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INTRODUCTION

Most Christians want to strengthen their faith, to live a good life, and help their loved ones. Studying the Bible, or at least key Bible verses, might help. Many Christians feel like they don't have time to study the Bible, or even read it. In more than 10 years of studying the Bible I have put together what I believe are key Bible verses on important topics. This publication is meant to help people memorize important verses that help strengthen their faith, to better understand the world we live in, and hopefully get them interested in reading the Bible. This book is not meant to replace advice from people ordained in the Christian religion, or any certified expert advice. What makes this book worth reading? Other than this Introduction, 10 Key Christian Beliefs, and the Closing Thoughts, this book has little influence from my personal beliefs. Most of this book organizes important Bible verses in ways that reveal a biblical view about the world we live in. These verses and the way they are structured have helped me to better examine and improve my life, and help other people by sharing key verses. I believe this book can help many more people. Maybe you? There is only one way to find out.

All respectable historians believe the Bible is a credible historical document and that Jesus of Nazareth was a real human. Many historians just do not believe the Bible is from God and Jesus is the Son of God. The Bible claims over 1,000 times that it is from God, if you search a digital Bible for phrases like, "the LORD said," "said the LORD," "saith the LORD" (KJV), "God said," and "the word of the LORD." Most books in the New Testament of the Bible were written by eyewitnesses of the life of Jesus, or had personally experienced Jesus (like Paul). Not only did Jesus claim to be the Son of God (Jn 6:38-40 and 10:36-38), but His disciples claimed it (Mk 1:1), God (Mk 1:11), an angel (Lk 1:35), and demons Jesus rebuked (Mt 8:29 and 5:5-7). To me, Christianity is more about a relationship and fellowship with God and Jesus, through the Holy Spirit. I consider relationship with Jesus as believing in Him as my Lord and savior, and fellowship as regularly reading Bible verses and praying, and listening or feeling, for responses.

I believe guarantees in life including daily changes, opportunities, challenges, and choices. New knowledge can help us better manage our opportunities and challenges, and make better choices. I believe some of our greatest opportunities are personal and spiritual growth. I believe some of our biggest challenges are desires of the flesh (Gal 5:16-21). Every day we have opportunities and challenges, as our desires of the flesh are against the desires of the Spirit. I also believe that we are living in a spiritual war on earth, but it is set in a larger love story, with God's forgiveness of our sins, through Jesus (Jn 3:16, Ro 5:19, and 8:38-39). It seems that our spiritual adversaries (Eph 6:12) strategy is to steal, kill, and destroy (Jn 10:10). I believe they mainly focus on stealing our fruit of the Spirit (Gal 5:22-23), fellowship, and freedom. Then they attempt to kill the body, and finally, they attempt to destroy legacies people build. Our spiritual adversary's tactics could be considered temptations (Gen 3:1-6, Mt 4:1-11), lies (Jn 8:44), discouragement (2 Cor 4:4), deceptions and accusations (Rev 12:9-10). Jesus warned us that we will have trouble in the world, but with courage, we can still have peace and joy in Him (Jn 16:33). Greater is the Holy Spirit in you than you in the world (1 Jn 4:4).

It seems that technology, specifically the internet, has increased our opportunities and challenges, and our ability to engage in our desires of the flesh or the desires of the Spirit, and the deciding factors are often our standards and how we manage our environment. We have our immediate environment where we live, which we have more influence over, and there is our larger community environment, which we have less influence over. I have found it helpful to post some of my favorite Bible verses around my home. I have also found it helpful to download a digital Bible and the Key Bible Verses book, to have them as a quick reference for key topics.

It seems there are some similarities in how the early Christian church grew despite oppression, and how the United States of America won its independence and grew to be the most powerful nation in the world. I believe some key principles included the values of truth, life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness, along with faith in God (reference the Declaration of Independence). It seems they also valued a sense of responsibility, and a pioneering spirit, that was open to new ideas, truthful, and courageous. America's founders believed strongly in having checks and balances on government power, and they also believed in personal growth and self-education. Ben Franklin cofounded the first public library, in hopes that it would help increase the knowledge of anyone who desired to learn and grow.

There are many smart people who could disagree with many parts of this book, as it takes faith to believe in God, and to not believe in God. However, there is wisdom in this book that can be considered as self-evident truths, as people will understand they have experienced them. What really matters most is our personal beliefs that justify or compel our words and actions, because after our life is done on this earth we will be held accountable and judged for all our words and actions, and we will not be able to call on any "witness" to defend us. The good news is that God knows all, and is righteous and not partial. If you are a Christian, this book can help strengthen your faith and empower you with wisdom to live a better life. This book is not intended to push Christianity on anyone, I feel that it is important that all people be given the respect to be allowed to make their own choices, without manipulation. This was a major reason many people first came to America, they were fleeing from oppression, and pursuing freedom, including religious freedom. If you dare to read the entire Bible for the first time, I recommend a study Bible, and starting with either the New Testament, or the book of Proverbs then the New Testament, followed by the rest of the Old Testament.



