2019 TRADE MILL & NATIVE HERITAGE DAYS ART/CRAFT VENDORS

Rules and Regulations

- 1. Any vendor not abiding by the Trade Mill & Native Heritage Days Rules and Regulations may be asked to leave the event and will forfeit his or her booth space.
- 2. The event will be held rain or shine. Festival hours are 9am to 5pm on Saturday and 12pm to 5pm on Sunday. Setup dates and times are Friday 12pm 6pm, and Saturday 7am 8:30am. There will be no early closing of booths either day. No refunds will be given for any reason.
- 3. Each booth is 10 ft. wide x 10 ft. deep. A corner space is defined as a 10'x10' space that has customer walk-up access to the front and at least one side for display and sale of merchandise. It is important that these boundaries be observed when placing your tent to respect neighbors' rental spaces and to ensure emergency and garbage collection vehicles are able to pass through. All exhibitors must provide their own tents, shelving, tables, and chairs. All displays and supplies must stay within the 10'x10' booth space. No boxes, storage containers, or displays are allowed behind, beside, or in front of your booth at any time. Strict adherence to these rules will be enforced.
- 4. Vendors may show and sell only items handcrafted by themselves and approved for sale at this show by the Arts/Crafts Committee. Vendors may not show or sell kit-made items, manufactured items, items made by others, items bought or consigned for resale, or "flea market" items. If these types of items are offered for sale in your booth, you will be asked to remove them. Failure to do so will result in dismissal from this event without booth fee refund.
- 5. Reasonable security will be provided, but the Trade Community Center, nor their representatives, will be responsible or liable for loss, damage, or injury.
- 6. All vendors must staff their own booths. The event coordinators cannot staff booths for restroom and/or food breaks.
- 7. It is the Arts/Crafts Committee's right to deny any participant, even if they have participated in past years.
- 8. You will be placed in a booth at the committees' discretion, however, very effort will be made to accommodate special needs.
- 9. All vendors are responsible for the collection and reporting of Tennessee Sales Tax.
- 10. There will be a \$25.00 Returned Check Fee for all returned checks.
