SYNOPSIS: On January 8, 2021 Phillips Police Department received drug information on a resident of the City of Phillips. Officer conducted an investigation.

INITIAL INFORMATION: On January 8, 2021 I, Lieutenant Blaine V. PETERSON was in full police uniform at the Phillips Police Department in the City of Phillips, County of Price Wisconsin. I received a phone call from Price County Human Services employee BORGEN. BORGEN stated that she had received information from concerned citizen [REDACTED] about current drug activity at the residence of [REDACTED] in the City of Phillips, County of Price Wisconsin.

I know that [REDACTED] in occupied by Waldemar [REDACTED] MADSEN. BORGEN stated to that [REDACTED] was at [REDACTED] around 2:00 p.m. today to obtain [REDACTED] from MADSEN. [REDACTED] told BORGEN that inside the bathroom of the residence [REDACTED] observed a marijuana grinder and a soda can that was used as a smoking device. BORGEN stated that [REDACTED] did provide pictures of the two items. BORGEN stated that [REDACTED] MADSEN at the residence.

CONVERSATION W/ [REDACTED]: I received a phone call from [REDACTED]. I asked [REDACTED] what [REDACTED] had located at the residence of [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] stated that [REDACTED] found a marijuana grinder and a pop can that was used as a pipe inside the reside of [REDACTED] in the bathroom. I asked [REDACTED] when [REDACTED] located the two items. [REDACTED] stated [REDACTED] had noticed the grinder a couple of weeks ago. I asked [REDACTED], [REDACTED] had noticed the grinder in the bathroom again today. [REDACTED] stated [REDACTED] did observe the grinder in the bathroom today. [REDACTED] stated [REDACTED] went to use the bathroom before [REDACTED] left the residence and observed the grinder in the bathroom along with the soda can smoking device.

I asked [REDACTED] to describe the items [REDACTED] had located in the bathroom. [REDACTED] described the items as follows: the grinder was yellow in color, and [REDACTED] has a picture of the grinder that [REDACTED] took while in the bathroom. [REDACTED] described the location of the grinder, was in the bathroom on a shelving unit behind the shower area on the top shelf, right hand corner. [REDACTED] stated the soda can was dented and appeared to be smoked out of. [REDACTED] stated the soda can was on a shelving unit above the toilet, and its position was on the top shelf, left hand side of the shelving unit. I asked [REDACTED] what type of soda can was it. [REDACTED] stated [REDACTED] believed it was a Pepsi can. I asked [REDACTED] what time [REDACTED] had noticed these two items today. [REDACTED] stated [REDACTED] noticed the items at approximately 2:00 p.m. [REDACTED] stated that the soda can is a Coca Cola can. I asked [REDACTED] if the grinder was in the same place as when [REDACTED] first had seen it a couple weeks ago. [REDACTED] stated that it was in the same spot as when [REDACTED] first had seen the grinder. I asked [REDACTED] if [REDACTED] could see anything in the grinder. [REDACTED] stated [REDACTED] could not tell and [REDACTED] were not going to touch it because it is illegal, and it does not belong to [REDACTED]. I asked [REDACTED] if [REDACTED] could smell anything in the bathroom. [REDACTED] stated [REDACTED] could not smell anything in the bathroom, because there was a candle in the bathroom that looked like it was previously lit. I asked [REDACTED] if [REDACTED] had noticed anything else in the residence. [REDACTED] stated no.

[REDACTED] stated [REDACTED] had lived at the residence with MADSEN for approximately three years, and [REDACTED] had moved out of the residence at the end of April, 2020. I asked [REDACTED] if this was common for MADSEN to have marijuana and drug paraphernalia. [REDACTED] stated that it was common, that MADSEN has a history of using marijuana. I asked [REDACTED] if MADSEN hides illicit drugs in a specific spot. [REDACTED] stated to me that when [REDACTED] use to live at the residence MADSEN would keep his marijuana in the garage. [REDACTED] stated there is a clock in his living room, if you would take it off the wall, it has a compartment on the back. [REDACTED] stated that the reason MADSEN purchased the clock was to hide his marijuana inside the clock. I asked [REDACTED] while

█████ was at the residence today if █████ noticed the clock. █████ stated █████ did observe the clock. I asked █████ if █████ could describe the clock. █████ stated the clock is grayish, silver and it is in the living room above the entrance into the kitchen of the residence. █████ stated █████ does not know if the marijuana is inside the clock, but █████ has seen marijuana inside the clock before. I asked █████ if █████ believed that MADSEN has marijuana at the residence. █████ stated █████ did not know.