10 KEY CHRISTIAN BELIEFS

God is Real: Science claims that our universe is expanding, which means there was a point, back in time, when it came into existence from nothing... God spoke the world into existence (Genesis 1). Our universe has many natural laws that are fine-tuned, like gravity, and other cosmological constants that are evidence of intelligent design. Consider that the earth is the perfect distance from the sun to support advanced life forms, and it is placed in the Milky Way Galaxy to be able to study the universe... The heavens declare the glory of God and the sky shows His handywork (Psalm 19:1). Check the Hubble telescope photos online. Quantum Physics has some evidence of a spiritual world. Consider the quantum theories of unpredictability, tunneling, entanglement, decoherence, and the unified field.

The Bible is God's Word: Respectable historians do not disclaim the credibility of the Bible as a historical document. When compared to other historical documents, the Bible is accurate and very admired, copied and shared often... All Scripture is inspired by God and is profitable for doctrine, reproof, correction, and instruction in righteousness (2 Tim 3:16). Search a digital King James Bible for phrases "the LORD said," "saith the LORD," "said the LORD," "God said," and "the word of the LORD," and you will find more than 1,000 verses.

Jesus is the Son of God: No respectable historian denies the life of Jesus, some only dispute whether Jesus is truly the Son of God. The Old Testament has many prophecies of Jesus (Isa 7:14 / Mt 1:23; Mic 5:2 / Lk 2:4-7; Isa 53:3 / Jn 1:11; Ps 22:16 / Mt 27:35; Isa 53:12 / Mk 15:27). Jesus declared He is the Son of God (Jn 10:36-38 and 17:1). Just as important, the Bible has many key characters who claimed Jesus is the Son of God including God (Mt 3:17, 17:5; Mk 1:11 and 9:7), an angel (Lk 1:35), John the Baptist (Jn 1:29), disciples of Jesus (Mk 1:1 and Jn 1:49), demons Jesus rebuked (Mt 8:29; Mk 3:11 and 5:7; Lk 4:41 and 8:28), and a Centurion at the crucifixion of Jesus, "Truly this man was the Son of God" (Mk 15:39). It seems the devil knew Jesus is the Son of God, but unlike the demons Jesus rebuked, he phrased it as a question (Mt 4:3 and 4:6, and Lk 4:3 and 4:9), to try and plant doubt in His identity, as the devil does with people to this day. New Testament authors include brothers of Jesus, eyewitnesses to the life of Jesus, the Apostle Paul, or a writer for one of them. Jesus had a talk with Paul and convinced him to stop persecuting disciples. Paul went on to write most of the New Testament.

The Holy Spirit is Our Helper: After Jesus fulfilled His destiny to be the final sacrifice for us (Ro 5:19), He fulfilled the Old Covenant (Mt 5:17) and ascended to heaven (Mk 16:19), so we could receive the Holy Spirit, to teach us (Jn 14:26) and help us (Jn 16:7).

We Are made in God's Image: God created man and woman in His image (Gen 1:26) as a spirit, with a soul, in a body (1 Thess 5:23), with a spirit not of fear but of power, love, and a sound mind (2 Tim 1:7), which fuels our inner worker/warrior, lover, and thinker. We are to glorify God (1 Cor 6:20), love God, and love people (Mt 22:37-39). God spoke the world into existence (Gen 1), and we have the power of death and life in our words (Pro 18:21). Evolution is based on survival of the fittest, however, it claims all advanced life forms evolved from a simple self-replicating organism. Going from self-replicating to a male and female who need each other to reproduce, is not survival of the fittest. Over two thousand years ago, well before the microscope, Moses wrote that God made humans from dust of the earth and His breath of life (Genesis 2:7). Modern science has proven that humans are made from natural elements found on earth, mostly oxygen, carbon, hydrogen, nitrogen, and calcium. Unfortunately, Adam and Eve's free will introduced sin into the world (Gen 3).

