Items Kristi needs to submit by July 10th are the show forms, quilter's name, title of quilt, size and insurance value. Kristi also needs a description that will be hung with your quilt at the exhibit.

QUILT SHOW REGISTRATION

Members of Four County Quilt Guild can now register up to four quilts each! In fact, if you're ready to that now, just use this <u>link</u>. This is the same link that you may have used to register Quilts 1 and 2 so please be prepared to see those same numbers again. We will change the numbers on the back end to 3 and 4 so your quilts are properly represented. We currently have about 84 quilts registered, and we are aiming for about 200 quilts. We may be back around for more quilts from our members if more people don't take advantage of this opportunity. Our initial deadline was June 1st.

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

The volunteer slots for our Quilt Show are ready for people to begin to sign up. The Quilt Show committee has agreed that members who sign up for four hours would get free admission to the quilt show. Most volunteer positions in this quilt show have been slotted for two-hour increments so that our members can work a couple of different spots to see different areas of the quilt show while they are working. Attached to this newsletter is a document that describes the work expected for each volunteer job. Things will evolve and job expectations will change too as the show continues to

evolve. It's hard to believe, but right now the program we're using for sign ups (SignUp Genius) shows that we have over 300 slots that need to be filled with volunteers. You will see that some slots have already been taken as the Quilt Show Committee saw the sign-ups first because they needed to be assigned to their area. I'm very excited about our show! I'm looking forward to getting to know all of you better that weekend and seeing the incredible work that our group has done. Minutes 4CQG May 9, 2023

"Sewcial" time was from 6:30-7:00 pm, with mini cupcakes and pretzels provided by the guild. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm by Marilyn Whalen, President.

Our guild welcomed the Annapolis Quilt Guild with their raffle quilt, Christopher Yarber, our scholarship recipient, and his mother and a visitor.

From the philanthropy committee, Sue Dieringer-Boyer and Vicki Brewer joined our scholarship winner Christopher Yarber on stage as he demonstrated his sewing skills by modeling a suit he had made, showing a patchwork crocheted quilt designed and made for a school project and sharing a crocheted vest he had designed and made. A check for \$X was awarded to him for his continuing education in textiles at Stevenson University. Additionally, thanks to Nanci O'Brien for her participation on the committee.

Minutes from the April meeting were approved with a motion by Maryjean Spencer and seconded by Kay Worley. All approved.

Old Business:

There will be a board meeting via ZOOM on June 6, 2023, at 7:00. All members are encouraged to participate.

We will be discussing our budget as several items were pointed out that may be excessively funded. A printed budget will be in the June newsletter for consideration of items with blue arrows. Kristina Crowe made a motion to table the budget approval until the June meeting. It was seconded by Linda Beavers and carried by all present.

New Business:

"Sleep in Heavenly Peace": Our charity endeavor to make 20 quilts for "Sleep in Heavenly Peace" was concluded tonight, although some of the quilts are still being completed. Twenty-seven quilts will be going to the organization this month with the remainder going in June. Kitti Haywood made a suggestion to continue adding to this project throughout the year. Also, Mary Jo Richmond announced that Rock Creek School had collected funds for the organization. No decision was made.

Spring Tea: Marilyn gave accolades to the Spring Tea Committee and chairs Kristi Dillard and Karen Carpenter for arranging a spectacular afternoon of festivities. The "Country Living" challenge quilts were on display and members voted for their favorites

Quilt Show August 4-5: Mary Jo Richmond gave a tutorial on how to register quilts for the show on the Guild website. No sleeves are required on quilts. It is possible that a third quilt may be allowed pending total entry counts. It is important for members to register their quilts so the staging committee can begin their task of positioning the quilts at the show. She also announced the next committee meeting will be held at the church facility on May 22. There were sign-up sheets on the tables for participation in the Bargain Bin and the "Quiltporium".

Retreat: Melinda Horner announced the upcoming retreat at Hallowood as well as the next few library sew-ins. The dates were published in the May newsletter. Linda Dickinson will be at several of the sew-ins with projects for the "Quiltporium".

Thank You: Kitti Haywood's sister sent thanks to our members who attended her Delaware guild's quilt show.

Program: Ann Marie Smelter presented a program about why and how to make a quilt label. There was also a tour of the church facilities showing the areas where our August show will take place.

June SCRAPBUSTING

by Linda Dickinson





Use bright colorful fabrics and fun animal prints

2 - 3 1/2"" X 6 1/2" (1 front and 1 back—Do not have to be the same) 1 - 3" x 6 1/2" lightweight fusible fleece Sew-on Velcro 3/4" w x 1 1/2"

- 1. Press fusible fleece to wrong side of one 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" fabric.
- 2. Use pattern as template and center on wrong side of one 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" fabric. Draw around template.
- 3. Lay the 2 fabric pieces right sides together. Sew on drawn line, leaving a gap large enough for turning.
- 4. Cut excess fabric 1/4" from seam line.
- 5. Turn right side out tuckin fabric in opening. Press and topstitch around outer edge.
- 6. Sew velcro as indicated.
