SYNOPSIS: On April 22, 2023, Phillips Police was requested to do a welfare check on two juveniles due to drug related activity. Officer applied for a search warrant. One adult male was arrested for possession of THC and drug paraphernalia

CALL NOTES: On April 22, 2023, I, Officer Morgan CARLSON, was on duty in full police uniform at the Phillips Police Department when I received a phone call from [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] stated that [REDACTED] wanted a welfare check [REDACTED] that were currently with [REDACTED], Waldemar MADSEN. I asked [REDACTED] if there was a reason why [REDACTED] wanted a welfare check to be done. [REDACTED] stated that MADSEN's residence was disgusting. [REDACTED] stated that MADSEN had a large knife in his bedroom that that was laying out [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] stated that there was pizza boxes and that is apparently what MADSEN uses to cut his pizza. [REDACTED] stated that [REDACTED] was on facetime with [REDACTED] who showed [REDACTED] a bong that was on the left front corner of the bathroom sink. [REDACTED] stated that there was also a pill bottle next to the fridge. [REDACTED] stated that [REDACTED] was not sure what if anything was in it. [REDACTED] stated where MADSEN is having the dog, Major, is a complete mess. [REDACTED] stated [REDACTED] observed there was an ash tray on the couch but was unsure what kind of ashes were in it.

ARRIVAL AT [REDACTED]: I arrived at the residence and knocked on the door. [REDACTED] answered the door. I asked [REDACTED] if MADSEN was home. [REDACTED] stated that he was not. I asked [REDACTED] if the [REDACTED] were home. [REDACTED] stated that they were and he was watching them. I told [REDACTED] that I had gotten a call to do a welfare check [REDACTED]. I told [REDACTED] that I would need to speak with [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] stated "yeah that's fine." [REDACTED] got [REDACTED] and stated [REDACTED] was sleeping. I asked [REDACTED] if I could speak to [REDACTED] by myself for a second. [REDACTED] stated "umm, okay" and returned into the residence.

CONTACT WITH [REDACTED]: I told [REDACTED] that [REDACTED] had called for a welfare check and [REDACTED] stated that everything was good. [REDACTED] stated that they have just been hanging out at the residence, outside playing with the dog and inside playing video games. I told [REDACTED] that if MADSEN was okay with it, if I could observe the condition of the residence. [REDACTED] stated that I would have to ask MADSEN and he would not. [REDACTED] told me to call MADSEN to get permission. I told [REDACTED] that I would and ended contact.

I called and left a voicemail for MADSEN to call me back.

CONTACT WITH [REDACTED]: I called [REDACTED] and told [REDACTED] that I did perform a welfare check on [REDACTED]. I told [REDACTED] that [REDACTED] denied showing [REDACTED] anything on Facetime and stated that [REDACTED] was safe, happy, and wanted to stay at MADSEN's. [REDACTED] stated [REDACTED] probably did that because MADSEN screams at [REDACTED] when [REDACTED] says anything. [REDACTED] informed me that [REDACTED] had a video from [REDACTED] conversation with [REDACTED] that showed there was a bong in the bathroom. I asked [REDACTED] if [REDACTED] could send me the video. [REDACTED] stated that [REDACTED] would.



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REVIEWING THE VIDEO: [REDACTED] showed [REDACTED] the bong on the left side front corner of the bathroom sink. The bong is a blue, red, and clear glass smoking device. It appears in the clear glass portion of the device there is a ball that resembles an eyeball. [REDACTED] whispers to [REDACTED] "there's more in here somewhere." [REDACTED] later states "he moved it somewhere else." The video also shows [REDACTED] wearing the same pink shirt and blue jeans that I observed [REDACTED] to be wearing at MADSEN's residence.

I then briefed Chief Michael HAUSCHILD and Lt. PETERSON of the situation.

