Project Background:	<p>Senegal is country that suffers from extreme poverty and food insecurity in general. The Cassamance Region is additionally unstable due to a low-level but enduring civil conflict between the Senegalese government and a local separatist group. This means that emigration from the area is very high as local young people with the ability to leave do so to try to find jobs in Europe.</p> <p>To combat this trend, the Senegal YMCA has been working for over 30 years, to boost employment and income for young people and their families, especially those living in rural areas in conflict.</p>			
Project Activities:	<p>After completing training at Gaston Berger University in St. Louis, Senegal, graduates will be deployed to Ziguinchor to provide instruction at the planned Incubation Centre, where all relevant agricultural equipment and materials will be available for student practice. In addition to the confirmed partnership with Medicor, this project will work with the Agricultural Department of the Assane Seck University in Ziguinchor; PRODAC (Programme des Domaines Agricoles Communautaires), a government programme focusing on encouraging youth entrepreneurship and employment; and two national NGOs with experience working with young people living with disabilities (Handicap International, and the National Centre for Action against Mines in Senegal).</p>			
Beneficiaries:	Young men and women equally – 10% of those, persons living with disabilities.

Project Sustainability:	<p>Construction of the Incubation Centre is estimated at 12 -18 months, after which it will be sustained by income from produce sold from the centre, donations of past programme beneficiaries and sponsors. Mayors of the local municipalities have committed to support the development of agricultural businesses in their locations and agreements to this effect have been signed. In addition, young people will have access to finance through Crédit Mutuel Senegal to help develop their businesses.</p>

In 2016 the Cambodia YMCA established its Youth Empowerment programme and Youth Institute to promote healthy living and provide leadership training for young people in slum areas where children are particularly vulnerable, subject to abuse and generally unsafe living conditions. Children from these communities often leave their homes early, trying to make their own ways on the street and typically involved in drugs.																															
Project Activities:	The project has two primary goals: 1. Improve Education and Career Opportunities, 2. Improve Health and Social Welfare. Within this framework the following activities are planned: an after-school programme for tutoring; photography and graphic design training; decision-making and leadership skills workshops; education on establishing a healthy living routine; recreation activities.

The Greater Grand Rapids YMCA “My Career, My Opportunity” has already been running for two years as a way to support struggling students and combat summer learning loss.			
Project Activities:	<p>There are four elements to the proposed project as follows.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Career orientation with workplace tours, guest lectures, etc. Participants will also choose to pursue one of three certifications (Lifeguard, Childcare, ServSafe) during the programme period 2. Math skills improvement by focusing on real world applications, such as student loan management 3. Community engagement and volunteerism with students being asked to design and implement a service project in their community 4. Community building and outdoor education by trips to the neighbouring countryside, which poorer city children have never seen.