We Have Free Will: Not only are we made in God's image, He gave us dominion over the earth (Gen 1:27-28), and we have the Holy Spirit to help us and guide us. But, our desires of the flesh are against the Spirit, including lust, anger, idolatry, and envy (Gal 5:17-23). We have spiritual adversaries (Eph 6:12 and 1 Pt 5:8) who stir up our desires of the flesh, tempt us (Gen 3:1-7, Mt 4:1-11), lie (Jn 8:44), deceive, and accuse (Rev 12:9-10). We have power to resist our flesh and adversaries (Gal 5:16, Job, Jas 4:7). Fear not who can kill the body but not the soul (Mt 10:28). God can do anything, but He gave humans power on earth (Gen 1:28). Human sin is why God sent the great flood (Gen 6:12-13). We are not our emotions and thoughts, we are what we do with them (Gal 5:16-26, Ro 12:2).

God Offers Us Salvation Through Jesus as a Gift of Grace: Everyone is a sinner (Ro 3:23) and God is not partial (Ro 2:11). God is over all, through all, and in all (Eph 4:6). By grace you are saved, through faith, not your doing, it is the gift of God (Eph 2:8). God sent Jesus to fulfill the law for us (Mt 5:17). God so loved the world that He gave His only Son, and who believes in Him will have eternal life (Jn 3:16). Christians are to live in the new way of the Spirit not in the old way of the letter (Ro 7:6). Repent (Mk 1:15), confess your sins (1 Jn 1:9), and be slow to anger (Pro 14:29). Jesus gives us a better covenant (Hb 8:6). No one is justified by the law, but by faith in Jesus (Gal 2:16). Declare Jesus is Lord and believe He was resurrected, and you will be saved (Ro 10:9). People from all nations will be in heaven (Rev 7:9).

We Are to Be More Like Jesus and Share the Good News of the Gospel: We are called into fellowship with Jesus (1 Cor 1:9), sanctification by the Spirit, and belief in truth (2 Thess 2:13), and to love (Mt 22:37-40), pray (Eph 6:18), praise God (Ps 117), worship God (Lk 4:8), fellowship with people (1 Jn 1:7, Pro 27:17), and forgive (Lk 17:3-4, Eph 4:32). Put on the armor of God (Eph 6:14-17), guard your heart (Pro 4:23, Pro 21:2), thoughts (2 Cor 10:5, Ro 8:5-6, 12:2), words (Pro 18:21, Mt 12:36), and body (Lk 22:36). Many Bible stories are warnings about sinful human nature, and about overcoming it. We will have challenges in the world, but Jesus overcame the world (Jn 16:33). Nothing can separate us from the love of God through Christ Jesus our Lord (Ro 8:37-39). Go into all the world and proclaim the Gospel (Mk 16:15). The Old Testament is about the law, and the New Testament is about love (Jn 1:17, 3:16, Ro 8:38-39).

We Are to Love God and Love People: Love God and love people as yourself (Mt 22:37-40). Love God and all things work out (Ro 8:28). Love casts out fear. We love because God first loved us (1 Jn 4:18-19). Love endures and is kind, it doesn't envy, brag, behave badly, or think evil, it's not arrogant, selfish, or easily angered, but rejoices in truth (1 Cor 13:4). The greatest is love (1 Cor 13:13).

We Are Designed as Creators to Help People and Live a Good Life: We are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works that God ordained for us (Eph 2:10). We have specific gifts, and a calling, to help each other (Eph 4:11-16, 1 Pt 4:10, 1 Cor 7:17). Do to people as you would have done to you (Mt 7:12). The wise seek knowledge (Pro 18:15) and are careful, but the foolish are careless (Pro 14:16). *Be humble (1 Pt 5:6), honest (Pro 6:16-19), and helpful (Gal 6:2). Do not be conformed to the world but renew your mind (Ro 12:2), think (Php 4:8) carefully (2 Cor 10:5), be diligent (Pro 10:4 and 21:5), content (Php 4:11, 1 Tim 6:10), and be united (1 Cor 1:10, 1 Pt 3:8). Share the Gospel (Mk 16:15), teach people, and baptize them in the name of the Father, Son, and the Holy Spirit (Mt 28:19). Do not be weary, you will reap in due season (Gal 6:9). Be ready to humbly explain the reason for your hope (1 Pt 3:15).*



25 KEY BIBLE CHARACTERS AND STORY HIGHLIGHTS

Like us, key characters in the Bible had strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, challenges, and the same human nature.

Adam and Eve: Adam was created by God from the dust of the earth and breathed life into him. God placed Adam in the Garden of Eden where He created Eve. The serpent manipulated Eve's ego, as Adam passively watched nearby, and they ate the forbidden fruit, which unleashed sin into the world. They had a troubled child who committed a terrible sin because of envy and anger. Genesis 1:26...

