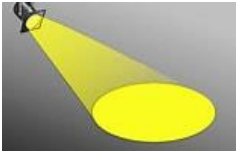
President's Corner

Quilt Show 2023

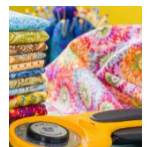


Do you remember how nice our quilt shows have been? How amazing all of our handiwork looked and the fun we had working together to make it happen? Well, it is time to start planning it.

January 17, 2022 Meeting Minutes

President Bonny Kindt opened the meeting via the Guild's Zoom link as the church is closed until 01/24/2022.

The December 2021 minutes were approved by the members in attendance.

Speaker:

This month's speaker was Nancy Brown of Nancy Brown Quilts (quilts.nancybrownquilts.com). She talked about her amazing animal quilts and her relationship with George Clooney.

Nominating Committee:

President Bonny Kindt reported that volunteers are needed for the nominating committee.

According to the current bylaws, a slate of nominees for President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer must be presented to the membership in April - both in advance in the newsletter and again at the meeting. Voting is to be held at the annual meeting in May and the newly elected officers will take their offices at the close of the June meeting.

Parties interested in serving on the committee or running for office should contact Bonny (soon, please).

Bylaws Committee:

President Bonny Kindt reported that the Bylaws committee has met and should have something for the membership to review in February or March.

Website:

With the guidance of Iris Johnson, Ann Marie Smelter is making big upgrades to the guild's website. Members should check it out.

Financials:

A committee is being put together to perform the annual audit of our books.

Ideas for the use of Guild funds was discussed. Some suggestions were 1) increased budget line items [community quilts, speakers, philanthropy, door prizes], 2) supplies for retreat boxes, and 3) long arm training for members to use to quilt guild charity quilts. No clear decision was made.

It was suggested that the Guild develop a strategic plan prior to committing funds.

PayPal:

Joan Watkins resolved issues with the Guild's PayPal account by providing them a required document.

Amazon Smile:

Marilyn Whalen successfully linked the FCQG bank account to Amazon Smile. She will include instructions for using Amazon Smile in the February newsletter and will ask Ann Marie to put these instructions on the website.

Quilt Retreat/Workshops/Bees:

Melinda Horner reported on upcoming and future retreats & workshops:

1) Miniature Quilt Workshop (Zoom) with Kellie Willy on 1/21/22.

2) The Library Bee schedule is published in the newsletter.

3) Guild retreats at Camp Pecometh retreats on 4/7-10/22 and 8/18-21/22.

The April retreat is full, but Melinda is taking sign ups for a waitlist in case of cancellations.

The August retreat has 11 spots left. Deposits for this retreat can be sent to Melinda or to Treasurer Marilyn Whalen.

4) The International Conference Center in Leesburg, VA is a future 2023 retreat site. It is a facility that can accommodate 60+ guild members at one time. More information will be forthcoming.

5) Mt. Vernon quilt challenge – Contact Cecil Marzulli for details.

5) 2021 Cherry Blossom Challenge quilts will be displayed at the Mancuso Fall Show The Pennsylvania Quilt Extravaganza in Oaks, PA this fall 2022.