I asked █████ that earlier █████ had stated MADSEN kept marijuana in the garage. █████ stated the only spot █████ knew about was on top of an up right freezer in the garage. █████ stated when MADSEN discovered that he knew █████ knew on the hiding spot in the garage he moved the marijuana to an unknown spot in the garage. I asked █████ when the last time █████ was in the garage. █████ stated █████ was last in the garage in November of 2020. █████ stated it was common for MADSEN to smoke in the bathroom, because there is a vent in the bathroom.

I observed the pictures that were sent from █████ to BORGEN. I observed the first picture was of a white shelving unit. I did not observe any illegal items in this photo. I observed the second photo was of the same shelving unit except the top shelf was in the picture. I observed the bottom of what appeared to be a soda can on the top shelf, left hand side. I observed the third photo was a close up of the soda can on the top shelf of the white shelving unit. I observed that the soda can was a Coca Cola can, and the middle had been crushed in. I observed that there was black residue in the middle of the crushed in portion of the can. I observed the forth photo which is of a built in, the shelves are wooden. I observed on the top shelf in the picture that there is a green marijuana grinder. I observed that the top of the grinder is not in the picture. I observed the fifth picture sent was of the same as picture four. I reviewed body camera footage of I and Chief HAUSCHILD of the Phillips Police Department. I observed that on August 26, 2020 I and Chief HAUSCHILD were at the MADSEN residence located at █████. I and Chief HAUSCHILD were at the residence related to Phillips Police Department case 20-0001378. I observed in the body camera footage there is a round clock in the living above the entrance into the kitchen. I also observed that the shelving unit in the pictures provided by BORGEN was the same white shelving unit where the Coca Cola can was discovered by █████. I also observed the same built in shelves as where the green grinder was discovered by █████.

On February 5, 2021 I, Lieutenant Blaine PETERSON was off duty and received a phone call from Phillips Police Officer HOLDEN. Officer HOLDEN stated that he had spoken with █████ via phone. Officer HOLDEN told me as follows: Officer HOLDEN spoke with █████ who reported █████ was at the residence of █████ to complete a █████. █████ used the bathroom and could not find any soap to wash █████ hands. █████ stated █████ opened the medicine cabinet above the bathroom sink and discovered a diet Coke can that appeared to be a homemade smoking device. █████ stated the can had burnt black residue on it. █████ stated that the bathroom had a slight odor of Marijuana. Officer HOLDEN documented his contact with █████ in a written field note. I observed attached to the field note is a picture of a diet Coke can laid on a wooden shelf. I observed that the Coke can was crushed on the sides and appears to have black burnt residue in the middle of the can. I also observed another picture of the green marijuana grinder on the wooden shelving unit. At this time I applied for a search warrant for the residence of MADSEN located at █████. The warrant included the residence, garage and three vehicles associated to MADSEN. The warrant was for possession of marijuana and possession of drug paraphernalia.

EXECUTION OF WARRANT: I briefed Chief HAUSCHILD, and Officer SCHMIDT on the search warrant I had obtained. On Saturday February 6, 2021, at approximately 6:18 p.m. Chief HAUSCHILD, Officer SCHMIDT, and myself arrived at █████. Chief HAUSCHILD, and Officer SCHMIDT remained in the patrol vehicle, while I attempted to make contact at the front door of the residence. I knocked on the door and was greeted by MADSEN. I asked MADSEN if I could come into the residence and speak with him. MADSEN agreed and invited me inside the residence. █████. At this time Chief HAUSCHILD and Officer SCHMIDT entered into the residence. I asked

MADSEN if we could go into a different room to talk [REDACTED]. MADSEN agreed and closed the door to his bedroom [REDACTED]. I explained to MADSEN that I have obtained a search warrant for his residence. MADSEN stated what was he doing. I explained to MADSEN he was smoking marijuana. I provided MADSEN with a copy of the search warrant. MADSEN stated he smoked awhile ago and he has a can that he used. MADSEN stated he smoked a long time ago. MADSEN and I exited the bedroom. MADSEN stated that the can was in the medicine cabinet in the bathroom.

