SYNOPSIS- On Tuesday, December 27, 2022, the City of Phillips Police Department responded to a incident at a residence in the City of Phillips. Officers made contact with the complainant and were able to assist [REDACTED]. Officers discovered the presence of controlled substance and seized the contraband. Officers will be referring this incident for criminal charges. Officers will also be referring this report to human services.

INITIAL INFORMATION

On Tuesday, December 27, 2022, I Officer Lucas M. PETROSKI was in full duty uniform for the City of Phillips Police Department operating squad 57B. At approximately 7:55 p.m. I received a call from the Price County Dispatch Center reporting that a female caller was not being allowed to leave the residence at [REDACTED] in the City of Phillips.



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ARRIVAL

I arrived on scene and was met by Waldemar [REDACTED] MADSEN who was outside the residence when I arrived. I approached MADSEN and he verbally identified himself. MADSEN did not seem upset that I was there. MADSEN stated he and his girlfriend had broken up that morning and that he had left and told her to be gone by the time he got home. MADSEN stated he just wanted her to leave. At this time Lieutenant Blaine V. PETERSON arrived to assist me. I asked MADSEN where his ex-girlfriend was and he stated she was inside. I asked if I could go in and speak with her and he said yes. I had Lt. PETERSON stay with MADSEN while I went to speak with the complainant.

CONTACT WITH [REDACTED]

I entered [REDACTED] and spoke with the complainant. I found the complainant sitting on the couch who I identified as [REDACTED] by [REDACTED] Wisconsin Drivers License. [REDACTED] stated [REDACTED] wanted to go to the Timber Inn hotel but [REDACTED] did not have a ride and that's why [REDACTED] could not leave. [REDACTED] stated nothing physical had happened and that MADSEN and [REDACTED] had broken up that morning. While speaking with [REDACTED] [REDACTED] stated [REDACTED] was concerned for the [REDACTED] in the home's welfare. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] When I asked [REDACTED] why [REDACTED] was concerned for the [REDACTED] [REDACTED] pointed to the living room. The living room was full of items and very hard to navigate through, I could see the kitchen from the living room and it also appeared to be in the same condition. With all table space and counter space full of objects and what appeared to be garbage. There appeared to be trash in piles throughout the home. When I asked if there was anything else I should be aware of [REDACTED] stated MADSEN smokes marijuana when he is home [REDACTED] stated MADSEN does not smoke marijuana in [REDACTED] but instead goes into his bedroom and bathroom to do it. [REDACTED] pointed to the kitchen area and stated there is a bong on the stove. [REDACTED] then entered the kitchen and stated he must have moved it. [REDACTED] then opened a cabinet and stated it was in there. From where I was standing I did not observe a bong at this time. [REDACTED] then walked to the bathroom and I followed. [REDACTED] pointed in the bathroom to a black round container right of the sink and stated there was marijuana in that. Then [REDACTED] pointed to a shelf over the toilet and stated there was marijuana there too. We returned to the living room and [REDACTED] informed me [REDACTED] had pictures of all the items I then asked if I could have the pictures and [REDACTED] stated yes. I asked if [REDACTED] would fill out a written statement and [REDACTED] stated yes.

CONTACT WITH MADSEN

I returned outside to speak with MADSEN. I stepped away from MADSEN and informed Lt. PETERSON of the information provided to me by [REDACTED] about the presence of marijuana and drug paraphernalia. I was informed that MADSEN's friend [REDACTED] would be arriving shortly to take [REDACTED] to the Timber Inn Hotel. Lt. PETERSON advised MADSEN that [REDACTED] is stating there is marijuana in the home. I asked MADSEN if he would

consent to a search of his home for the items [REDACTED] has stated were in the home. MADSEN informed me he did not feel comfortable letting us in the home and would feel more comfortable if I got a search warrant to enter. I did not press the issue.

I inquired to MADSEN about the condition of the home. MADSEN stated it was due to him not being able to take the trash out because of the snow and that [REDACTED] is just as responsible for the mess as he is.

ASSISTING [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] arrived to pickup [REDACTED] and take [REDACTED] to [REDACTED] to the Timber Inn Hotel. [REDACTED] stated [REDACTED] would not take all [REDACTED] items because [REDACTED] wanted to get back to [REDACTED] family. [REDACTED] did not want to leave without [REDACTED] all [REDACTED] items. I got [REDACTED] to agree to take some of [REDACTED] items and come back for the rest the following day. [REDACTED] was concerned that [REDACTED] items may be damaged by MADSEN. I told [REDACTED] I would document [REDACTED] concern in this report in case [REDACTED] items were damaged. I ran [REDACTED] through the Central Price County Dispatch Center after doing this I provided [REDACTED] with a statement form. I informed [REDACTED] I would be in touch with [REDACTED] soon to collect the statement form and the photos [REDACTED] took. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] then cleared the scene.



