The fires created lots of smoke. Even schools were closed some days. Now back to brekkie at macca's and coffee dates.

**Bev Buchan says** – Our fifteen-year-old granddaughter Hannah is away for four weeks on The World Challenge trip with seventeen of her school mates. They have been to Cambodia and are now in Vietnam. They have to do a lot of the travel arrangements as well as sharing other jobs between themselves. Today the team will make their way to Buon Ma Thuot. This will be the starting point for their Yon Don Trek which lets them explore Vietnams largest National Park. What a great opportunity for them all.

**Joyce Lowe says** – Glenda Anset and I have been enjoying the magnificence of Turkey for the last week. It has the most beautiful modern cities, towns and hotels interspersed with 8,000-year-old antiquities sites. We saw the Blue Mosque and the Haiya Sophia Mosque. The spice market, the underground water cistern, and the Grand Bazaar the first day. 7,000 mosques in Istanbul itself and always one or two wherever there are houses. Turkey is 99.5% Muslim but only about 40% actually practising. We visited Gallipoli and educated the rest of the bus about our Anzac Day as we were the only two Aussies amongst mostly Americans and they had never heard of it. Huge area, now a National Park and really well kept. Our guide is the most knowledgeable, personable, intelligent and interesting man we are lucky enough to have.

We are in the city of Konya today in central Turkey after leaving the hot spa region around Pamukkule yesterday. It is very conservative and the women here all cover their heads, which is unusual in the rest of the country. It is a large and beautiful city, wide streets, trams, lots of public gardens and fountains and thousands of apartment blocks of around eight stories high. We have seen ancient Roman sites, Greek sites, and ones a lot older than either. We've travelled along the coast where Jason and the Argonauts sailed looking for the Golden Fleece. The city of Troy, Ephesus, where Paul nearly lost his life, so he escaped and then wrote a letter to the Ephesians and so many other sites mentioned in the Bible. We've been to places the apostle John preached and the house where they believe Mary lived after the crucifixion. Today we visited the Mosque where the Suffi sect of Islam was born.

Tomorrow we will be visiting a place on the Old Silk Road where the camel caravans left from and we'll see the Whirling Dervishes at night. Then the next day we will be hot air ballooning over Cappadocia and then exploring their underground towns and churches. The early Christians dug into the anthill like mountains and lived along with their livestock to escape persecution.

Only a few more days after that and we'll be back enduring 30 hours on planes and in airports to get home. Recommend this tour to anyone. We've had 5-star hotels, comfortable coach and breakfast and dinner included every day.
