Tip from Paulette DiGesare

When Paulette was here she happened to mention a tip to a few of us while she was in the back of the room helping out. Someone mentioned the ongoing struggle we all have with getting paint on our clothes. That brought on this tip from Paulette that she just happen to mention casualty. I have since tried it and by golly it works.

Go to the hardware store and get a can of DENATURED ALCOHOL. Apply the DA directly to the paint on the clothing liberally. Rub and scrub the DA in. I have even used a soft tooth brush for this part. This should break up all or part of the paint depending on how long it's been there or dried up it is. (Obviously the sooner you can do this treatment the easier it is to get out the paint). Once you feel you have done a pretty good job of getting the paint out you then spray with AWESOME. Yes the wonderful toxic formula we have all grown to love from the Dollar Store. Once both are applied wash as usual. Before you place the laundered article in the dryer check the area as you may have to repeat the treatment again.


I have tried this 3 or 4 times with great success. Even got out a paint stain that was over a year old on an item that had been washed and dried several times. So good luck and paint without fear!

Mini Pecan Muffins (Served at Bunco)

1 Cup Chopped Pecans

1/2 Cup Flour

1 Cup Brown Sugar, packed

2/3 Cup Melted Butter

2 Eggs

Mix together—spoon into greased/floured mini muffin tins. (I use Pam Baking Spray) Bake at 350 for about 15 minutes.

Cool slightly and turn out of tins to cool.

BUNCO Coleslaw Recipe

Yield: approximately 10 servings

1/2 C. Sour Cream

1/3 C. Regular Mayonnaise

Sugar Substitute (original recipe calls for 2/3C but I find that too sweet. 1/3 C.

So adjust to taste)

2 T. Red wine vinegar

12 oz. * Shredded white cabbage * Shredded red cabbage 4oz.

* or use 1- 14oz pre-shredded coleslaw package

Kosher salt 1 tsp. 1/4 tsp. Black pepper

1/4 tsp. Nutmeg

In a large bowl mix the dressing ingredients. When blended well add to the cabbage and mix together.

Chill for at least 2 hours
