Painting tip from Kellie Pomeroy

me time to watch others. The lady next to me had a stylus that looked like the picture and I watched how quickly and accurately she placed dots. I asked her about the stylus and she said she wanted to see the end for easier placement, so she took pliers to a stylus and made her tool. So did I. It works great!!!

I thought I would share my experience with the Zoom classes I took last month that were produced by CDWood. I took 3 of the classes that they offered as part of their SummerZoomFest. The class were each \$38 but that included the surface, the pattern and with two of the classes stencils and stamps needed for the project. The classes were each 4 hours.

The pace was quite comfortable much like a convention class or a seminar. The teacher was able to see all the attendees who had cameras hooked to their computer (I do not) and was able to see if people were ready to move on. The attendees were muted which was nice because unlike a convention class or a seminar you were not trying to hear the teacher over the students talking. There was a monitor available for the teacher so students were able to type a question in the comment box and that was relayed to the teacher. The camera was placed above the teacher's piece so it was really better than a front row seat. The only drawback was the live classes were on Ohio time so I ended up getting up at 5am for one class. But CDwood sends an email link to the recorded video the next day so you can download this to your computer.

I have been watching Facebook postings re: Zoom classes. Some are more expensive. Some do not offer a recorded video you can download so you have to read carefully and yes take the time difference into consideration. I convinced Kellie to take a Zoom class and she was quite pleased and completed a very pretty project. Sandy McTier posted she taught a 2 day seminar to a Chapter with Zoom. The chapter will have to find a more techie person than me to figure out how to do that!! Anyway the Zoom app is a free download and easy to do, give it a try!

Artists Helping Artists

As you are all aware, the south end of Jackson County was devastated by the recent fires. Whole neighborhoods were wiped out and the fires did a hopscotch of businesses in Talent and Phoenix. I wanted to go see for myself, and I can confirm the photos did not do it justice.

I set my destination at a small business called Scrappy Craft which has many of the items we tole painters need, and they have been actively trying to stock more and more DecoArt paint. I wanted to support a local business who was trying to survive Covid and fires. They had some smoke damage, and will have to repaint, but generally survived intact. What broke my heart were the stories the manager told me about former students and many others coming in to get some art supplies. People had lost everything and yet needed some pencils and a pad, or some markers, or a small watercolor set, to give them solace in the time of extreme loss. Many are staying in hotels or someone's guest room and they have no room for the ton of stuff we would be willing to donate. Their needs were small but immediate.

Have you been wanting to help fire victims, but didn't know a legitimate charity to make sure the victims truly got your aid? At our previous Board meeting in the park we discussed routing our regular FISH donation to something for fire victims. Dottie Bishop was tasked with finding a legitimate charity for this. After the trip to Scrappy Craft it was evident that we could make a gesture to help other artists. We had around \$225 in the kitty and Scrappy Craft agreed to hand out special \$15 gift certificates and our card to customers who they felt were truly in need. This was accomplished last Friday. Now if you would like to also contribute to this fund, please mail your check, in any amount, made out to "SDA". (We need the paper trail.) Dottie will then accumulate the checks, convert to a grand total check, and take it to Scrappy Craft for more gift certificates. 
