Sarah Luker – asks how schools are using tech to help students tracking steps in enrollment process to inform them where they are at. She is looking for a "one stop shop."

- NMC uses a Recruit to track the pre-enrollment checklist. Add required and recommend items to a checklist for students – different student types have a different checklist.
- Kellogg uses a microsite via Element 451 for a student checklist. BUT it is a self-check list that students must complete. They are currently doing a major overhaul of steps to enroll though. Hoping that when they move to SaaS that they might be able to improve this.
- OCC working to use CRM Advise for a checklist as it has connectivity with Colleague where enrollment steps are managed.

Niko Kanagawa working to provide a mechanism for MCCAD members to record basic info on their college operations (CRM's used, Orientation systems, etc) that can be of use to members.

Niko Kanagawa asked about systems being used for schools to validate ID's (to protect against fraud).

- Most schools reported that fake ID's have been getting better and better, and therefore more difficult to find.
- o NMC reported that they have started to see real official transcripts provided by fraudulent student applicants. The 'fraudsters' have stolen enough info needed to make vali parchment transcript requests. NMC requires students to come in-person when there is something of question with their app. NMC has a staff member with Lexus Nexus access that is a good tool for investigation.
