Quick n' Easy Wine Bag

Gather up all those holiday scraps and stitch a quickie hostess gift to give with that bottle of wine or stuffed full of goodies Christmas stocking style! Don't forget to stitch an extra one for a later contribution to FCQG Quilt Show '23! (More on that in your January newsletter!)



Supplies: Holiday fabric

28" ribbon Bottle of Wine

Cut 12" x 20" rectangle from Holiday fabric.
 This rectangle could be from various sized scraps!

9 x 12

- 2. Fold down 1" on one short end and press crease.
- 3. Fold down another 4", press crease. Stitch on creased fold line.
- 4. Fold fabric right sides together making a rectangle 6" x 12".
- Fold ribbon in half and pin in long edge just below stitched line, Making sure cut edges of ribbon are tucked inside of bag.



- 6. Stitch along long side and bottom, catching the ribbon in the seam.
- Keep bag wrong side out and "box" the bottom corners of bag, stitching 1 1/4" from each corner.
- 8. Turn right side out. Done!



SEW 'N SIP EVERY SECOND MONDAY OF EACH MONTH



Did you know that every second Monday of each month, members from Four County Quilters Guild and Clustered Spires Quilt Guild are invited to gather at The Sew 'n Place in Fayetteville, PA for a day of sewing together? With the opening of a spacious new classroom and cafe, The Sew 'n Place is a perfect place for a "miniretreat" from 10:00 - 4:00 each second Monday. The classroom can accommodate up to 16 people. The classroom is well lit, with natural light coming from a wall of windows, as well as excellent classroom lighting. Each sewing table has its own

outlet, so no need for extension cords. Tables are adjustable with the touch of a button.

Cost is \$10 per person. The cafe, located just adjacent to the classroom, is now open and serves delicious cafe drinks. Special Christmas drinks are available for purchase in December. Sandy Dunning, member of both guilds, has made arrangements with the store to reserve the classroom each month. Quilt Retreat - Camp Pecometh April 13, - 16, 2023 – There are a few spots still available, and a \$100.00 deposit will hold your spot. Minutes, FCQG November Meeting November 8, 2022

The meeting was called to order at 7 PM by Marilyn Whalen, President.

Visitor Barb Ohlstein was introduced and welcomed.

This month there were seven birthdays among the members. They were congratulated and invited to take a fat quarter from the Birthday Basket.

Kay Worley made a motion for the minutes of the October 2022 meeting to be approved. It was seconded by Libi Driggers and approved after unanimous vote. (Note: in the October minutes, Sue Dieringer-Boyer's sister was identified as "Marion". Her name is actually "Mary".)

Rhonda Madden introduced the speaker for this evening. Rhonda Pierce, a representative of Schmetz Needles, presented the color-coded identification system used by Schmetz. Her favorite needle is Microtex 80/20. She touted the new Super Nonstick needles made by her company. They are currently out of stock on the website.

Old Business:

The Bingo Committee which included Marilyn, Tessa, Annette, Rhonda and others, proudly announced that the Bingo yielded \$xxxx!! The event was very exciting and fun for all.

By Laws: Mary Jo Richmond presented the committee's recommendations for a change in officers in Section 4. After much discussion, a motion to keep the original wording was put forward and seconded. By majority vote, Section 4 will remain as it is.

Changes to the Treasurer's reporting schedule were proposed. A motion was made to review the Treasurer's books annually. They would then be approved by the board and the results presented to the membership. The motion was seconded and carried by majority vote. To date Sections 1, 2, 3 and 4 of the by-laws are approved by majority.

New Business:

A proposal for adding a line item in the budget for advertising the guild itself (not specific upcoming activities) was made by Marilyn. Two hundred dollars was suggested. There was a motion made to approve this amount. It was seconded and carried by majority vote.

There was a discussion about meetings that may be affected by inclement weather. If the speaker is scheduled for a presentation via Zoom, the meeting could be held virtually. More discussion will follow.

<u>Christmas Banque</u>t: Libi Driggers informed members that they must sign up to attend the banquet. Also, a pattern is available to make 13" stockings for women and children at a local women's crisis center (this is an optional activity in place of a gift exchange). Wear a festive garment to the banquet and bring along a Christmas quilt to share.

Show and Tell:

Quilts were shown by Mary Gulas, Marilyn Whalen, Anne Marie Schmeltzer and Leslie Cole.