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SEARCH OF [REDACTED]

Chief HAUSCHILD then arrived to assist. I approached Lt. PETERSON and MADSEN. At 8:33 p.m. MADSEN agreed to let us search his residence for contraband. We entered into the residence I followed MADSEN into the kitchen where he pointed out a purple and blue grinder on the stove left of the fridge. MADSEN then opened up the cabinet left of the fridge and I observed a glass water bong on the top shelf of the cabinet. I attempted to take a picture of the water bong and grinder but was unsuccessful. MADSEN led me to the bathroom where he pointed out a black round container. MADSEN then pointed to above the toilet shelf. I observed on a white paper plate a small pile of a ground up green leafy substance on the same plate there was an equally sized pile of a black burnt material. From my training I recognized the green leafy substance as marijuana.

COLLECTION OF EVIDENCE

I went to squad 57B to collect evidence packaging bags. I first collected a purple and blue grinder at approximately 8:45 p.m. and placed it into a evidence bag. At approximately 8:47 p.m I collected a glass water bong from the kitchen which was located in the cabinet left of the fridge on the top shelf. At approximately 8:49 p.m. I went into the bathroom where I located a black container labeled "High Lovers Cannabis Flower". When I opened the container there was bits of a green leafy substance all around the inside of the container from my training I determined this to remnants of marijuana. The container also had the smell of marijuana. With the assistance of Lt. PETERSON at approximately 8:51 p.m. I collected a green leafy substance from the paper plate located on the shelf above the toilet. We then collected the burnt residue in a separate bag.

SECURING OF EVIDENCE

I returned to the Phillips Police Department and secured the evidence in a secure location until it was time to process it. I went to the Timber Inn Hotel room 110 to collect the statement form from [REDACTED].

COLLECTION AND REVIEW OF STATEMENT FORM.

Before I arrived on at the Timber Inn I called [REDACTED] who advised that [REDACTED] was in room 110 at the Timber Inn. On the phone [REDACTED] advised me the [REDACTED] was just speaking with [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] advised me [REDACTED] wanted to speak with me. I collected [REDACTED] information to contact [REDACTED] at a later time. Before collecting the statement form [REDACTED] advised me that there were more drugs in the home that [REDACTED] had informed her about.

In the statement form [REDACTED] states MADSEN gets 1-2 ounces of marijuana from Michigan with one of his friends every month. The statement form also states MADSEN keeps it on a paper plate in the bathroom above the toilet. The form also states the bong was on the kitchen stove all day and when the police arrived he put in on



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the top shelf in the cabinet. [REDACTED] states [REDACTED] is concerned for [REDACTED] due to the unsanitary conditions of the home and because MADSEN has drugs [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] also states MADSEN smokes marijuana when [REDACTED].

SPEAKING WITH [REDACTED]

I spoke with [REDACTED] on the phone [REDACTED] advised me that MADSEN had told [REDACTED] on video chat that we may have taken his bong and marijuana but that we did not get his stash and he flashed a black, white or grey container. [REDACTED] thinks this container had marijuana in it. I informed [REDACTED] I could not act on this information alone. I informed [REDACTED] about the condition of the home and that I would be referring this report to human services. I then ended the contact with [REDACTED].

WEIGHING, TESTING AND PACKAGING OF EVIDENCE

Lt. PETERSON assisted me testing the evidence seized from [REDACTED]. I first tested the blue and purple in color grinder. Using a NARK II reagent kit, I followed the instructions on the box as listed. I scraped a green leafy substance suspected of being marijuana into the bag. After following the instructions I received a presumptive positive for the presence of Delta-9 THC at 10:36 p.m. on 12/27/2022. After this I photographed the positive test next to the purple and blue grinder. I then proceeded to test the green leafy substance suspected of being marijuana. I got a second NARK II reagent kit and following the instruction placed a sample in the test bag. After doing this I followed the instructions listed on the box. At 10:44 p.m. on 12/27/2022 I received a presumptive positive test for the presence of Delta-9 THC. I then photographed the positive test next to the green leafy substance suspected of being marijuana. I weighed the green leafy substance suspected of being marijuana the weight came to .51 grams. I photographed this weight. and green leafy substance on the scale. After I tested the evidence I packaged all the items collected and placed them in temporary evidence storage locker number 7.

CONDITION OF THE HOME [REDACTED]

When inside of MADSEN'S home I observed very unsanitary conditions and am concerned [REDACTED] who sometimes reside in the home with [REDACTED]. The home has large piles of trash in the home and it is very difficult to navigate through. The kitchen counters are full of trash and unwashed dish's. I am also concerned by the statements of [REDACTED] about MADSEN using marijuana while in the home [REDACTED]. I am also concerned about the marijuana that is kept in the bathroom [REDACTED]. I am requesting this report be forwarded to the Price County Department of Health and Human Services.

