100 MILE FESTIVAL OF THE ARTS MISSION STATEMENT

To promote the cultivation of music and the performing arts in their various forms as a pleasing and beneficial auxiliary to community life in 100 Mile House and the surrounding areas.

B.C. PROVINCIAL COMPETITIONS

100 Mile Festival of the Arts is a member of Performing Arts B.C. and 100 Mile and District Arts Council. Our adjudicators may recommend competitors at the Junior, Intermediate and Senior levels of each discipline to compete at the Provincial Competitions organized by Performing Arts B.C. The ultimate selection of competitors and merited participants is the sole responsibility of the adjudicators who are briefed and knowledgeable of provincial standards and requirements. Adjudicators have the interests of the students in mind when they do not recommend participants to compete in a discipline despite the existence of qualifying marks.

On the written recommendation of the adjudicator, each local festival may send to the Provincial competition one participant at each level of each discipline. The participant must have received a mark of 85% or over in all selections to be performed at the Provincial level. The adjudicator may also select certain students to attend as merited participants.

Chosen participants are urged to attend the provincial competition for the experience of listening and learning, even if they feel they have no chance of winning. Remember: winning is not the goal in any festival—the objective is to pace one another on the road to excellence.

Performing Arts BC will organize and conduct the 2019 Provincial Competition in Chilliwack from May 26 – 30. For more information or to see the syllabus for the Provincial Performing Arts Festival visit their website at www.performingartsbc.ca. or http://www.100milefestivalofthearts.ca/

It is the responsibility of each Provincial Festival entrant to read and comply with all rules governing the Provincial Festival.

CERTIFICATES

Marks are not announced after each performance however, participants receive a certificate for each class entered. Certificates are awarded based on the following adjudication "marks":

90% & higher Platinum Certificate 85% - 89% Gold Certificate 80% - 84% Silver Certificate 79% & lower Bronze Certificate

AWARDS

All awards are chosen by the adjudicators. The Festival Committee reserves the right to withhold any award in any year if, in the opinion of the adjudicator, a suitable standard has not been attained. From the pool of all award winners, the adjudicators select performers and performances for the Awards and Showcase Concert. For this celebration, consideration of content appropriate for a general audience may be applied. Awards and their sponsors are subject to change from year to year. Awards sponsored by the 100 Mile Festival of the Arts are available to be sponsored privately. To enquire about sponsoring an award, please contact the Festival Committee. Deborah has been involved in Speech Arts since the age of seven, when she began "elocution" lessons in Victoria, BC with Wilfrid Ord at the "Victoria School of Expression". She has an Education certificate from UVIC, an associate's diploma in Speech and Drama from Mount Royal College, Calgary, and has been designated a Speech and Drama Specialist by Royal Conservatory. Deborah taught public school for more than ten years before turning her attention to speech arts and drama as a private teacher. For 25 years, she ran a speech and drama studio in Prince George, BC, coaching up to 100 students a year. She also enjoyed running a 'Production Camp' every summer where students presented fairy tale and Shakespeare plays to enthusiastic audiences. Since relocating to Penticton, she has stayed active, introducing a new group of young students to the joys of speech arts. Ms. McGladdery has adjudicated for many festivals in Canada, is a member of the Canadian Music Festival Adjudicators' Association and works as a Speech Arts examiner for Royal Conservatory.

John White

John White served as President of the British Columbia Music Educators' Association, the British Columbia Choral Federation, the British Columbia Administrators of Arts Education, the Pacific Coast Music Festivals Association, and Art Starts in Schools. He is a Past Chairman of MusicFest Canada: Canadian Concert Band Festival.

Mr. White served on the Board of Directors for the Canadian Music Educators' Association, the Western Canada Theatre Company, the British Columbia Festival of the Arts, was Vice President of the BC Band Association and just recently finished seven years on the Board and a three-year term as Vice Chair of the Coalition for Music Education in Canada.

Currently, John is Chair of the BC Choral Federation's Willan Council and Vice Chair of the Michael J. Fox Theatre Society. He also serves as Music Director for the New Westminster and District Band Society – now celebrating its 83rd year of continuous operation.

Mr. White served as a Director of the British Columbia Music Educators' Association Provincial Honour Band on three separate occasions, the Saskatchewan Provincial Honour Band and has many years experience as a performing musician. He has worked extensively as an adjudicator, clinician and guest conductor throughout British Columbia, Yukon, Alberta, Saskatchewan and Ontario. He also served as a judge for Canada's Juno Awards on several occasions.

During his career as an educator, John White worked in Whitehorse, Yukon, and in British Columbia's Langley, Coquitlam and Burnaby school districts. Now retired, Mr. White finished his career after serving twenty-one years as a Director of Instruction for School District 41 Burnaby.

Holly Duff

Holly received her Bachelor of Music in piano performance from the University of Western Ontario and an Associate of the Victoria Conservatory of Music in Piano Pedagogy. Her most inspiring musical mentors have been Dr. Robin Wood of Victoria and Robert Rogers of UBC.

Established in 1993, Holly is a founding director, administrator and performing pianist with *West Coast Chamber Music*, one of the foremost classical concert series in Vancouver. Through the series, she has had an interest in promoting the work of woman composers. She has also had a lifelong passion for storytelling which she has combined with music on stage in children's concerts performed across the lower mainland.
