# **TCC BOARD ACTIONS AND ACTIVITIES**

The TCC Officers and Directors meet monthly from August through May. The August meeting is the planning meeting for the coming year. Below are highlights from the April 9, 2024 meeting. Minutes from the meetings are available upon request.

Membership Dues to Increase for 2024-25

With rising operating and luncheon costs, the directors deemed that it would be fiscally irresponsible to continue operating at a loss each month. The directors approved a \$25 increase in dues beginning with the 2024-25 program year. The TCC's annual dues will be \$75.

Directors Approve Philanthropy Committee Recommendations

The directors approved the Philanthropy Committee's recommendation for awarding this year's grants. The CFNN will release the \$22,000 previously approved by the board. In February, the board approved the release of—\$1,598 raised by the club members for scholarships plus an additional \$3,000 in non-earmarked funds from the club's operating checking account to augment the \$22,000 bringing the total award to \$26,598.

Bev Waldron motioned to accept the Philanthropy Committee's recommendation, Kimberly seconded and Tatjana provided her proxy vote of "yes" to Kimberly. One member voted "no" in absentia expressing her concerns to Kimberly regarding the release of the \$4,598 for this year's scholarships given the nine-month offset the club will experience next year due to the change in the CFNN's fiscal year. Roberta was traveling, but the necessary quorum was met.

# PHILANTHROPY REPORT—GRANT RECIPIENTS

Within the Twentieth Century Club's philanthropic areas of emphasis – Social Service, Literacy, Animal Welfare, Science/Education, the committee for Philanthropy have worked to develop four (4) recipients of funds based on a rubic scoring system. The following organizations have been identified as the recipients for the 2023-24 program year with gift amounts:

Here is a brief synopsis of the work Eddy House, PBS Reno and SPCA are doing in our community.

**Social Services** – <u>Eddy House</u> is a daytime drop-in center and overnight shelter for homeless, runaway, foster and other at-risk youth. Eddy House works with youth to develop life and job skills necessary for sustainable independence with the goal of ending youth homelessness in Northern Nevada. In 2023, Eddy House served: 511 youth & amp; provided transportation 2,846 times, 16,489 overnight stays, 1,020 counseling sessions, and 31,933 meals.

**Literacy** – <u>**PBS Reno</u>** offers free "Curiosity Classroom" workshops specifically developed for Pre-K through 4th grade students for educators and community educational organizations. An engaging video clip, followed by reading a book, and finally, a fun hands-on activity pertaining to the subject matter is integrated into each workshop. Lessons are aligned to the Common Core Standards, NextGeneration Science Standards and Nevada Academic Content Standards. All materials are supplied by PBS Reno and a trained facilitator (retired teacher) leads the 45 to 60-minute workshop.</u>

Animal Welfare – SPCA of Northern Nevada was established in 1998 and its mission is to connect people with homeless pets, fostering joy, love and compassion within the community and beyond. In 2023, SPCA achieved notable successes: 1487 homeless pets adopted with a very low pet return rate of 6%; 2935 affordable (\$35) spay/neuter surgeries; financial assistance to 202 low-income community members covering 80% of their pets' vet bills; distributed 93 dental and surgery vouchers to the community; and, Kids Reading with Rescues Program: monthly program where kids get to read books to the dogs in their kennels saw128 participants in the program.
