100 MILE FESTIVAL OF THE ARTS MISSION STATEMENT

To promote the cultivation of music and the performing arts in their various forms as a pleasing and beneficial auxiliary to community life in 100 Mile House and the surrounding areas.

B.C. PROVINCIAL COMPETITIONS

100 Mile Festival of the Arts is a member of Performing Arts B.C. and 100 Mile and District Arts Council. Our adjudicators may recommend competitors at the Junior, Intermediate and Senior levels of each discipline to compete at the Provincial Competitions organized by Performing Arts B.C. The ultimate selection of competitors and merited participants is the sole responsibility of the adjudicators who are briefed and knowledgeable of provincial standards and requirements. Adjudicators have the interests of the students in mind when they do not recommend participants to compete in a discipline despite the existence of qualifying marks.

On the written recommendation of the adjudicator, each local festival may send to the Provincial competition one participant at each level of each discipline. The participant must have received a mark of 85% or over in all selections to be performed at the Provincial level. The adjudicator may also select certain students to attend as merited participants.

Chosen participants are urged to attend the provincial competition for the experience of listening and learning, even if they feel they have no chance of winning. Remember: winning is not the goal in any festival—the objective is to pace one another on the road to excellence.

Performing Arts BC will organize and conduct the 2023 Provincial Competition in Penticton, BC from May 28th to June 1^{st.} For more information and to view the syllabus for the Provincial Performing Arts Festival visit their website at <u>www.performingartsbc.ca</u>. or <u>http://www.100milefestivalofthearts.ca/</u>

It is the responsibility of each Provincial Festival entrant to read and comply with all rules governing the Provincial Festival.

CERTIFICATES

Marks are not announced after each performance however, participants receive a certificate for each class entered. Certificates are awarded based on the following adjudication "marks":

90% & higher 85% - 89% 80% - 84% 79% & lower Platinum Certificate Gold Certificate Silver Certificate Bronze Certificate

AWARDS

All awards are chosen by the adjudicators. The Festival Committee reserves the right to withhold any award in any year if, in the opinion of the adjudicator, a suitable standard has not been attained. From the pool of all award winners, the adjudicators select performers and performances for the Awards and Showcase Concert. For this celebration, consideration of content appropriate for a general audience may be applied. Awards and their sponsors are subject to change from year to year. Awards sponsored by the 100 Mile Festival of the Arts are available to be sponsored privately. To enquire about sponsoring an award, please contact the Festival Committee. PIANO ADJUDICATOR Alan Crane



Alan Crane holds a Bachelor of Music from the University of Western Ontario and a Master of Music in Piano Performance from the University of British Columbia. For over 35 years, he has been teaching a full class of students ranging from young beginners to pre-professional young musicians to adults. Many of Alan's students have gone on to pursue careers in music.

In addition to being on the faculty of the Vancouver Symphony Orchestra School of Music where he recently completed a term as Chair of the Piano Department, Mr. Crane teaches part time at the Langley Community Music School where he served for many years as Co-ordinator of the Piano Program.

As well as teaching, Aan Crane is an active performer. He is a founding director and pianist with the popular Vancouver concert series West Coast Chamber Music, is a much sought after accompanist and has presented numerous solo recitals in Canada and the U.K. He is also active as a festival adjudicator and is a member of the Canadian Music Festival Adjudicators Association and the College of Examiners of the Royal Conservatory of Music.

Gaye-Lynn Kern

Gaye-Lynn Kern is a Performer, Teacher and Clinician. Her areas of specialization are Voice (Solo and Choral), Music Theatre, Drama and Speech Arts. She has a Master of Music (Voice) & a Post Graduate Diploma from the *Guildhall School of Music and Drama*, London, UK. Other post-graduate studies include the *Mozart Opera Studies Institute* and the *Pacific Voice Conference*.

Ms. Kern has performed over twenty-eight leading roles in opera (*The Medium, Hansel* and Gretel, *The Magic Flute*), operetta (*The Mikado, H.M.S. Pinafore*), Music Theatre (*The* Sound of Music, My Fair Lady) and plays (*Dancing at Lughnasa, Murder at the Howard* Johnsons). Her thirty-four directorial credits include Anne of Green Gables, *The Boyfriend,* Grease, Li'l Abner, Oliver! The Real Inspector Hound, Blithe Spirit and Nunsense. At the International Saxophone Conference 2000 in Montreal, Ms. Kern premiered Songs of Childhood.

Ms. Kern has enjoyed adjudicating at over 172 Music Festivals in Western Canada since 1990. She was the Past President of the Saskatoon Music Festival and Provincial Rep. for the CMFAA.

Twelve of her forty years of Vocal Pedagogy have been at universities and colleges where she taught for both Music and Drama Departments and her students are frequent festival scholarship winners at both local and provincial levels. Her students ranged in age from 4 years (pre-kindergarten) to 90 years (Elderhostel). Ms. Kern coaches professionals in a wide variety of careers and is the Music Director at St. Matthew's Anglican Church.

Gaye-Lynn Kern has performed professionally in England, Europe, the United States, and Canada. She performed in Improv Theatre and currently on the Concert Stage as a soloist and as a member of *The Gala Trio*. Gaye-Lynn resides in Saskatoon with her husband, Gordon Grant and four feline companions: Magnolia, Charlotte, Flynn and Louie.

INSTURMENTAL ADJUDICATOR - Bob Rebagliati



Bob Rebagliati is a native of B.C., currently residing in Maple Ridge with his wife Maggie, where he is a freelance music educator, guest conductor, pianist and percussionist/drummer. He holds a Bachelor of Music Degree, Teaching Certificate from U.B.C. and a Master of Music Degree from Western Washington University. He currently writes curriculum in the areas of jazz rhythm section, jazz rehearsal techniques, jazz improvisation and concert band percussion.

For 33 years in the North Vancouver School District, Bob has directed many award winning junior and senior high school ensembles in both concert band and jazz areas. His Secondary School Jazz Ensembles have won many awards from 1976 to 1986 when the Hansworth Junior and Senior Jazz Ensembles won the highest honour in the country – the gold award – first place in their classes. Again in 1988, placed first and in 2002 the Handsworth Senior Concert Band percussion section was awarded the Zildjian Percussion Scholarship in recognition of "Excellence in the Art of Percussion". In 2004, his composition "Tonal Gesture" for concert band was premiered in Vancouver.

Mr. Rebagliati has travelled through B.C., Saskatchewan and Ontario as a music festival adjudicator and workshop leader, guest conductor and clinician. He is well known for sessions covering concert percussion, jazz rhythm section, jazz interpretation, improvisation and rehearsal techniques.

Throughout his career, Bob has been honoured with many awards including the first recipient of the Professional Educator Award, Distinguished Citizen Award, Canada 125 Medal awarded by Mary Collins, MP, North Vancouver, Music Educators' Award of Excellence, High school Jazz Program of the Year and Leadership in Music Education Award "for many years of outstanding contributions to the music education community" from the Coalition for Music Education in B.C.

In June, 2004, Bob's Senior Jazz Ensemble was the first school band chosen to participate in the Vancouver International Jazz Festival Student intensive. He has directed many other bands over the years, including North Vancouver Youth Band, the Metro Vancouver Firefighters Band and the Vancouver Symphony Orchestra School of Music Big Band.

Mr. Rebagliati is Vice Chairman of Instrumental Jazz for MusicFest Canada and is responsible for the auditioning of members of the ConnSelmer Centerstage Big Band and MusicFest Canada jazz scholarships.