Noah: Built the Ark that saved his family and animals from the great flood, that God sent because of so much human corruption. God created the rainbow as a sign of His promise that He would never flood the earth again. He liked wine. Genesis 5:29...

Abram/Abraham: Was a faithful and successful man with family challenges. He had a tough conversation with his nephew, Lot, to seek peace between their people. Later, Abraham risked all, in a battle to save Lot. His wife Sarah struggled to conceive, and told Abraham to have a child with her maid, Hagar. When Hagar gave birth to Ishmael she had contempt for Sarah, which led Sarah to deal harshly with her. Hagar fled, but came back. Sarah finally gave birth to Isaac. God blessed both children. Abraham was tested by God. Genesis 11:27...

Jacob/Israel: Was a quiet man who stayed with the tents. His jealousy of his brother Esau (a skilled hunter) made Esau want to kill him, but their mom intervened. Jacob deceived his father, Isaac, and was later deceived by his father-in-law, Laban. Jacob served Laban for many years and grew their wealth over time. Jacob wrestled with God, and reconciled with Esau. Genesis 25:26...

Joseph: Was the favored younger son of Jacob. Joseph gave his father a bad report of his brothers, and told his family of a dream where they bowed to him. Most of his brothers hated him, and sold him as a slave to live in Egypt. Joseph was wrongfully imprisoned for sexual assault. His humility, honesty, and diligence got him released, and he became a high government official. A famine came over the land and Joseph's brothers came to buy food, and they bowed to Joseph, and later reconciled, and moved to be with him. Genesis 30:24...

Moses: Orphaned as a child and adopted by the Queen of Egypt, and learned the ways of the Egyptian royal family, during the time the Jewish people were enslaved by Egypt. Moses killed an Egyptian and fled. He reluctantly answered the call from God to go back and convince the Pharaoh of Egypt to free the Jewish people. He grew his faith as he served. He led his people out of Egypt and through the wilderness, and parted the Red Sea, and received the Ten Commandments. Exodus... Listed in the Bible "Hall of Fame" (Heb 11).

Deborah: A wife, prophetess, and a faith filled judge, who led Israel, before they had kings. She not only led and judged Israel for about 40 years, she even went to war with the leader of Israel's army, to free their people. She gave God the glory. Judges 4 and 5.

David: The younger son of Jesse, a shepherd, who practiced a lot with his sling. David was anointed to be the next King of Israel, despite his father's unbelief. David became an unexpected hero after he killed the giant Goliath, who terrified the army of Israel. He became a successful army leader, but King Saul became jealous and tried to kill him. He fled, and attracted some courageous followers. He eventually became a successful King. But he made some terrible choices, and one of his sons tried to take his throne. 1 Samuel 16:1...

Solomon: Was asked by God what he wanted, and he just asked for wisdom to lead his people well. God gave him wisdom that also resulted in much love, respect, and prosperity. He wrote the Song of Solomon and finished God's temple. 1 Kings 1:11...

Elijah: He confronted many false prophets, by himself, to show the people the power of the true God. Tried to influence King Ahab to turn to God, but his wife Jezebel worshipped idols, and wanted to kill Elijah. He was taken up into heaven by a whirlwind 1 & 2 Kings...

Nehemiah: Gave up a good life directly serving King Artaxerxes to go back to Jerusalem to help rebuild it. He became a leader and convinced other leaders to stop taking advantage of their own people. He had to avoid traps from tribal enemies. Nehemiah...

Esther: Lost both parents. Served King Ahasuerus. She learned that a King's official, Haman, planned to kill all the Jewish people. She risked her life to stop the plan. Haman ended up hanging from the gallows that he had made to hang Mordecai, the Jew. Esther...

Job: A faithful, righteous, and successful man, who had many sudden tragedies that took his children, health, and wealth. His wife told him to curse God and die. His friends said he must have done something to deserve the tragedies. Job maintained his faith in God and his integrity, but he did regret being born. God finally said Job didn't deserve the tragedies, restored him, and rebuked his friends. Job...

Isaiah: Claimed prophecies about the birth and suffering of Jesus. Like other prophets, he held the leaders and the people accountable, and was sometimes hated for it. He constantly called on people to worship God, not idols. He had some unusual behaviors. Isaiah...

Daniel: A wise and faithful man who fearlessly honored God while he served a few different kings, over time. At one point, some of the King's officials were jealous of Daniel and had him thrown into a lion's den, but God delivered him unharmed. Daniel...

Mary and Joseph: Faithful parents of Jesus. Both were told about Jesus by an angel, but they humbly brought Jesus into the world. As a kid, Jesus strayed from them, and they found him three days later. Joseph taught Jesus carpentry skills. The Gospels...