MADSEN stated that we did not need the warrant that we could come into his residence any time we wanted. I asked MADSEN if he understood the warrant. MADSEN stated that he did. I asked MADSEN if he had anything on his person. MADSEN asked if I wanted to search him. [REDACTED]. MADSEN stated we could go into another room. I searched MADSEN's person and did not locate any contraband or weapons. MADSEN asked if he could show me something so we do not miss it. I asked MADSEN if he was referring to the clock. MADSEN stated he was speaking about the clock. MADSEN stated nothing is in the clock, and he is sure [REDACTED] is the reason for this. MADSEN stated that [REDACTED] has been in his house several times snooping around. MADSEN stated when he did have marijuana in the residence [REDACTED] and he was using it for his PTSD.

NOTE: Chief HAUSCHILD took pictures of the residence and was the evidence technician for the collection of evidence.

MADSEN sat on the couch in the living room unrestrained. [REDACTED]. I spoke with MADSEN about unrelated topics such as hunting. Officer SCHMIDT and Chief HAUSCHILD began searching the residence. At approximately 6:52 p.m. I began searching MADSEN's bedroom while Chief HAUSCHILD spoke with MADSEN. I did not locate any items of evidentiary value in MADSEN's room.

Chief HAUSCHILD stated there was a loaded .357 Magnum in the living room on top of the a wooden cabinet located in the north east corner. I observed the handgun was not in a case or holster. I observed the gun was a Taurus SN # Q1556300, the gun was loaded with seven rounds. I emptied the rounds out of the cylinder and took the gun as evidence item 1G. MADSEN stated that I should take the holster as well. The holster was next to the gun on top of the cabinet I noted the holster was a snap style holster Uncle Mikes brand.

Officer SCHMIDT stayed inside the residence as myself and Chief HAUSCHILD searched the vehicles on the premises. The first vehicle we searched was a red Chevrolet truck bearing Wisconsin registration of PY3358. In the back seat of this vehicle I observed a shotgun. The shotgun is a Winchester SXP 12 gauge shotgun SN# 12AZN12526. I observed the shotgun was unloaded. I took the shotgun as evidence number 2G. We searched the following vehicles, a blue sport utility vehicle with Wisconsin registration NN4304, a mini van bearing Wisconsin registration of 425YEB, we did not find any items of evidentiary value. Chief HAUSCHILD and I began searching the garage and located a whitetail deer carcass hanging. Also observed was several other deer carcass remains throughout the garage. In the chest freezer in the garage we located a black bear skull, numerous deer hides, and numerous bags of fish including trout. Chief HAUSCHILD contacted Conservation Warden PAUL and explained what we had located. Conservation Warden PAUL arrived and took possession of the black bear skull. Conservation Warden PAUL spoke with MADSEN inside the residence. At approximately 8:15 p.m. all Officers, gear, and evidence left the residence.

EVIDENCE: On February 7, 2021 I, Lieutenant Blaine PETERSON examined the evidence removed from the residence of [REDACTED]. I observed item 1A is an aluminum Diet Coke can. I observed the can was crushed on the sides to make a bowl. I observed burnt black residue on the side of the can. I could smell the strong odor of burnt marijuana. I observed green plant like material in the crushed side of the can. I observed from Chief HAUSCHILD's notes that item 1A was found in the medicine cabinet above the sink in the bathroom. At approximately 6:05 p.m. I conducted a Duquenois Levine Reagent Test the final result of the presumptive tests

indicated positive for the presence of tetrahydrocannabinols (THC), the active ingredient in marijuana.

I observed item 2A is a round yellow grinder with green plant like material believed to be marijuana. I could detect the pungent odor of marijuana from the grinder. I observed this item was located on the top shelf behind the shower to the right of the bathroom sink. I observed item 3A is a can of Skoal peach flavored tobacco can. Inside the can was green plant like material. I could smell the pungent odor of marijuana coming from the can. I observed item 3A was located on a shelf above the toilet in the bathroom. I observed item 4A is a can of Skoal Apple flavored tobacco can. Inside the can was a green plant like material. I could detect the pungent odor of marijuana from this can. I observed item 4A was located on second shelf behind shower, right of the sink in bathroom. I observed item 1B was a can of Skoal Peach tobacco. Inside the can was two plastic bags. I could detect a pungent odor of marijuana coming from the two plastic bags. Item 1B was located in the north bedroom on an end table along the east wall to the right of the bed. Items 1G and 2G were previously mentioned. I packaged and secured items 1A, 2A, 3A, 4A, 1B, 1G, and 2G into the Phillips Police Department secure evidence room.

