

Julie's Poppyseed Cake

- 1 box yellow cake mix
- 1 pkg instant vanilla pudding mix
- 1/2 cup canola oil
- 4 eggs
- 1 tsp almond extract
- 1 tsp vanilla extract
- 3 1/2 Tbsp poppyseeds
- 1 cup hot water

Mix all ingredients together and beat on medium speed for about 2 minutes.

Bake in a greased and floured Bundt pan at 350 degrees for 35 minutes.

Let stand 10 minutes before turning out to cool. When cool spread with glaze or dust with powdered sugar.

Glaze

- 1 cup powdered sugar
- 1 Tbsp softened butter
- 1/4 tsp vanilla
- 1 Tbsp sour cream (If not available, you may substitute vanilla yogurt or milk)

Mix ingredients together. If needed, add drops of milk to get the proper consistency.