CONTACT WITH [REDACTED]: I told [REDACTED] that I would be forwarding a report to Human Services. [REDACTED] asked if anything was going to be done tonight. I told [REDACTED] that there was not and the information that [REDACTED] provided would be used in the future.

I then drafted I warrant for [REDACTED] and on April 24, 2023, I got the warrant signed by the Honorable Judge Kevin KLEIN.

SEARCH WARRANT: Officer HOLDEN, Lt. PETERSON, Chief HAUSCHILD and I briefed for the warrant and it was decided that Lt. PETERSON and Chief HAUSCHILD would go to the front door while Officer HOLDEN and I went to the back door. Once Lt. PETERSON and Chief HAUSCHILD made contact and was able to secure MADSEN, they informed Officer HOLDEN and I and we entered the residence.

ARREST: As we entered the residence, we were informed that there was marijuana in the residence. Chief HAUSCHILD advised MADSEN that he would be placed under arrest for possession of marijuana. I placed my handcuffs on MADSEN's wrist behind his back and security locked them. MADSEN was patted down by Officer HOLDEN. I transported MADSEN to the Price County Jail. After the booking process was complete, I asked MADSEN if he wanted to be transported back to the residence. MADSEN stated that he wanted to walk.

RETURN TO RESIDENCE: I returned to the residence. I stood by and waited for MADSEN to return. When MADSEN returned, I stood with him and [REDACTED] in the back yard. MADSEN asked [REDACTED] if he had any dog food so he could feed Major [REDACTED] stated that he also had more food at the apartment and would bring more over.

I called the Price County DA Thomas COATY and advised him of the situation regarding an RV that was registered to MADSEN that WALL TIFFANY was staying in. The DA advised the RV would not be included in the search warrant.

When the search was completed, I took custody of the evidence that was collected from the residence and transported it to the Phillips Police Department where it was stored in Evidence Locker #11

EVIDENCE: On April 25, I process the evidence that was collected at 561 Flambeau Ave. I sealed and photographed all the evidence which included 1A, a green plant like material, 2A a black open glass container with a trace amount of a green plant like material 3A a blue metal Shred It grinder containing a trace of a green plant like material, 4A a blueberry cush container containing a trace amount of a green plant like material, 5A which was a ceramic tan/gray pipe with a burned resin inside the bowl, 6A, an empty package of yellow and green Choice THC gummies super sour lemon, 7A one chrome P380 Davis Industry Arms Pistol with serial number AP107622 with two full magazines, 8A a red, white and blue rubber bond with eyeball inside the tube with glass bowl at end of bong with a burned resin inside. 9A one glass blue and clear marijuana pipe with a burned resin inside bowl of pipe, 10A a purple and white plastic container containing a trace amount of a green plant like material inside, 11A one black plastic container labeled Higher Lone Cannabis Flower that had a trace amount of a green plant like material inside, 1B one purple tin tray with a green plant like material on top of the tray, 1C one clear glass jar with a green plant like material inside labeled Redbud Roots Wuuberry Flower 2C one silver small screwdriver clean out tool 3C one white paper plate containing 3 metal clean-out tools with a burned resin at the end. 4C one blue plastic Caliblaze container.



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I tested the green plant like material from 1A and the burnt resin from 8A with a Duquenois Levine Reagent test on each separate item. I received a presumptuous positive test for Tetrahydrocannabinol (THC) the active ingredient in Marijuana in both tests.

I weighed the green plant like material from 1A at 0.31g and 1B at 0.47g. I attempt to weigh the green plant like material from 1C, but would not freely come out of the container. I weighed the container and the green plant like material at 209.6 g.

