BRIDGE GROUP

We are changing the location of our bridge this upcoming season. The Lakeridge Tennis Club at McCarran & Plumas will host our event for the same price we have been paying at the Airport Plaza. We will be playing and eating in the main restaurant (above the level of the tennis courts) and will have a choice of four menu items each month (changed monthly). Check-in procedures will remain the same: 9:45 check-in with \$16 in cash (\$15 for lunch and \$1 for bridge prizes.)

If this location is new to you, you can be dropped off at the round-about entrance, accessed from Plumas, which puts you on the same level as the restaurant. If driving, you can park in the lot off McCarran and take the stairs or elevator to the second floor. The elevator is located on the west end of the building and you'll need to "jig" through the small office to not set off the alarm. OR you can park in the lot off Plumas and walk down to the entrance.

We will no longer be charged for no-shows for lunch, but it is no fun to have to use a rotating

dummy. Please don't say you are coming if there is more than a 10% chance you won't. Last minute emergencies happen, however, so plan to get your own sub and let us know either way at 762-1765. **NOTE:** First day of play is **September 8th**, not the 1st, as the restaurant is closed on September 1st.