CONCLUSION

On December 27, 2022, I Officer Lucas M. PETROSKI responded to a call at [REDACTED] in the City of Phillips. I made contact with the complainant identified as [REDACTED]. While speaking with [REDACTED] [REDACTED] stated the other party involved MADSEN had marijuana and drug paraphernalia in the home. [REDACTED] then stated the locations of the items were in the bathroom and in the cabinet left of the fridge above the stove. MADSEN granted consent to search his home for these items. After doing so Lt. PETERSON and I located a water bong and a grinder. In the bathroom I located a black container that contained remnants of suspected marijuana. above the toilet on a shelf I located a paper plate with two piles on it. One pile was a ground up leafy substance suspected to be marijuana and the second pile was residue. After collecting this items I returned to the Phillips Police Department. With the assistance of Lt. PETERSON I tested residue left in the grinder and after following the instructions clearly labeled on the the box I received a presumptive positive test for Delta-9. Which is in violation of WI SS 961.573(1) "Possession of Drug Paraphernalia". I tested the green leafy substance suspected of being marijuana. I followed the instructions as listed on the test kit box and I received a presumptive positive test for Delta-9. WI SS 961.41(3g)(e) "Possess/ Attempt to possess THC". After this I weighed the green leafy substance suspected of being marijuana and received a weight of .51g. After this I packaged all the evidence collected and placed it in temporary storage locker number 7. END OF REPORT.

OFFICER'S REPORT

INITIAL INFORMATION: On December 27, 2022 I, Lieutenant Blaine V. PETERSON was in full police uniform at the Phillips Police Department in the City of Phillips, County of Price Wisconsin. Also in full uniform was Phillips Police Officer PETROSKI. At approximately 7:53 p.m. Officer PETROSKI was contacted by Price County Dispatch Center. Dispatch indicated they had received a call from a female subject who reported they were not being allowed to leave the residence of [REDACTED]. Officer PETROSKI responded in a marked patrol vehicle. I responded in another marked squad car. I know that the residence of [REDACTED] is occupied by Waldemar MADSEN.

Officer PETROSKI arrived and met with MADSEN briefly who was standing outside of the residence. Officer PETROSKI went inside the residence to speak with the [REDACTED] caller who was later identified to me as [REDACTED]. I spoke with MADSEN outside.

CONVERSATION W/ MADSEN: MADSEN indicated he had just got home from Medford [REDACTED]. MADSEN indicated that [REDACTED] had all day to leave the residence. I asked MADSEN what had happened when he came home. MADSEN indicated that [REDACTED] threatened to call the cops on him. MADSEN indicated that [REDACTED] was willing to pick [REDACTED] up from the residence. MADSEN indicated that [REDACTED] has done nothing wrong. I asked MADSEN if nothing physical had happened. MADSEN indicated no. I asked MADSEN if he was in fear of [REDACTED]. MADSEN indicated no. MADSEN indicated that [REDACTED] has been super good to [REDACTED], and [REDACTED] has done nothing. I asked MADSEN what would provoke [REDACTED] to call then. MADSEN indicated because he was talking to [REDACTED] and would not stop. I explained to MADSEN the original call was that he would not let [REDACTED] leave. MADSEN indicated that [REDACTED] was free to leave any time [REDACTED] wanted, and he wants [REDACTED] gone. I asked MADSEN if he had stood in front of the door. MADSEN indicated no that he was standing in the hall way [REDACTED]. I asked MADSEN how long [REDACTED] has lived at the residence. MADSEN indicated that [REDACTED] has lived there for less than a month. I asked MADSEN how long him and [REDACTED] have been in a relationship. MADSEN indicated a month. MADSEN indicated again that [REDACTED] did not do anything wrong and does not need to get in trouble.

Officer PETROSKI exited the residence and spoke with MADSEN. Officer PETROSKI indicated to MADSEN that [REDACTED] was concerned [REDACTED] because of the condition of the home, and that there was drugs inside the residence. MADSEN indicated there was no drugs in his house. MADSEN indicated he got in trouble for that one time and he is not doing it again. Officer PETROSKI asked MADSEN if there was drugs in the house. MADSEN indicated there was no drugs in the house. Officer PETROSKI asked MADSEN if there was anyone that would be able to drive [REDACTED] to remove [REDACTED] from the house. MADSEN indicated that [REDACTED] would but [REDACTED] would need [REDACTED] phone to call [REDACTED]. MADSEN indicated that we could go into the residence with him to obtain his cell phone. MADSEN indicated that he would stay outside to avoid any conflict.