DA REFERRAL: On April 24, 2023, at approximately 1655, at [REDACTED] in the City of Phillips, County of Price, WI Waldemar MADSEN did knowingly and intentionally violate Wisconsin State S. 961.41(3g)(e) Possession of THC and Wisconsin State S. 961.573(1) Possession of Drug Paraphernalia by possessing marijuana and multiple forms of paraphernalia such as smoking devices and storage containers. END OF REPORT

CHIEF MICHAEL HAUSCHILD'S SUPPLEMENTAL REPORT

INITIAL INFORMATION-

On Monday April 24, 2023 at approximately 7:00 a.m. I, Chief Michael HAUSCHILD, was on duty in full police uniform for the City of Phillips Police Department. I arrived at the police department when Officer CARLSON advised me of a drug search warrant she completed and would be getting it reviewed and signed by Judge KLEIN. The warrant was for Waldemar MADSEN'S residence at [REDACTED] in the City of Phillips. I was advised the warrant would include vehicles and the garage on the property. At approximately 11:45 a.m. Officer CARLSON advised that the warrant was signed by Judge KLEIN.

Officer CARLSON, Officer HOLDEN, Lt. PETERSON and I briefed for the warrant and it was decided that Lt. PETERSON and I would go to the front door while Officer CARLSON and Officer HOLDEN went to the back door.

At approximately 11:52 a.m. Lt. PETERSON and I arrived at [REDACTED] in the City of Phillips. I had several copies of the warrant in hand and knocked on the front door of the residence. At approximately 11:53 a.m. I observed MADSEN look out the window of the front door. MADSEN opened the door and I advised MADSEN that our department had a search warrant for the premises for any drugs and drug paraphernalia. I asked MADSEN if he had anyone else in the residence and MADSEN said just his dog.

EXECUTE SEARCH WARRANT-

Lt. PETERSON and I followed MADSEN into the residence. MADSEN asked what this warrant was all about and I told MADSEN that it was for drugs and drug paraphernalia and handed him the copies of the warrant so he could read it. I asked where Major, his dog, was at and he said in there, motioning to the kitchen, and not to worry about him. MADSEN said this is fucking stupid and began to walk towards the hallway where I asked him where he is going and to stop. MADSEN walked to the center of the living room and asked if someone was coming through the back door and to stop or else Major would bite them. I told Officer CARLSON and Officer HOLDEN to come to the front door. MADSEN began to walk around the living room and Lt PETERSON and I told him to sit on the couch.



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I walked to the north bedroom of MADSEN'S and observed a green leafy like plant material that known to be marijuana on top of the dresser which was against the south wall of his bedroom. I walked back out into the living room and told MADSEN that he had marijuana on top of the dresser and asked MADSEN how much total of marijuana he had. MADSEN said that is pretty much it and then looked on the T.V. stand in the living room and said there is some right there and pointed to a jar that had a green leafy plant like material inside.

ARREST WALDEMAR MADSEN-

I advised MADSEN that he would be placed under arrest for possession of marijuana and would be processed at the Price County Jail. I asked MADSEN if he had any weapons on his person as I had seen a knife in his left front pants pocket. Lt PETERSON secured the knife. MADSEN was allowed to get a shirt on and shoes. Officer CARLSON hand cuffed MADSEN behind his back and MADSEN was patted down. MADSEN was transported to the Price County Jail by Officer CARLSON.

PHOTOGRAPH RESIDENCE-

I retrieved the camera from the squad car and began taking overall photos of the residence. I finished with taking photographs of the residence.

CONDITION OF THE RESIDENCE-

In walking through the residence, I observed numerous bags of garbage in the kitchen, living room, and southwest bedroom of the residence. There was an awful odor emitting from the bags of garbage that was so bad that I had to retrieve a mask for Lt. PETERSON and I. There was old food left out on the kitchen table, counter and in both bedrooms of the residence. There were many fruit flies and other insects that were in the cupboards by the kitchen. In the kitchen by the back door where MADSEN'S dog stayed was dog feces that had been spread around the floor and onto the walls. There was also a strong odor of dog feces inside the residence.

