## Beautiful Quilts...isn't that what it's all about?

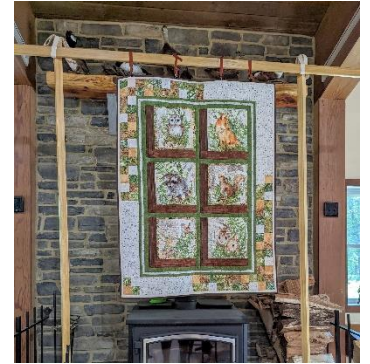

## Wildlife Quilt Challenge

Are you working on your fall challenge quilt, yet? To honor our lovely Quilts in the Park setting with its lake, trees, vegetation, and wonderful wildlife habitat, we challenge you to make a quilt or useful quilted item featuring wildlife of North America. America's parks have an abundance of wildlife, including woodland creatures like bears, deer, foxes, and rabbits, aquatic creatures like fish and frogs, pretty butterflies and pesky mosquitoes, and an abundance of ducks and birds.



Make your quilt as big or small as you like or make a quilted item like a bag or pillow. It can be pieced, appliquéd, embellished, or any combination of suitable techniques, but it must be quilted, have a label somewhere with your name or more, and be either bound or incorporated into a finished useful item. Pin an index card or piece of paper telling about your quilt on the front. We prefer that you tell us in advance what you will enter and how much line or display space each entry needs so we will have enough room for all the entries. Plan to bring your entries to Quilts in the Park at Piney Run Park for hanging no later than 9:30 a.m. on Saturday, September 17, or give them to Robin Keyser in advance if you can't get them to the park by that time.

Viewers will vote for their favorite. There will be cash awards for first, second, and third place. You may enter more than one quilt or item, but each person can only win one award.



Members who want to sell their challenge quilt or any other quilt on display can place a note on their quilt telling if it is for sale or not. All sales and of terms of sale are to be negotiated directly between buyer and seller without involving the guild.

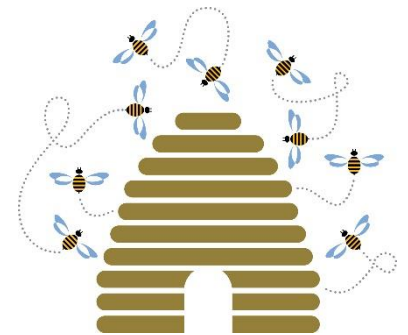

July 12, 2022, Meeting Minutes**

The meeting was called to order by Marilyn Whalen, President. Guest Dottie Hicks was introduced and welcomed.

Since we did not have a visiting guild with their raffle quilt, our own raffle quilt was on display and tickets were available for purchase. July birthdays were announced. Peggy Hurkett and Ruth Poffenberger were serenaded by a chorus of Happy Birthday.

Since the minutes of the May meeting had not been approved previously, the president called for a show of hands to approve. The May minutes were seconded and approved. The June minutes were then seconded and approved.

Our speaker for this month was Jennifer Houlden who presented her program via ZOOM. The topic was "Creating with Color". She began by telling of her various travels and how the geography affected her quilting. She then explained intensities and values of color. Using the color wheel, she talked about various color schemes such as Split Complement, Analogous, Tetradic, Triadic, and Achromatic. Many of her quilts used the "Bargello" technique. Jennifer offered a 20% discount to 4CQG members for use on her website, [www.quiltsbyjen.ca](http://www.quiltsbyjen.ca). The discount code is FourCounty2022. This is available until July 31, 2022.

**New Business:**

**Bingo Committee:** Karen Gladfelter donated 2 quilts and Tessa Gordon donated 1 quilt. Any other donations of quilts should be made to Marilyn by the August meeting. There will be a call for home-baked goods coordinated by Annette Dietrich. These will be sold at the bingo for dessert.

**Tunnels To Towers Committee:** Nanci O'Brien announced that there will be one more month to complete patriotic quilts for this project. We have almost reached the goal of 100 quilts! Two quilts were available for binding.

**Raffle Quilt Committee:** Sue Heslin asked for volunteers to take our quilt to other guild meetings and 2 community festivals. She also asked each member to take 6 tickets to sell.

**2023 Quilt Show Committee:** Bonny Kindt asked that members think of a theme and name for our show. Nancy Willett distributed paper to write suggestions. Members may submit ideas electronically through August 1st to Marilyn. There will be a prize for the winning idea!

**Quilts-In-The-Park:** Linda Dickinson displayed some adorable crafts that will be sold at the QIP show on September 17. There will be a workshop at the Mt Airy library on Sat. July 16, to make small shoulder bags for the craft sale. The "North American Wildlife" Challenge will take place at this show. Three monetary prizes will be awarded.

**Ice Cream Social Committee:** Vicki Brewer and Nanci O'Brien announced that the "Ice Cream Social" is back after a two year hiatus because of the pandemic! Come ready to enjoy a cool treat at the August meeting!

**Community Quilts Committee for 2022-2023:** Olga Schricte and Sandy Dunning will spearhead the new community endeavor for 2022-2023. The project will be "Fidget Mats" for Rock Creek School.

The Business Meeting was concluded.