NOTE: Officer PETROSKI spoke with me away from MADSEN. Officer PETROSKI indicated that [REDACTED] was adamant there was drugs in the home, and attempted to show Officer PETROSKI drugs and drug paraphernalia in the kitchen and in the bathroom of the home. These areas are common areas that [REDACTED] had access to while residing with MADSEN.

Officer PETROSKI and I met with MADSEN again. I explained to MADSEN that [REDACTED] was pretty adamant there was drug paraphernalia in the house. MADSEN indicated there was not. Officer PETROSKI explained to MADSEN what he had observed in the bathroom. MADSEN indicated there was nothing in there and he was not getting into trouble for that. Officer explained to MADSEN that [REDACTED] opened a kitchen cabinet and told him there was a bong in the cabinet. MADSEN indicated there was no bong in the there. Officer PETROSKI asked MADSEN if we could take a look. MADSEN indicated



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not without a warrant. I MADSEN if he has a bong in the cabinet. MADSEN indicated no not today. MADSEN indicated again a search warrant is what he wants. [REDACTED] MADSEN indicated yes. At this time I exited the conversation to contact for additional resources as we were going to secure the residence and apply for a search warrant.

I met with MADSEN and Officer PETROSKI again. MADSEN asked if this was going to be an all night event. I advised MADSEN I hope not. MADSEN indicated that he just wanted [REDACTED] gone and to go back into the house by [REDACTED]. I advised MADSEN that I wanted [REDACTED] to be fine also. I advised MADSEN that [REDACTED] resides at the residence and has provided information of the location of drugs in the residence. I advised MADSEN at this point we can attempt to apply for a search warrant. MADSEN indicated that it is just hearsay. I advised MADSEN that [REDACTED] lives at the house. [REDACTED] wished to speak with Officer PETROSKI. I stood by with MADSEN. I advised MADSEN that I did not plan on taking anyone to jail. I received a return call from Chief HAUSCHILD at this time I advised Chief HAUSCHILD of the situation. During my phone contact with Chief HAUSCHILD MADSEN kept telling me to hang up. MADSEN indicated for me to go get it. MADSEN indicated it was the only thing in the house. MADSEN was apologetic for lying. MADSEN asked if he could go sit in my patrol vehicle. I advised MADSEN we could or he could sit in his truck. MADSEN asked if I would sit in his truck with him. I advised him he could sit in the truck and I would stand at the window. MADSEN sat in his truck to stay warm. MADSEN and I conversed during this time.

After [REDACTED] had left the residence I spoke with MADSEN. I advised MADSEN that [REDACTED] who resides at the residence provided information about drug related items inside the residence. I advised MADSEN that we can attempt to apply for a search warrant for the residence or he can provide us with consent. MADSEN indicated just go get it. I asked MADSEN if he was providing consent. MADSEN indicated yes and then described where the bong was. I asked MADSEN if all officers could go into the residence. MADSEN indicated yes. MADSEN, Officer PETROSKI, Chief HAUSCHILD and I entered into the residence. [REDACTED] The condition of the home was unkept. MADSEN indicated he needed to clean his residence. MADSEN showed me the bong in the cabinet to the left of the fridge. See Officer PETROSKI's report for more detail on the evidence and condition of the home. My contact with MADSEN was recorded via body camera which is attached to this report. END OF REPORT

INITIAL INFORMATION-

On Tuesday December 27, 2022 at approximately 8:15 p.m. I, Chief Michael Hauschild, was off duty on vacation at my residence. I received a phone call from Lt. PETERSON who advised me that he was out at Waldemar MADSEN'S residence on [REDACTED] with Officer PETROSKI. Lt. PETERSON said Officer PETROSKI received information from MADSEN'S [REDACTED], that MADSEN had marijuana inside his residence. Lt. PETERSON asked that I respond to the residence for scene security so that Officer PETROSKI and he could attempt to apply for a search warrant.

I arrived at [REDACTED] at approximately 8:30 p.m. I walked up to Lt. PETERSON, Officer PETROSKI and Waldemar MADSEN who were outside the residence. MADSEN told Lt. PETERSON and Officer PETROSKI that he was sorry for lying and that the Officers could go into his residence to retrieve the marijuana. Lt. PETERSON asked MADSEN if all officers could accompany him into his residence and MADSEN said yes.



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I walked into the residence behind MADSEN, Lt. PETERSON and Officer PETROSKI. I observed [REDACTED] living room of the residence which was filled with garbage bags and other clutter. I spoke to [REDACTED] until officers completed collecting the marijuana and drug paraphernalia. I was told by Lt. PETERSON that I could clear. At approximately 9:30 p.m. I cleared from the residence at went off duty. END OF REPORT