PHOTOGRAPH EVIDENCE-

Officer HOLDEN and Lt. PETERSON began searching MADSEN'S north bedroom. I was in charge of writing down the evidence found along with the time and taking photographs of the evidence. At approximately 12:06 p.m. I photographed 1A which was a green plant like material with a pungent odor setting on top of the dresser located against the south wall of the north bedroom. At approximately 12:08 p.m. I photographed 2A which was a black open glass container with a trace amount of a green plant like material. 2A was located on top of the dark dresser against the south wall of the north bedroom. At approximately 12:10 p.m. I photographed 3A which was a blue metal Shred It grinder containing a trace of a green plant like material. 3A was located in the middle of the dark wooden dresser which was against the south wall of the north bedroom. At approximately 12:14 p.m. I photographed 4A which was a blueberry crush container containing a trace amount of a green plant like material which was located on the top left side drawer of the wooden dresser against the south wall of the north bedroom. At approximately 12:20 p.m. I photographed 5A which was a ceramic tan/gray approximately 2 inch pipe with a burned resin inside the bowl which was setting on a T.V. tray at foot of bed in north bedroom. At approximately 12:22 p.m. I photographed 6A which was an empty package of yellow and green Choice THC gummies super sour lemon which was setting on a T.V. stand at the foot of the bed in the north bedroom. At approximately 12:29 p.m. I photographed 7A which was one chrome P380 Davis Industry Arms Pistol with serial number AP107622. Lt. PETERSON ran the serial number through Price County Dispatch which came back with no wants. 7A was located in the left concealed pocket of a leather vest labeled Dreadnaught. The vest was hanging on the southwest closet door. There were also two full magazines, one located in right breast pocket and other mag was in pistol. At approximately 12:34 p.m. I photographed Item 8A which was a red, white and blue rubber band with eyeball inside the tube. There was a glass bowl at end of bong with a burned resin inside. 8A was located on top of a T.V. tray at head of bed in north bedroom. At approximately 12:36 p.m. I photographed 9A which was one 3 inch glass blue and clear marijuana pipe with a burned resin inside bowl of pipe. 9A was setting on top of the T.V. stand at head of bed in north bedroom. At approximately 12:40 p.m. I photographed 10A which was an approximately 5 inch purple and white plastic container containing a trace amount of a green plant like material inside.



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10A was located on top of a brown chair on the west wall in the north bedroom. At approximately 12:44 p.m. I photographed item number 11A which was one black plastic container labeled Higher Lone Cannabis Flower that had a trace amount of a green plant like material inside. 11A was located on top shelf of stand over the bathroom toilet.

At approximately 12:47 p.m. I photographed item 1B which was one purple tin tray with a green plant like material on top of the tray. 1B was located on the top shelf in hallway closet on north side. At approximately 12:51 p.m. I photographed 1C which was one clear glass jar with a green plant like material inside labeled Redbud Roots Wuuberry Flower which was located on a T.V. stand in the living room at foot of couch. At approximately 12:53 p.m. I photographed one silver small screwdriver clean out tool on the T.V. stand in the living room at the foot of the couch. At approximately 12:56 p.m. I photographed item number 3C which was one white paper plate containing 3 metal cleanout tools with a burned resin at the end. 3C was located on top of the brown couch in the living room on the north side. At approximately 12:58 p.m. I photographed 4C which was one blue plastic Caliblaze container indoor Cannabis pre rolled blueberry muffin which was located on the arm of the brown couch south side in living room. This concluded the photographs of the evidence.

Lt PETERSON and I moved out to MADSEN'S pickup truck to search and found nothing of evidentiary value. We then moved to the garage and did not find anything of evidentiary value.