Jesus: Faithful, humble, and courageous Son of God. He loved, cried, got angry, and spent time alone to pray. As He loved, mentored, taught, and healed people, He grew a large following. He warned us of troubles in the world. As He claimed to be the Son of God and forgave people of their sins, it angered religious leaders, and they demanded the local authorities crucify Him. God raised Jesus from the dead after three days. He went to heaven soon after, and God sent us the Holy Spirit. Jesus redeemed humanity and paid for our sins, as the final sacrifice, fulfilling the Old Covenant. Jesus offers us the New Covenant, a new life, of eternity with God. The Gospels...

Simon/Peter: The rock. A fisherman and first disciple with his brother Andrew. Sometimes impulsive. When the religious leaders brought soldiers to arrest Jesus, Peter drew his sword and fought for Jesus, but Jesus stopped him. After Jesus was arrested, Peter went to find out what they were going to do to him. People recognized Peter, but he denied knowing Jesus, three times. Jesus forgave him.

Saul/Paul: Was a Pharisee who persecuted Christians, until Jesus called on him. Most of the disciples did not first believe he converted. He served with humility and courage, despite being beaten and stoned. He traveled extensively to share the message of Jesus, survived a shipwreck and the locals claimed he was blessed, then cursed, then blessed. He wrote more New Testament books than anyone.

John: Part of the inner circle of Jesus, with Peter and James. Recorded the life of Jesus focusing on love and His deity. The Gospel of John.

Matthew: Was a tax collector, a criticized job, but Jesus called on him anyway. Recorded the life of Jesus. The Gospel of Matthew.

Mary Magdalene: Jesus saved her from a hard life. She followed Jesus, witnessed His crucifixion and the first to witness His resurrection.

Nicodemus: Came to Jesus at night and said that he and other Pharisees believed Jesus was from God. Spoke up for Jesus. John 3 and 7.



TWELVE GREAT BIBLE VERSES

KNOWLEDGE

1. The Bible is God's word, and it is helpful (2 Tim 3:16).

The Bible says it is from God, over 1,000 times. Search a free digital King James Version Bible for phrases like "saith the Lord" and "the Lord said." The books in the New Testament were written by, or with, people who directly experienced Jesus, and His miracles.

2. God created the universe (Gen 1:1).

Science claims the universe is still expanding, or growing, which means if we go back in time there was a starting point for the universe. It is common knowledge that you can't create something from nothing. Science done well reveals God's natural laws. Consider the quantum physics theories of unpredictability, decoherence, and entanglement. God is over all and in all (Eph 4:6). Consider the beautiful Hubble telescope photos. The heavens declare God's work (Ps 19:1)

3. God created humans (Gen 1:27).

It is illogical that any male and female organisms would evolve from a self-replicating organism. Science has proven that humans are made from elements found in the earth, with over 90 percent of the human body being oxygen, carbon, hydrogen, and nitrogen, and the rest are trace elements. God made humans from dust of the earth (Gen 2:7), in His image (Gen 1:27), with a spirit of power, love, and a sound mind (2 Tim 1:7). Jesus claimed to be God's Son (Jn 17:1) and God declared it, an angel, and His disciples.

UNDERSTANDING

4. There is power in your mind – Don't conform to the world, be transformed by renewing your mind (Ro 12:2).

Set your mind on things above (Col 3:2). Think about important topics like whatever is true, honorable, just, and excellent (Php 4:8). Forget what lies behind but think on what lies ahead (Php 3:13). Faith can move mountains (Mt 21:21). Be quick to hear, slow to speak, and slow to anger (Jas 1:19). Being slow to anger gives understanding (Pro 14:29).

5. There is power in your words (Pro 18:21).

Spoken words, with faith, can move mountains (Mt 21:21). A soft answer turns away wrath, but a harsh word stirs up anger (Pro 15:1). Speak the truth in love (Eph 4:15). The sword of the Spirit is the word of God (Eph 6:17). We destroy arguments against the knowledge of God (2 Cor 10:5). The tongue is small but has great power (Jas 3:5).

6. There is power in your relations – God so loved the world and gave His only Son for your eternal life (Jn 3:16).

Jesus is the Son of God (Jn 6:38-40). By one man many were made sinners, but by one man many are made righteous (Ro 5:19). Jesus fulfilled the Law (Mt 5:17) and cleansed us from sin (Heb 9:26). Declare Jesus is Lord and believe God raised Him from the dead and you will be saved (Ro 10:9). I can do all things through Christ (Php 4:13). Fellowship with Christians (Acts 2:42). Honor your parents (Ex 20:12). Iron sharpens iron, and friends sharpen each other (Pro 27:17).

