



FCQG Zoom Meeting Minutes--November 10, 2020

President Bonny Kindt began the meeting at 7:02. She acknowledged new members Mary Jo Richmond and Karen Smith and attending members who have birthdays in November. Forty one members signed on for the meeting.

Melinda Horner introduced our guest speaker Rachel Rossi from Lancaster, PA. Rachel favors clean, modern, simple designs and her works focus on form, function and impact. Rachel spoke about ways to inspire the next generation of quilters. Members can sign up for her newsletter at rachelrossi.design.

Following our guest speaker's presentation, the minutes of the October 13 meeting were approved. A motion was made by Margaret Minton, seconded by Sue Dieringer-Boyer and unanimously approved.

Next, Melinda talked about "Pocket Quilts" and shared examples from Pinterest. Marilyn Whalen shared samples of the patterns from Shabby Quilts that are posted on the guild website. Members interested in participating should email Marilyn by November 15. A few days later she will send each participant the name of the person to surprise. The pocket quilts can be sent anytime in the month of December. Any pocket quilts received before our December meeting can be shared during "Show & Tell" at the meeting.

Additionally, Cecil Marzulli shared information about a project she is working on for Mt. Vernon concerning Martha Washington's quilts. More info will follow as the project continues. She volunteered to head the "Welcome Committee" for new members and will be sending them a pocket quilt!

Bonny talked about the "Quilters Pony Express" as a way of getting wheel prizes and other items to members. She asked for a volunteer from each county to receive/hold items. Then, members who want to collect items would call the person closest to them and arrange a time to pick up the item. This can be done without any physical contact between members. This is a work in progress so be patient as the kinks are smoothed out.

Melinda Horner reviewed the two challenges for 2021. First, a "Cherry Blossom" themed quilt which can be started anytime. The size should be 30" square. Melinda showed two Michael Miller fabric panels that might interest members as they brainstorm ideas. Check Etsy, Ebay and E-Quilter for availability if interested in these fabrics. One challenge winner will be determined by on-line voting, and the goal is to display the entries at the Spring Tea. Also, Bonny has some Oriental fabric that might be useful for this challenge; members can contact her if interested. Dawn Cynamon asked if anyone knew the deadline for AQS Show entries. Melinda said she would check. Second, a "Nature" themed challenge will take place for the fall and will be unveiled at "Quilts in the Park" (if we participate in that event). Entry can be anything that fits the theme.

Karen Carpenter reported that she, Linda Dickinson and five volunteers will be meeting to begin planning the outdoor Spring Tea.

A "Quilters' Yard Sale"_for FCQG members only will be held on Saturday, December 5, from 10:00-12:00 in the upper parking lot of Mt. Airy United Methodist Church where we had been meeting before COVID. We will use the upper parking lot because it is more level. Bring fabric and quilting/sewing items you want to give away or sell. Clearly mark items you want to sell versus give-aways. A small table can be used to display items or set up directly from the trunk of your vehicle. Wear a mask, please.

For the December meeting, we have no guest speaker. Bonny asked members to add a festive touch to the zoom meeting by wearing something festive, adding a cheerful touch to their background, etc. Melinda shared some examples of small items members might be interested in making for holiday sharing, and cited COUNTRY LIVING magazine (October issue) for examples of fall decorations that offer inspiration. Mary Jo Richmond shared an example of a simple holiday ornament that looks like a colorful stack of three bolts of fabric.

The quarterly board/business meeting (Zoom) will be on Tuesday, December 15, at 7:00. Committee heads should be ready to share updates. Ideas for the future of the guild should be shared at this time. If not able to attend, send ideas to Marilyn Whalen.