MADSEN had a camper in the back of his garage that his friend was staying in. The camper was registered to

MADSEN. Officer CARLSON called the Price County D.A. to ask if the camper would be included in the warrant. The D.A. did not feel comfortable as another person was living in the camper and not MADSEN. This concluded our search of the property. We cleared from the residence. END OF REPORT

CHIEF MICHAEL HAUSCHILD PHILLIPS POLICE DEPARTMENT



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HAUSCHILD, MICHAEL S. OFFICER'S REPORT

INITIAL INFORMATION: On Monday April 24, 2023 at approximately 11:35 p.m. I Lieutenant Blaine V. PETERSON, was in full police uniform at the Phillips Police Department, in the City of Phillips County of Price Wisconsin. Also present and in full police uniform was Chief HAUSCHILD, Officer HOLDEN, and Officer CARLSON. Officer CARLSON briefed all members of a search warrant for the residence of [REDACTED] Waldemar MADSEN's residence. Officer CARLSON indicated that the warrant was for drug paraphernalia and possession of marijuana. The warrant included the residence, any vehicles registered to MADSEN, and the garage. It was decided that Chief HAUSCHILD and I would go to the front entrance of the residence, while Officer CARLSON and Officer HOLDEN went to the rear exit of the residence. Officer CARLSON described an item of evidence specific was a water bong with what appeared to be an eyeball in the tube of the bong.

ARRIVAL: At approximately 11:52 a.m. Chief HAUSCHILD and I arrived at [REDACTED]. Chief HAUSCHILD knocked on the front door of the residence. I observed movement through the window in the front door. MADSEN came to the door and Chief HAUSCHILD advised MADSEN that we had a search warrant. Chief HAUSCHILD and I followed MADSEN into his residence.

NOTE: Upon entry of the residence I could smell the strong odor of dog feces, and rotten refuse. I observed in the living area of the residence had loose refuse, old food and drink containers. I observed multiple piles of clothes and it was unkept and cluttered.

CONTACT W/ MADSEN: I instructed MADSEN to sit on the end of the couch. MADSEN did so. MADSEN indicated he does not do anything to anybody and he does not know what is going on or who called us the other day. Chief HAUSCHILD went into the bedroom and came back out and indicated he had located evidence. MADSEN had a knife in his left pants pocket. I obtained the knife from MADSEN. Chief HAUSCHILD provided MADSEN with a shirt. MADSEN obtained a pair of boots. MADSEN was also provided with numerous copies of the search warrant. Officer CARLSON placed her handcuffs on MADSEN and double locked them. Officer HOLDEN then searched MADSEN and did not locate any items of evidence on his person. MADSEN requested his phone and his wallet which were provided to Officer CARLSON. MADSEN was then transported to jail by Officer CARLSON.

CONTACT W/ PRICE COUNTY HUMAN SERVICES: I spoke with Kayla Borgen of Price County Human Services. I had briefed her prior to our arrival about the possible condition of the home. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] Borgen spoke with me and advised that Taylor County Human Services would not be responding [REDACTED] Borgen advised that Taylor County Human Services indicated that they had done a check of the residence within the last couple of weeks. I advised Borgen that the amount of refuse in the house was more than a couple of weeks worth. [REDACTED]

Borgen indicated she would note this in her report.

In the kitchen of the residence was numerous large bags of rotting household refuse. Also in the area where the dog stays was dog feces that had been forced into the flooring due to the dog remaining in that area. This was documented during the overall pictures of the residence.

SEARCH: Chief HAUSCHILD was taking overall photographs of the residence. Officer HOLDEN and I began searching in the north bedroom believed to be MADSEN's room. Chief HAUSCHILD documented items found by photograph and also



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written description of item and location found. I then packaged the item and labeled it with time collected and item number. Items of evidence located is as follows:

1A: 12:06 p.m. loose green plant like material believed to be marijuana setting on top of the dresser located against south wall of the north bedroom. I collected this item by scraping in into a plastic evidence bag.

2A: 12:08 p.m. black open glass container with a trace amount of a green plant like material. 2A was located on top of the dark dresser against the south wall of the north bedroom. Also located was a sealable cap for item 2A. Item 2A was placed into an evidence container.

