	Water Willow (<i>Decodon Verticillatus</i>)	Shade	Pink	Lake edges, Shrub-like Plant, Shallows and lakeshores
	Thimbleberry (<i>Rubus Paviflorus</i>)	Sun-Shade	White	Blooms May –August; Red berries valuable to wildlife
	Meadowsweet (<i>Spiraea alba</i>)	Sun—Part Sun	White	Fragrant; bark and roots source of aspirin, shoreline stabilizer
	Steeplebush (<i>Spiraea Tomentosa</i>)	Sun—Part Sun	Pink	Good landscape plant; shoreline stabilizer
	Pasture Rose (<i>Rosa Carolina</i>)	Sun—Part Sun	Pink	Red hips; Dry, loamy soil conditions
	Buttonbush (<i>Cephalanthus occidentalis</i>)	Sun—Part Sun	White	Wetland Shrub; Glossy Foliage; Deer Resistant Up to 15' tall

	Tall Beardtongue (<i>Penstemon digitalis</i>)	Sun-Part Sun	White	Mesic	36-48" attracts pollinators; blooms May-July
	Pearly Everlasting (<i>Anaphalis Margaracita</i>)	Sun-Part Sun	White	Dry-mesic	1-2' tolerates the driest soils; deer resistant
	Wild Bergamot (<i>Monarda fistulosa</i>)	Sun-Part Sun	Purple	Dry-mesic	24-36" dense flower head, attracts hummingbirds & butterflies; blooms May-Sept.
	Evening Primrose (<i>Oenothera biennis</i>)	Sun-Part Sun	Yellow	Mesic	4-6' Biennial, loved by goldfinches; deer resistant
	Wild Strawberry (<i>Fragaria Virginiana</i>)	Sun-Shade	White	Dry mesic	6" open groundcover for sunny, dry areas
	Giant Sunflower (<i>Helianthus Giganteus</i>)	Sun-Part Sun	Yellow	Mesic; Wet-land	8' long blooming, Abundant flowers, Deer resistant
	Wild Petunia (<i>Ruellia Humilis</i>)	Sun	Purple	Dry-Mesic	12", a favorite of pollinators

	Black Eyed Susan (<i>Rudbeckia hirta</i>)	Sun-Part Sun	Yellow	Mesic	1-2' attracts birds & pollinators; blooms June-Oct.
	Cardinal Flower (<i>Lobelia cardinalis</i>)	Sun-Part Shade	Red	Wetland; Moist Mesic	36-48" showy red flower spike. Hummingbirds & butterflies; blooms June-Oct.
	Dotted Mint (<i>Monarda punctata</i>)	Dry to Mesic	White/ lavender	Mesic	2' pollinators; can be used for tea; blooms May-Aug.
	Yellow Prairie Coneflower (<i>Ratibida Pinnata</i>)	Sun-Part Sun	Yellow	Mesic	2-5' Drooping petals; Self sows; Deer resistant
	Wild Columbine (<i>Aquilegia Canadensis</i>)	Sun-Shade	Red/Gold	Wood-land	1-2', hummingbirds, deer resistant, blooms in May-June
	Great Blue Lobelia (<i>Lobelia Siphilitica</i>)	Sun-Part Sun	Blue	Wetland	3', Self-Sowing, Highly adaptable to many soils, Deer Resistant; blooms July—Sept.
	Lance-Leaf Coreopsis (<i>Coreopsis lanceolata</i>)	Sun	Yellow	Mesic	24-36" bright yellow notched ray flowers; bloom Jun-Aug.
	Prairie Blazing Star (<i>Liatris Pychnostachya</i>)	Sun-Part Sun	Purple	Mesic	3-4' often used as ornamental, attracts butterflies
	New England Aster (<i>Sympphyotrichum novae angiae</i>)	Sun-Part Sun	Purple	Dry-Moist	24-36" orange yellow center, attracts pollinators; blooms Aug—Oct.
