Therefore, let us endure as our Lord Jesus Christ endured. Let us not be afraid of obstacles, nor give in to weakness – for our victory and salvation are within reach!

The Cross is the sign of salvation and victory. In our liturgy, we make the Sign of the Cross often, so that we may be sanctified and reminded that without Christ's redemption through His death on the Cross, there is no salvation. The Cross reminds us that it is there we received the forgiveness of all our human sins throughout the course of our lives.

We thank you, Lord, for your great love for us, for loving us so deeply, and for inviting us to eternal life in your heavenly kingdom with you!
