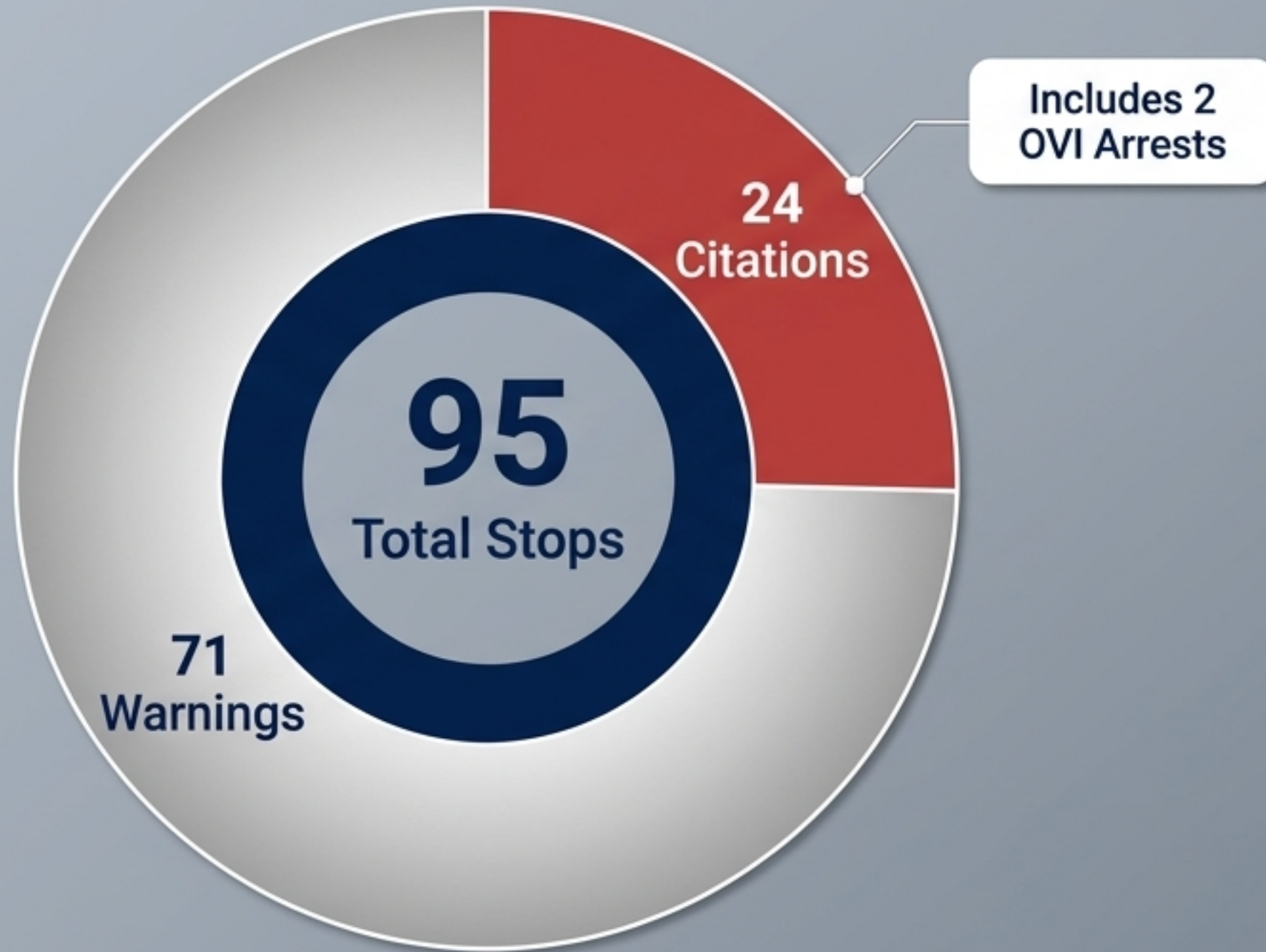

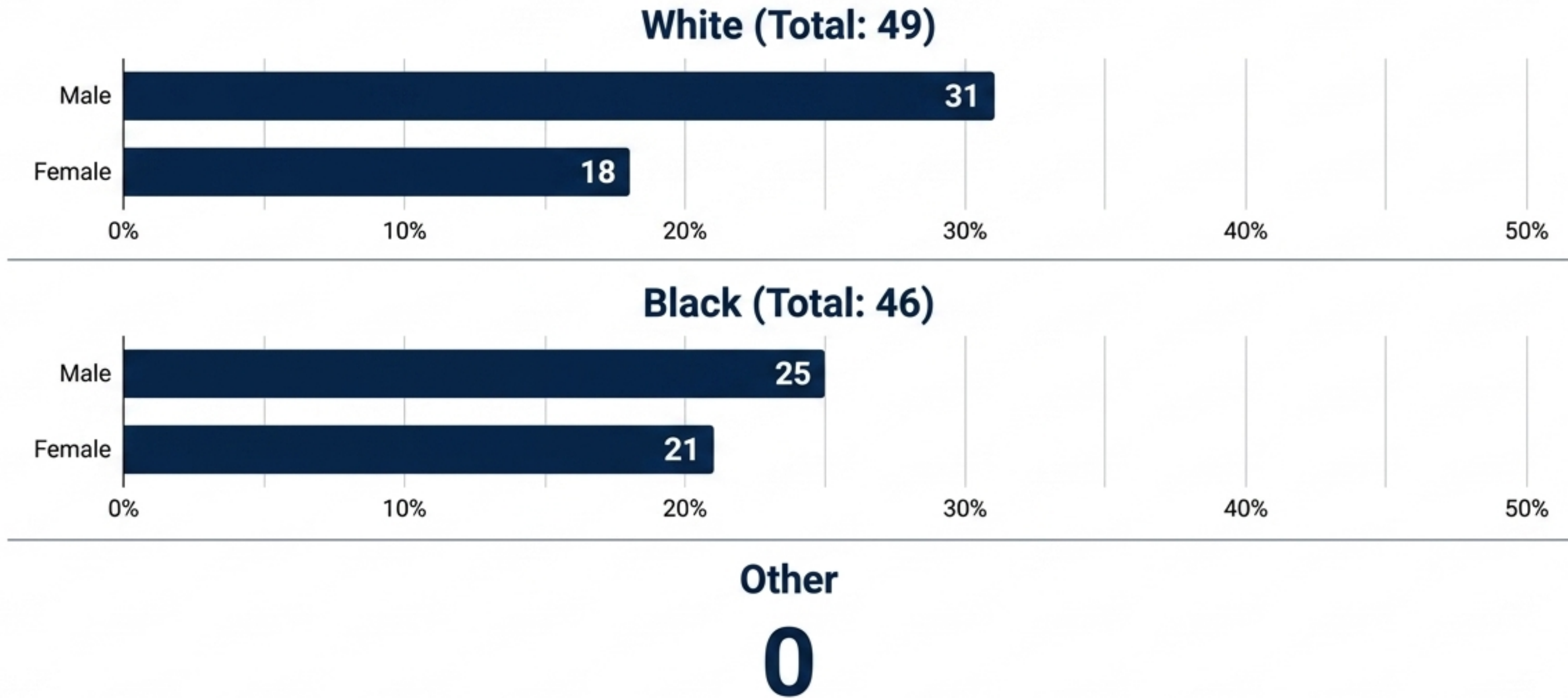
Officers prioritized education and safety over punitive measures, issuing warnings at roughly a 3-to-1 ratio during April traffic enforcement.

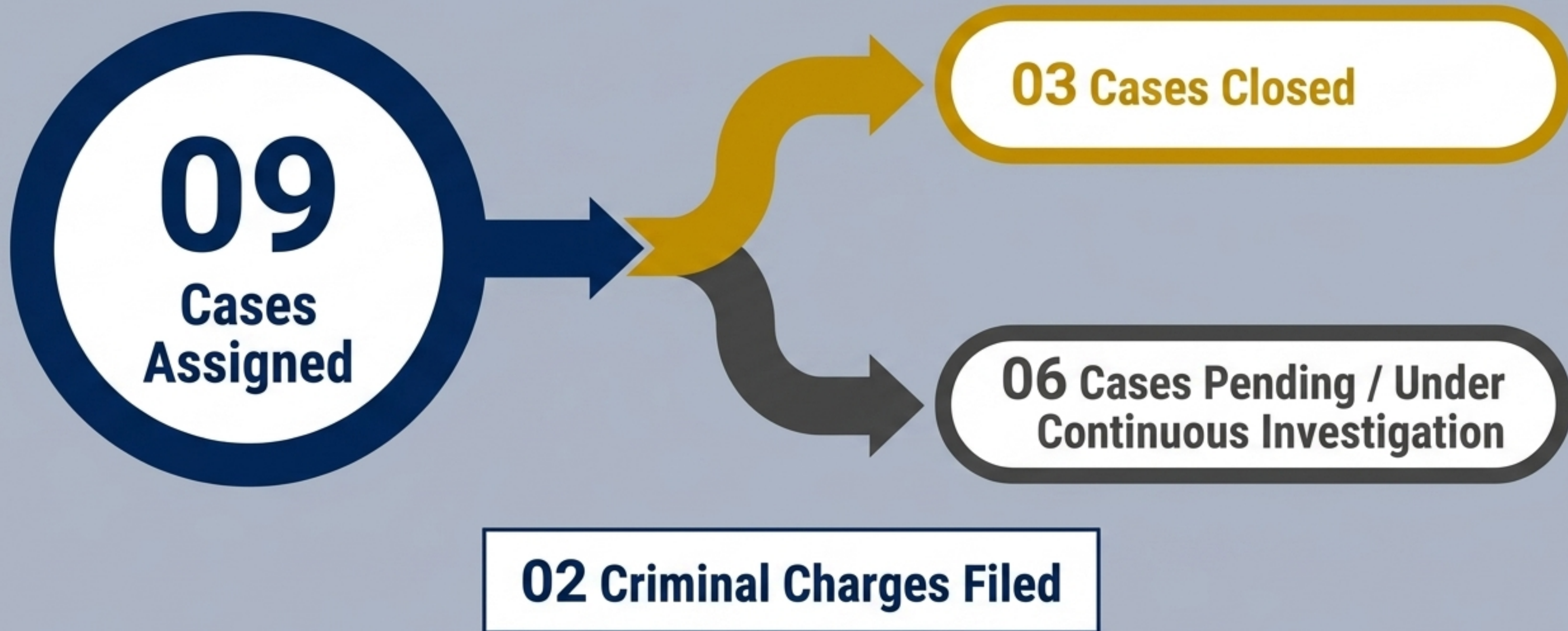

Specialized Assets & Response

Specialized units and patrol divisions demonstrate high readiness, safely resolving K9 deployments and numerous alarm drops without incident or force.

April 2026: Active Patrol, Thorough Investigation

High Visibility

13,960 miles driven and 1,351 calls answered demonstrates a highly visible, instantly responsive patrol force.

Education-First

A 3-to-1 ratio of warnings to citations during traffic enforcement shows a firm, consistent commitment to community education over punitive measures.

Investigative Rigor

Dedicated Drug Task Force operations (controlled buys, surveillance) and active detective casework ensure accountability beyond the initial patrol response.