INTERVIEW W/ MADSEN: On February 10, 2021 I, Lieutenant Blaine PETERSON was in full police uniform at the Phillips Police Department. At approximately 2:59 p.m. MADSEN met with me at the Phillips Police Department. I explained to MADSEN that he was not under arrest and he was free to leave. MADSEN stated that he understood. I explained to MADSEN that there was illegal contraband found inside of his residence. MADSEN stated not very much. I explained to MADSEN that he is using marijuana. MADSEN stated he is using marijuana for his PTSD. MADSEN went on to explain that his medication prescribed to him does not help his PTSD. MADSEN stated that the evidence was obtained illegally. MADSEN stated that [REDACTED] did not have permission to take photographs in his bathroom. MADSEN pulled out his phone and began reading about trespassing and taking pictures. I asked MADSEN what statute he was reading from. MADSEN stated he is reading from Wisconsin law on taking pictures. MADSEN handed me his phone and I viewed what he was reading from. MADSEN stated he never gave [REDACTED] permission to do anything in his house except go to the bathroom. I explained to MADSEN to not allow [REDACTED] into his house anymore. MADSEN stated [REDACTED] is not allowed into his house anymore. [REDACTED] MADSEN stated that he has talked to his uncle [REDACTED] who is a retired narcotic detective from Racine, Wisconsin. MADSEN stated that [REDACTED] told him that it was an invasion of privacy. MADSEN stated that [REDACTED] is already looking at a class H felony for identity theft. MADSEN stated to me that I know this is retaliation. I explained to MADSEN that drug cases are typically that way. I asked MADSEN if he smoked marijuana when [REDACTED] was living with him. MADSEN stated he did. I asked MADSEN if he wanted to cooperate. MADSEN stated cooperating with what. I asked MADSEN where he was getting his marijuana from. MADSEN said, "telling you that I went to hang out with a fellow veteran, that was having a bad night I'm not going to tell you his name there is a code of conduct." MADSEN continued to become upset and I ended the interview at this time.

CONCLUSION: On February 6, 2021 at approximately 6:18 p.m. at the residence of [REDACTED] in the City of Phillips, County of Price Wisconsin occupied by Waldemar [REDACTED] MADSEN. Members of the Phillips Police Department discovered inside the residence was a homemade smoking device used for the purpose of ingesting marijuana. At approximately 6:05 p.m. on February 7, 2021 I conducted a Duquenois Levine Reagent Test the final result of the presumptive tests indicated positive for the presence of tetrahydrocannabinols (THC), the active ingredient in marijuana. MADSEN violated Wisconsin State s.961.573(1) possession of drug paraphernalia. **END OF REPORT**

SUPPLEMENTAL REPORT BY CHIEF MICHAEL HAUSCHILD

INITIAL INFORMATION-

On Saturday February 6, 2021 at approximately 4:30 p.m. I, Chief Michael Hauschild, was off duty at my residence when Lt. Blaine PETERSON advised me that he had written a search warrant for the presence of marijuana and drug paraphernalia. I arrived at the police department at approximately 5:00 p.m.

EXECUTE SEARCH WARRANT-

At approximately 6:18 p.m., Officer SCHMIDT, Lt PETERSON and I arrived at [REDACTED] to execute the search warrant. Lt. PETERSON knocked on MADSEN'S front door to speak with him while myself and Officer SCHMIDT waited in the police car. Lt. PETERSON then motioned for Officer SCHMIDT and myself to come into the residence with him.

I walked into the residence [REDACTED] and MADSEN speaking with Lt. PETERSON. Lt PETERSON, Officer SCHMIDT and MADSEN went to talk in the west bedroom [REDACTED]. Lt. PETERSON, Officer SCHMIDT and MADSEN walked into the living room. I observed that MADSEN had a copy of the search warrant for his residence. Lt. PETERSON stayed with MADSEN and spoke with him while Officer SCHMIDT and I began searching the bathroom.

PHOTOGRAPH RESIDENCE-

I began taking overall photographs of each room in MADSEN'S residence. I was assigned the evidence technical for the search warrant and began processing and packaging the evidence Officer SCHMIDT and I found.

