or to paint a straight line, try brushing on some DecoArt Matte Medium over the tape edge and let it dry before painting. This will help keep the paint from bleeding under the tape.

## Painting Tip from Karen D

When you are floating shading or highlights and the color seems too harsh of a transition, try brush mixing a little of the base coat color in your brush with the shading or highlight color.

This will help make a smoother float. When this is dry, float the full shading or highlight color on top but in a narrower float.

Reminder...please remember to take your own trash home after each club meeting and paint-in.

Keep a small trash bag at your seat to collect your own trash.
