<u>How Do I Get My Dog To Stick?</u> - This session will work on building a stronger odor obedience for your dog. This can make reading your dog a little easier and take less stress off of you as a handler to catch those "subtle signs".

<u>The Independent Searcher: Starter Level</u> - This session will work with dogs just starting in the sport (from just starting to competing in AKC advanced, NW1, or equivalent). The focus will be to build independence and confidence away from the handler to solve odor problems and indicate the source location without the help of the handler.

Day 1 Afternoon Topics: 1:00-4:30

<u>Changes of Behavior</u> (COBs) - Suitable for any level

<u>Leash Handling and Body Pressure</u> - learn how you can influence and become an important teammate to your dog's searching while maintaining their independent search style! You will be able to learn how to apply or release pressure to help support your dog through tricky searches. Your leash is an important tool! You will be able to learn how you can use it not just as a tether to your dog.

Day 2 Morning Topics: 8:30-12:00

<u>Building Drive and Focus</u> - Novice/Advanced AKC and UKC, C-WAGS Levels 1 and 2, NACSW NW1 and 2

<u>Scent Puzzles</u> - This session will focus on how to set up a scent puzzle to target a specific skill. You will learn more about airflow and how you can use it to your advantage while setting up a search at home.

Day 2 Afternoon Topics: 1:00-4:30

<u>Cleaning up your alerts</u> - build confidence in your dog's communication of odor source to you! Using simple scent puzzles we will build your dog's trust in you that they will be paid at source. As a result, your dog's alert will become clearer and easier to read.