SEARCH BATHROOM-

At approximately 6:29 p.m. I photographed an aluminum Diet Coke can that was lying on its side with a burned resin located on one side of the can. I observed small holes poked through the side of the can. The can was crushed to allow a person to place marijuana on the poked holes in the can so it could be smoked by applying a lighter to the marijuana and inhaling through the opening on the top of the can. The burned resin had a pungent odor that known to be marijuana based on my training and experience as a law enforcement officer. The can was located on the top shelf of the medicine cabinet above the sink. I put the can into an evidence bag and labeled the bag 1a. \

At approximately 6:31 p.m., I photographed a round yellow grinder with small green plant like particles in the bottom of the yellow grinder. The green plant like particles had a pungent odor that known to be marijuana based on my training and experience as a law enforcement officer. The yellow grinder was located on the top wooden shelf behind the shower just to the right of the bathroom sink. I packaged the yellow grinder into an evidence bag and labeled the bag 2A.

At approximately 6:35 p.m. I photographed a can of Skoal peach tobacco blend that had particles of a green leafy like plant material with a pungent odor. The Skoal can was setting on a shelf just above the toilet. I packaged the Skoal peach tobacco can into an evidence bag and labeled the bag 3A.

At approximately 6:37 p.m. I photographed a can of Skoal apple tobacco blend with particles of a green leafy plant type material with a pungent odor. The Skoal apple blend can was located on the second shelf behind the shower to the right of the sink. I packaged the Skoal apple blend tobacco can into an evidence bag and labeled the bag 4A.

SEARCH NORTH BEDROOM OF WALT MADSEN-

At approximately 6:45 p.m. Officer SCHMIDT and I then moved to the north bedroom which was MADSEN'S bedroom. On the east wall to the right of the bed was a T.V. tray. On top of the T.V. tray was a can of Skoal peach blend tobacco. Inside the can was two small plastic baggies with a strong pungent odor that known to be marijuana based on my training and experience as a law enforcement officer. I photographed the can setting on the T.V. tray and a photograph of the can opened showing the two plastic baggies. I placed the Skoal peach blend tobacco can into an evidence bag and labeled the bag 1b.

Lt PETERSON then took over searching of the north bedroom with Officer SCHMIDT and I stayed by with Walt MADSEN. MADSEN told me that he was not a drug dealer, and that he uses marijuana for his own personal use. MADSEN told me that no matter how low on cash he was, that he would never sell drugs.

While speaking with MADSEN, I observed a pistol that was lying on top of a wooden shelf in the living room in the northeast corner. I walked over and observed the pistol was not in a case and was loaded. The pistol was a .357 Taurus stainless steel. I took photographs of the pistol. Lt PETERSON collected the pistol and placed the pistol into an evidence bag and labeled the bag 1G.

I explained to Walt MADSEN that I would be taking any firearms he has in his possession as he would be prohibited from possessing firearms for a year under the federal disqualifier 18 USC 922 for possessing drug paraphernalia. MADSEN told me he had a 12 gauge shot gun in his red Chevy pickup.

SEARCH MADSEN'S VEHICLES-

Lt. PETERSON and I walked outside to search the three vehicles MADSEN had parked in his driveway. [REDACTED] Lt. PETERSON located a black 12 gauge shot gun with a pistol grip in the back seat of the Chevy pickup with Wisconsin License plate number PY3358. I photographed the 12 gauge shotgun and Lt. PETERSON placed the 12 gauge shotgun in our police vehicle and secured the vehicle. The 12 gauge was labeled as 2G.

SEARCH GARAGE-

Lt PETERSON and I were able to access the garage through the north door. There was a fridge that was blocking the door. I was able to move the fridge away from the door to gain access. I photographed the inside of the garage. I observed a deer hanging in the middle of the garage. The head to the deer was cut off and I was not able to find a confirmation number that the deer was registered. Lt. PETERSON found a bear head in the chest freezer. I called Department of Natural Resources Warden Joe PAUL. I explained to PAUL what we found and PAUL said he would meet us at the garage for further investigation. Warden PAUL arrived and was able to confirm the two deer MADSEN had in his possession were legal and the hanging deer did not have a confirmation number. Warden PAUL explained to MADSEN that if he receives a deer from someone, he must have the confirmation number to go with the deer. Warden PAUL collected the bear head so he could investigate further. Warden PAUL spoke with MADSEN inside his residence.

I spoke with MADSEN and told him that we would not be arresting him for the possession of drug paraphernalia tonight [REDACTED] I explained to MADSEN that he would get his firearms back a year from today, and I would be sending a copy of my report to the firearms unit in Madison, WI. Officer SCHMIDT, Lt PETERSON and I then cleared from the residence. **END OF REPORT**
