FCQG July 14, 2020 Meeting Minutes via Zoom

Bonny Kindt welcomed 50 members and two guests (July and August speakers). She thanked Megan Harris for her technical expertise, introduced the new board and thanked the former board. Anne Marie Schmelter (President 2016-2018) presented outgoing President Ollie Gray with a stained glass quilt as a parting gift.

Budget—In addition to sharing the balanced monthly budget in each newsletter, the balance in our savings and checking accounts will be posted. We currently have over \$47,000 available which puts us close to loosing our 501 (C) status. Bonny suggested that we disperse some of these funds, keep in mind: Caring for the Community, Compassion for Others, and Caring for Each Other. We do need to maintain start-up funds for our larger regular events (Quilt Show and Bingo) and a reasonable amount would be \$20,000. Bonny proposed gathering suggestions for charitable ways to spend down some of our funds. Though no amount has been agreed upon, one suggestion was \$5,000. (A majority of guild members present at a monthly meeting will have to approved the amount.) By our August guild meeting, each bee was asked to submit two ideas to Bonny via their chairperson (bonfire181@hotmail.com). Non-bee members can submit their ideas to Marilyn Whalen (whalen51@comcast.net). The needs of all of the four counties we represent should be considered. Two ideas: a scholarship that fits the purpose of our organization and a donation to the food bank at Mt. Airy Calvary United Methodist Church.

Audit of Books—An audit was done last year. Bylaws need to be updated to reflect auditing regulations. Additionally, since we are meeting virtually for the foreseeable future, a bylaw update may be needed. The current Bylaws Committee is—Iris Johnson (Chair), Jane Schiemer, Debbie Brehm, Joan Watkins and Sue Heslin.

"Quilts in the Park"—Bonny shared the vision for this one-day quilt show event to be held at Piney Run Park & Nature Center in Sykesville, MD, on Saturday, September 26, from 10:00-4:00. On Sunday, July 12, seven guild members attended a preliminary meeting at the site with two park representatives. Slides showing a mock-up of how quilts would be displayed were shared and members were directed to look at the center's website for more visuals and info. At the conclusion of the meeting, Bonny asked members for a show of hands of who was interested in participating.

Zoom Platform—Megan Harris was able to use two discounts and purchase the guild's Zoom account including a security platform for \$129/year.

Web Fabrics—Web Fabrics in Purcellville closed its store at the end of June and is now functioning as an online business. Owner Carly Mul offered a large selection of her inventory to 501 (C) groups and Marilyn Whalen and Sue Deiringer-Boyer represented the guild at this free shopping spree. Many items were acquired for door prizes at future meetings. An older Dell computer Model D09S—computer, keyboard and mouse (Iris has a monitor she will donate) is available free to a guild member. Contact Marilyn Whalen if interested.

Where's Waldo—Vicki Brewer has extended the deadline for this quild challenge to the August guild meeting. Prizes are available in Art Category and Traditional Quilt Pattern Category. Awards will be presented following the August Zoom meeting.

Birthdays—Bonny acknowledged July birthdays.

Door Prizes—With Megan Harris spinning the wheel, Anne-Marie Schmelter tagged door prizes for tonight's winners: Nancy Willett, Maria Wells, Laura Schwartz, Della Aubrey-Miller and Karen Brown. Eventually, the prizes will be delivered/picked up.

Public Service Announcement!

Vote Safely!

There are less than 100 days until November 3 - election day. We are still in a pandemic. Standing in line and voting in crowded polling places may not be the safe. Maryland allows any registered voter to vote with an absentee ballot.

You can apply for a ballot online here: <u>https://elections.maryland.gov/voting/absentee.html</u> *A quick synopsis of the website:*

How do I request a mail-in ballot?

2020 Presidential General Election

There are three ways you can request a mail-in ballot.

1. <u>Online if you have a Maryland's driver's license or MVA-issued ID card</u>. *Kay's note: Your required signature is on file if you have a MD driver's license.*

2. Complete and return one of the forms below. Read the instructions, enter the required information, print the form, sign it, and return it to your **local (county) board of elections**. You can return it by mail, fax, or email (scanned as an attachment). <u>Mail-in ballot application for 2020 elections (PDF)</u> <u>Solicitud de Papeleta de Votante Ausente para las Elecciones del 2020 (PDF)</u>

3. Go to your local board of elections, if open, fill out and turn in the form.

When you receive your ballot keep it safe.

Option 1: Mail in your voted ballot to your local board of elections office well before the deadline to take the strain off the Post Office.

Option 2: Hand deliver your voted ballot to your local board of elections office, an early voting center, or an election-day polling place. In addition, the State Board of Elections expects to deploy ballot drop-off boxes for the general election.

Governor Hogan and the State Board of Elections may make changes – watch your local news.

Vote. Stay safe. Request an absentee ballot *early* and vote *early* to lighten the load on the Post Office. Protect your fellow community members and the poll workers.

ALL AGES--Do it with kids over 9!

Make a Skinny quilt/table runner, or wall hanging of any size, a luxurious pillow top, a tote bag, photo album cover, or placemats.

As you weave, you'll develop a sense of design and composition, value and color, movement and shape, balance and rhythm!

Class Supply List:

First, choose a color palette for your creation to match the décor where it will go. Make sure you have similar and complementary colors in light, medium, and dark values.

- 2 yards plain, neutral fabric for a padded work surface
- 1 yard of paper-backed, heavy-duty fusible web, 17" wide (I recommend heavy-duty Wonder-Under)
- Scraps and/or fat eighths of fabrics in your chosen colors—at least 6 different ones
- 12"-18" lengths of ribbons, lace, rickrack, and/or flat trims in colors to match and contrast; satin ribbons are great for shine, while metallics add zing!
- Basic rotary cutting supplies, pins and pin cushion, fabric-cutting scissors