3A: 12:10 p.m. a blue metal "Shred It" marijuana grinder with green plant like material inside suspected to be marijuana. 3A was discovered on top of the dresser in the middle area. 3A was placed into an evidence container.

4A: 12:14 p.m. a blueberry cush container containing a trace amount of a green plant like material which was located on the top left side drawer of the wooden dresser against the south wall of the north bedroom. Item 4A was placed into an evidence container.

5A: 12:20 p.m. a ceramic tan/gray approximately 2 inch pipe with a burned resin inside the bowl which was setting on a T.V. tray at foot of bed in north bedroom. Item 5A was placed into an evidence container.

6A: 12:22 p.m. a empty package of yellow and green Choice THC gummies super sour lemon which was setting on a T.V. stand at the foot of the bed in the north bedroom. Item 6A was placed into an evidence container.

7A: 12:29 p.m. a chrome P380 Davis Industry Arms Pistol with serial number AP107622. I ran the serial number through Price County Dispatch which came back with no wants. 7A was located in the left concealed pocket of a leather vest labeled Dreadnaught. The vest was hanging on the southwest closet door. There were also two full magazines, one located in right breast pocket and other mag was in pistol. Item 7A was placed into an evidence container.

8A: 12:34 p.m. a red, white and blue rubber bond with eyeball inside the tube. There was a glass bowl at end of bong with a burned resin inside. 8A was located on top of a T.V. tray at head of bed in north bedroom. I noted this item match the description that Officer CARLSON had provided to us while briefing. Item 8A was placed into an evidence container.

9A: 12:36 p.m. a 3 inch glass blue and clear marijuana pipe with a burned resin inside bowl of pipe. 9A was setting on top of the T.V. stand at head of bed in north bedroom. Item 9A was placed into an evidence container.

10A: 12:40 p.m. an approximately 5 inch purple and white plastic container containing a trace amount of a green plant like material inside. 10A was located on top of a brown chair on the west wall in the north bedroom. Item 10A was placed into an evidence container.

11A: 12:44 p.m. a black plastic container labeled Higher Lone Cannabis Flower that had a trace amount of a green plant like material inside. 11A was located on top shelf of stand over the bathroom toilet. Item 11A was placed into an evidence container.

1B: 12:47 p.m. a purple tin tray with a picture of the Teenage Mutant Ninja Turtles on it. A green plant like material on top of the tray. 1B was located on the top shelf in hallway closet on north side. Item 1B was placed into an evidence container.

1C: 12:51 p.m. a clear glass jar with a green plant like material inside labeled Redbud Roots Wuuberry Flower which was located on a T.V. stand in the living room at foot of couch. Item 1C was placed into an evidence container.



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2C: 12:53 p.m. a silver small screwdriver clean out tool on the T.V. stand in the living room at the foot of the couch. Item 2C was placed into an evidence container.

3C: 12:56 p.m. a white paper plate containing 3 metal clean out tools with a burned resin at the end. 3C was located on top of the brown couch in the living room on the north side. Item 3C was placed into an evidence container.

4C: 12:58 p.m. a blue plastic Caliblast container indoor Cannabis pre rolled blueberry muffin which was located on the arm of the brown couch south side in living room. Item 4C was placed into an evidence container.

This concluded the search of the residence interior. Chief HAUSCHILD and I exited the residence to begin searching the vehicles and garage on the property. Officer HOLDEN remained inside the home with the evidence that had been collected. Chief HAUSCHILD and I searched MADSEN's pickup truck. No items of evidence was located in this vehicle. Chief HAUSCHILD searched the passenger side of the truck while I searched the driver side of the truck.

I then observed MADSEN in the rear of the residence near his dog. MADSEN indicated that I could search a truck camper that was on the property. I searched the truck camper and did not locate any items of evidence. Chief HAUSCHILD and I then searched the garage and did not locate any items of evidence. Behind the garage was an RV that I ran the registration through Price County Dispatch Center. Dispatch indicated that the vehicle was registered to MADSEN. [REDACTED] were in the RV at this time. [REDACTED] indicated that [REDACTED] has been residing in the RV since April 4, 2023. [REDACTED] indicated that [REDACTED] is going to be purchasing the RV from MADSEN. With this information Officer CARLSON spoke with the Price County District Attorney's Office. Officer CARLSON advised me that the search of the RV was not advised.