WISDOM

7. Blessed are those who get wisdom and understanding (Pro 3:13).

Wisdom is better than wealth, and offers life, money, honor and peace (Pro 3:14-17), and it's better than might (Ecc 9:16). Fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom (Pro 9:10). God gives wisdom (Jas 1:5). Buy truth and wisdom (Pro 23:23).

8. Let your light shine (Mt 5:16).

We were created for good works (Eph 2:10). Do to other people as you want them to do to you (Mt 7:12). We all have gifts to help people. Let your love be sincere. Do not be lazy, be eager in spirit and serve the Lord. Rejoice in hope, be patient in challenges, and pray (Ro 12:6-12). Encourage and build each other up (1 Thess 5:11). Glorify God (1 Cor 10:31).

9. Walk in the Spirit to resist the desires of the flesh (Gal 5:16).

Desires of the flesh are against the spirit (Gal 5:17-23). God gave everyone free will (Gen 1:28). People are sinners and naturally selfish (Ro 5:19 and Jas 4:1). The world has troubles, but Jesus overcame the world (Jn 16:33). Take thoughts captive (2 Cor 10:5). Walk in the light and have fellowship with one another (1 Jn 1:7).

10. We wrestle against spiritual forces (Eph 6:12).

Evil spiritual forces are at work in the world (Job). The devil is a deceiver (Gen 3:13 and Rev 12:9) and tempts us with many things, especially doubt in our self, food, to test God, and with pride (Mt 4:3-11). The devil attempts to steal, kill, and destroy (Jn 10:10). Be strong in the Lord, put on the armor of God, pray, and be alert with perseverance (Eph 6:10-19).

11. Have faith in God (Mk 11:22).

Faith comes by hearing God's word (Ro 10:17). His steadfast love and faithfulness endures forever (Ps 117). By grace you are saved through faith, not work, it's a gift from God (Eph 2:8). Do not be anxious, but pray with thanksgiving (Php 4:6). Faith can move mountains (Mt 21:21). For those who love God, all things work together for good (Ro 8:28).

12. Love God, and love people (Mt 22:37-40).

We love because God first loved us (1 Jn 4:19). Nothing can separate us from God's love through Jesus (Ro 8:38-39). Love reflects grace and truth (Jn 1:17). Love is patient, kind, not envious, boastful, arrogant, rude, irritable, or resentful, and does not rejoice in wrongdoing but rejoices in truth (1 Cor 13:4-6). Love earnestly, as love covers sins (1 Pt 4:8).



ENCOURAGING BIBLE VERSES

2 Timothy 3:16 - Scripture is from God and it is useful (the Bible claims it is from God over 1,000 times, search a digital Bible for phrases like “the Lord said,” “declares the Lord,” or “says the Lord”... or “saith the Lord” in the KJV).
Genesis 1:26-27 - God made us in His image, male and female, and gave us dominion over earth.
2 Timothy 1:7 - God gave us a spirit not of fear, but of power, love, and a sound mind.
John 3:16 - God so loved the world and gave His only Son, and whoever believes in Him will have eternal life.
Ephesians 2:8 - By God’s grace we are saved through faith, not by our works, it is a gift from God.
Romans 10:19 - Confess that Jesus is Lord, believe in your heart God raised Him from the dead, and you will be saved.
John 1:17 - The law was given through Moses but grace and truth came through Jesus.
Matthew 5:17 - Jesus fulfilled the law for us. **Philippians 4:13** - I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me.
Romans 7:6 - We are released from the law, to live in the new way of the Spirit, not the old way of the written code.
Matthew 22:37-40 - The greatest commandment is to Love God with all your heart, soul, and mind, and second is like it, love your neighbor as yourself. On these two commandments depend all the law and prophets.
1 Corinthians 13:4-7 - Love is patient and kind, it is not envious, boastful, arrogant or rude; it is not aggressive, irritable, or resentful; it does not rejoice at wrongdoing, but rejoices in truth. Love bears, believes, hopes, and endures all things.
1 John 3:18 - Love in deed and truth. **John 15:13** - No one has greater love than to lay down their life for their friends.
Galatians 5:16-17 - Walk in the Spirit and you will not indulge the desires of the flesh. For the flesh is against the Spirit.
Proverbs 3:13-18 - Wisdom and understanding are better than gold and brings blessings, health, happiness, and peace.
Ephesians 2:10 - We are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works that God ordained for us.
Proverbs 15:3 - God sees everything, He keeps watch on the evil and the good. **Romans 2:11** - God is not partial.
Psalms 91:2 - God is my refuge and my fortress. In Him I trust. **Psalms 91:11** - God’s angels watch over us.
Isaiah 40:31 - Who wait on the Lord renew their strength; they mount up with wings as eagles and run and are not weary.
Romans 12:2 - Do not be conformed to the world but be transformed by the renewing of your mind.
2 Corinthians 10:5 - You can govern your thoughts. **1 Peter 5:7** - Cast your anxiety on God, He cares for you.

