It is a privilege for me to bestow the Harry M. Ballantyne Award upon Alan Wallington of the Y's Men's Club of Kingswood in Region Central Southern Europe.

To friends and those who know him in our organisation, Alan Wallington is simply «Wally», and there is no person more dedicated to Y's Men International than he. His contributions to our movement have been exceptional, never ending, and growing year by year. He has served in many leadership positions, but perhaps his biggest accomplishment is the 100% he gives to Y's Men in his daily life – selflessly with no thought to power or glory. Through nearly three decades we have learned from Wally what it means to be a YMI club member, that is someone who is humble, modest, service minded. While he could have easily been International President, Wally has chosen to be a quiet but constant supporter, part of our foundation rather than a crowning ornament.

Alan has been a driving force behind many successful Area Conventions and Area Councils, always kind and always available with good ideas, advice or just an ear to listen. The special waistcoat that he often wears showcasing the various pins of Y's Men is like a trademark for our organisation. He has been particularly instrumental in the planning of the Regional Conferences and Area Conventions held in his hometown of Bristol. (It was during one of these conferences, that he met his second wife, Olya, a member of a Russian affiliated club.)

Before joining Y's Men International Wally was part of the Scouts Movement. When he joined the Y's Men's Club of Kingswood in 1978 our gain was the Scout Movement's loss as he immediately threw himself into the club's activities, showing his prodigious commitment and energy from the very beginning. It wasn't long before he was joining various committees and occupying a seat on the Board of Governors. Wally has held most of the senior positions in his club. He has been president a number of times and is always a willing volunteer when secretarial duties are required. He has been responsible for the club bulletin, The Youngster, for many years. He has also held numerous international positions, including International Council Member. He is currently completing two years as Regional Director of Central Southern Europe where he has pursued extension in Italy, Greece and Portugal. He was instrumental in chartering the Zwolle club in 2019, effectively reactivating the Netherlands as country within YMI. He was editor of our international magazine for more than ten years. As the current editor for IP NEWS, he has managed to set a standard that keeps people looking forward to the next issue and successfully coordinates its translation into 11 languages. His work over the last four years as a member of the Manual Review Committee only further showcases him as a YMI powerhouse. From the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic he creatively organised weekly Zoom meetings mainly for the local club members, but also with regular contributors from Germany, France, Australia, Canada and Japan.

If anyone is due an award recognising contribution to YMI in all its forms, it is Alan Wallington. He has demonstrated the tenet that the only Y's Man is an active one in spades.