I met with [REDACTED] and asked if [REDACTED] would consent to law enforcement searching the RV. [REDACTED] indicated he did not consent to the search of the RV. No search of the RV was conducted. This concluded the search of the property. I returned to the residence and collected the items of evidence from Officer HOLDEN. I then provided the items of evidence to Officer CARLSON. At approximately 1:50 p.m. all members of the Phillips Police Department cleared from the residence.

On Monday April 24, 2023, I, Officer Tristin HOLDEN, was advised by Officer Morgan CARLSON of a search warrant that was going to be executed on Waldemar MADSEN at [REDACTED]. Officer CARLSON had the warrant signed by the Honorable Judge Kevin KLEIN and we met at the Phillips Police Department to brief.

It was decided that Chief Michael HAUSCHILD and Lieutenant Blaine PETERSON would go to the front of the residence and make contact with MADSEN. Officer CARLSON and I would go to the back of the residence and stand by until contact was made and moved into the residence.

At approximately 11:52 a.m. Officer CARLSON and I arrived at the residence and walked to the back of the residence. Chief HAUSCHILD and Lt. PETERSON made contact with MADSEN and advised us to come into the residence. I walked into the residence and observed the strong odor of marijuana in the residence.



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ARREST OF MADSEN: Lt. PETERSON advised MADSEN that he would be placed under arrest. Lt. PETERSON asked MADSEN if he had any weapons on his persons. MADSEN stated he had a pocketknife. Lt. PETERSON took the knife and Officer CARLSON placed handcuffs on MADSEN. I searched MADSEN and Officer CARLSON brought MADSEN to the Price County Jail for booking.

SEARCH OF THE RESIDENCE: Lt. PETERSON and I began searching MADSEN'S north bedroom. I was in charge of writing on the labels and placing the evidence in the bag. At approximately 12:06 p.m. I was handed item 1A which was a green plant like material with a pungent odor setting on top of the dresser located against the south wall of the north bedroom. At approximately 12:08 p.m. I was handed 2A which was a black open glass container with a trace amount of a green plant like material. 2A was located on top of the dark dresser against the south wall of the north bedroom. At approximately 12:10 p.m. I was handed item 3A which was a blue metal Shred. Its grinder contains a trace of a green plant like material. 3A was located in the middle of the dark wooden dresser which was against the south wall of the north bedroom. At approximately 12:14 p.m. I was handed item 4A which was a blueberry cush container containing a trace amount of a green plant like material which was located on the top left side drawer of the wooden dresser against the south wall of the north bedroom.

At this time Chief HAUSCHILD asked me to search the closets located on the west wall of the north bedroom. I did not locate any contraband in the two closets. I searched the chair in between the two closets. I located an approximately 5-inch purple and white plastic container containing a trace amount of a green plant like material inside. I did not locate anything else.

I moved my search to the bathroom where I located a black plastic cylinder container with a Higher Lover sticker. I observed a green leafy substance inside the container and the pungent odor of marijuana. I did not locate anything else.

I searched the hallway closet and worked my way into the living room. I did not locate anything in either location.

I searched in the kitchen. It should be noted that there was a strong odor of dog feces and there were several large black plastic bags of refuse in the kitchen as well. I observed on the south side of the kitchen there was a location where the dog was kept. I observed the whole floor and part of the dryer was covered in dog feces. The kitchen counter also had large amounts of refuse on them.

Chief HAUSCHILD and Lt. PETERSON walked outside to search for the vehicles, and I stood in the residence until the search was completed. This concluded the search of the property, and we cleared shortly after.