Proverbs 18:21 - Words have power of death and life. **Matthew 21:21** - Faith and our words can move mountains.
Proverbs 15:1 - A soft answer turns away anger. **Proverbs 4:23** - Guard your heart, life flows from it.
Proverbs 21:5 - Thoughts of hard workers lead to plenty. **Proverbs 10:4** - The hand of the hard workers makes rich.
Joshua 1:9 - Be strong and courageous, God is with you. **Proverbs 3:6** - Acknowledge God and He will direct your paths.
Psalms 23:4 - though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, because God is with me.
Galatians 5:13 - You are called to liberty. Don’t use it as an opportunity for the flesh, but by love serve one another.
Galatians 5:22 - Fruit of the Spirit includes love, joy, peace, kindness, faith and self-control. **1 Peter 4:8** - Love covers sins.
Galatians 6:9 - Let us not grow tired of doing good, we will be rewarded in due time, if we do not give up.
1 Peter 4:10 - We all received a gift, use your gift to serve one another, as good stewards of God’s varied grace.
Matthew 7:12 - Whatever you want done to you, do to other people. **Zechariah 4:6** - Not by strength, but by God’s Spirit.
Jeremiah 29:11 - God has good plans for you. **Isaiah 55:9** - God’s ways are higher than your ways.
Matthew 5:1-10 - Blessed are the poor in spirit, who mourn, the meek, who hunger for righteousness, and the merciful.
John 4:10 - If you knew the gift of God, and who is telling you, ‘Give me a drink,’ you would have asked Him, and he would give you living water (the woman at the well) (Jesus kindly asks us to come to Him, even those living in sin).

CHRISTIAN WISDOM GUIDE

SITUATION

Identity: We are made in God's image (Gen 1:26), His workmanship (Eph 2:10), as a spirit with a soul in a body (1Th 5:23). God gave us a spirit not of fear but of power, love and a sound mind (2 Tim 1:7). Have faith in God (Mk 11:22), He loved the world and gave His only Son, and whoever believes in Him will have eternal life (Jn 3:16). The Spirit of the Lord is liberty (2Cor 3:17). We have power in our thoughts (Pro 21:5, 2Cor 10:5), words (Pro 18:21), and actions (Pro 10:4).

Our Headquarters (head and heart): Govern your thoughts (2Cor 10:5). Think on what is honorable, just, pure, lovely, commendable, and practice them (Php 4:8). Do not conform to the world, but be transformed by renewing your mind (Ro 12:2). Knowledge is power (Pro 24:5). Knowledge should govern desires (Pro 19:2). Knowledge is better than gold and wisdom is better than jewels (Pro 8:10-11). God resists the proud, but gives grace to the humble, and exalts the humble in due time (1 Pt 5:5-6). The humble have wisdom (Pro 11:2). Wisdom is better than strength (Ecc 9:16). The wise seek knowledge (Pro 18:15), counsel (Pro 12:15), and God (Jas 1:5). Guard your heart, life flows from it (Pro 4:23). The heart can be selfish (Mark 7:21-22). God can give us a new heart and spirit (Ez 36:26). Keep God's word in an honest and good heart, and be patient for results (Lk 8:15). Be content (Php 4:11), courageous (Josh 1:9), and diligent (Pro 10:4, 21:5). We should sanctify our self, and control our bodies (1Th 4:3-8, Jn 17:17).

Circumstances

Truth: The truth will set you free (Jn 8:32). Truth helps us use time wisely (Ecc 8:5). Buy truth (Pro 23:23). Speak the truth in love (Eph 4:15). God's anger is against the unrighteous who suppress truth (Ro 1:18). God hates arrogance, lies, shedding innocent blood, who makes wicked plans, who is quick to mischief, and who stirs up conflict (Pro 6:16-19).

Time: Prioritize and make the best use of time (Eph 5:16), tomorrow is unknown (Jas 4:14). A diligent business person will stand before kings (Pro 22:29). Walk in wisdom around those who are without, redeeming the time (Col 4:5). Teach us to number our days so we apply our hearts to wisdom (Ps 90:12). The hand of the diligent will rule (12:24).

