

Quilt Bingo

Marilyn reported that the Quilt Bingo scheduled for October has been cancelled due to the pandemic. Having a virtual bingo was evaluated but rejected due to overwhelming technical details. Rescheduling the actual Bingo for 2021 or 2022 was also discussed but no final decision was made.

The committee is focusing its efforts on smaller fundraisers that can be more easily done electronically, for example shopping gift cards, guilted note cards, cookbook, and the like. The committee will evaluate options.
