## Upcoming Chapter Projects

**May 22, 2021**

### RURAL OREGON

Fabric painting pattern designed by Phyllis Maurer (Patterns are two sizes 11x17 and 8.5 x 12—can be resized to fit your surface)

#### SUPPLIES:

White or pastel shirt. Prewashed, no softener.  
(Can be found at Hobby Lobby)

Plastic covered cardboard-17"x 20" minimum.

#### BRUSHES: (Fabric brushes are stiffer)

#12 flat-Robert Simmons #431B

Liner

#8 Scrubber Robert Simmons #431R

#6 Round-Robert Simmons #431R (I painted most of the project with this brush)

iron on pencil ( in the fabric section)

Marvy Fabric Marker (I like a finer tip for outlining) - can be found at Hobby Lobby.

#### PAINT;

Black, White, Cad Yellow, Lemon Yellow, Honey Brown, Tomato Red, Tangelo Orange, Burnt Umber, Sapphire, Hauser Lite, Hauser Medium, Hauser Dark.

#### Instructions:

Using iron on pencil trace over all lines of pattern you wish to transfer to shirt. Don't trace over shading lines or dotted lines. One line for each post should be enough. (I believe pattern must be put on backwards if using this method)

Transfer pattern to shirt using hot iron according to instructions given with iron- on pencil. Insert cardboard into shirt and secure with masking tape be sure fabric is secure so it won't move while you are painting on it.

(Optional way to transfer pattern) If you can see through the fabric of your shirt, you can secure the pattern and the shirt together on the cardboard and trace the outline with your Marvy marker. Then remove the pattern for further reference.

Editor's Notes: Lois will hand out patterns at the April Seminar and if you are not attending Seminar—Call Lois (541-846-9341) and she will mail pattern to you. Lois has the iron pencils you can ask her about and will have fabric medium at the chapter meeting. The pattern size is 15 x 17. You can paint this on any surface of your choice and can adjust pattern to fit your surface, you can also use regular paints if your surface will not be washed in washing machine. 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OMG Our seminar with Rosemary West is really going to happen. In spite of the changes we have to make to be Covid safe it is going to be a fun time for all. A few reminders for all those attending:

1. Masks will be required at the seminar. We will social distance the tables so when you are seated and painting you will not need to wear your mask but when you are up walking around you need your mask on.

2. Saturday am the doors to the Grange will be locked until 8am to give the set-up crew time to do their thing. The Grange assured us that they do a major cleaning between each event but our crew will be wiping down counters and door knobs etc Saturday and Sunday am. We will have chairs spaced out in the large room. You need to set your table up with an empty chair. Do not move the chairs from their spot as we will have measured out the necessary spacing. Out of towners- we will have tables for you no need to bring your own. Grange doors will open on Sunday at 8:30.

3. You are to bring your own card table or smallish table. We will use the chairs at the grange.

4. We will supply garbage bags for each table. You are to take home all the garbage you generate that day including your lunch garbage. We will have plenty of bags. Please bring tape to affix bags to your table.

5. We will not be having our usual spread of ten million calories of snacks. If you want snacks for yourself during the day please bring from home.

6. You will be given a small bottle of hand sanitizer. If you use it all up on Saturday please refill it at home and bring it for use on Sunday.

7. We will be having a raffle. There will be a drop off table for you to place your donations. The raffle person will wipe each item down and move it to the "clean" table. The rule when picking out your raffle prize will be don't touch anything except the item you want.

8. Rosemary will be bringing packets and some of the filberts she likes to use. We will have tables set up in the small room. Please stop at the hand sanitizer station prior to shopping. The "store" will be open for browsing by lunchtime on Saturday.

9. We will be ordering individually packed lunches for you. Lunch will be eaten at our painting tables.

10. You each will be given little paint cubbies for your table. Do not panic when you see how small they are. Chroma paint goes a long way and much of what we are doing will be dry brushing. We will have enough to send you home with enough paint to finish your projects. Also quite a few of us have Chroma paint at home We will make sure you are not stranded and unable to finish your project. (Continued on page 6)

11. Bring your own coffee mugs. We will have coffee and hot water available in the kitchen. Sugar and creamer will be in individual packets. Please stop at the hand sanitizer station before going in the kitchen.

12. Please sign the disclaimer form in this newsletter and bring with you to the seminar




### LET FREEDOM RING!