Health: Our body is the Holy Spirit's temple (1 Cor 6:19). God's words give life and health (Pro 4:20-22). Physical training is good (1Tim 4:8), too many sweets are not good (Pro 25:27). A joyful heart is good, like medicine (Pro 17:22).

Emotions and Thoughts: God gave us a spirit of power, love and a sound mind (2Tim 1:7). Be quick to hear, slow to speak, and slow to anger (Jas 1:19). Being slow to anger gives understanding (Pro 14:29). Don't fear (Ps 23:4) or be anxious (Mt 6:34). Faith, hope, and love abide (1Cor 13:13). The wise are cautious, the foolish are careless (Pro 14:16). A cool spirit gives understanding (Pro 17:27). Share feelings of other people (Ro 12:15). What we focus on influences us (Mt 6:22, Ro 8:5-6). Transform your mind (Ro 12:2). Think on important topics (Php 4:8). Manage your thoughts (2 Cor 10:5). We are not our emotions and thoughts, we are what we do with them (2 Tim 1:7, Gal 5:16, Eph 6:10-12).

Money: Wisdom is better, and more beneficial, than wealth (Pro 3:13-18). Life is not in possessions (Lk 12:15). Better are the poor with integrity, than the rich without integrity (Pro 28:6). The rich rule over the poor and the borrower serves the lender (Pro 22:7). God, and diligent thoughts and hands, bring wealth (Deu 8:18, Pro 21:5, Pro 10:4). Honor God with your wealth (Pro 3:9) and invest (Mt 25:27). Beware, the love of money is the root of many evils (1Tim 6:10).

Allies

Holy Trinity: God sent Jesus to save our soul (Jn 3:16, Ro 5:19). Our help comes from the Lord (Psa 121:2), and all things are possible with God (Mk 10:27). God's anger is not forever, because He delights in mercy (Mic 7:18). Jesus is the way, truth, and life (Jn 14:6). Jesus said, He came to give life (Jn 10:10), and He overcome the world (Jn 16:33). Greater is the Holy Spirit in us, than us in the world (1Jn 4:4). The Holy Spirit is our comforter and teacher (Jn 14:26).

Angels: God's angels can help us and guard us (Psa 91:11-12), warn us (Mt 1:20), and test us (Heb 13:2).

Other People: Love God and love people (Mt 22:37-40). Greater love has no one, than to lay down their life for their friends (Jn 15:13, Pro 18:24). Love people through action and truth (1 Jn 3:18). Think for yourself and speak truth in love (Eph 4:15). Science done well reveals God's natural laws... God is the Father of all, above all, through all, and in all (Eph 4:6). Help people as you have opportunity (Gal 6:10). Hate stirs up anger, but love covers offenses (Pro 10:12).

Adversaries

Our Flesh: Desires of the flesh are a daily concern because they are against the desires of the Spirit (Gal 5:16-17). The flesh wars against the soul (1Pt 2:11). The desires of the flesh include lust, idolatry, witchcraft, anger, envy, division, and drunkenness (Gal 5:19). Pride (Pro 11:2) and foolishness (Mt 25:1-13) also work against people.

The World: God gave all humans free will (Gen 1:28). Woe to those who cause offenses (Mt 18:7). The world promotes desires of the flesh, and pride (1Jn 2:16). We will have trouble in the world (Jn 16:33), but you are a light in the world (Mt 5:14). Go and share the Gospel (Mk 16:15), but don't judge those who don't believe it (Jn 12:47).

Other Forces: We struggle against different levels of wicked spiritual adversaries (Eph 6:12). Our adversary is the devil (1Pt 5:8) who tempts (Gen 3:1-5, Mt 4:3), lies (Jn 8:44), discourages (2 Cor 4:4), deceives and accuses (Rev 12:9-10). So, he can steal (fruit of the Spirit, fellowship, and freedom), kill (body), and destroy (legacy) (Jn 10:10). The devil can disguise himself (2Cor 11:14-15), and cause suffering (Job 1 and 2). Our best offense and defense are in Jesus (Jn 10:10).



STRATEGY

Have faith in God (Mk 11:22), love God and people (Mt 22:37-40), and fellowship with the Holy Triune and people (1Cor 1:9, 2Cor 13:14, 1Jn 1:3). Submit to God and resist the devil (Jas 4:7), sanctify yourself (1Jn 17:17, 1Th 5:23), walk in the Spirit and resist the flesh (Gal 5:16-26), and walk out your calling (1 Cor 7:17, Eph 4:1). Proclaim the gospel (Mk 16:15), make disciples (Mt 28:19), and give God the glory (Col 3:17, 3:23, 1Cor 10:31, Ro 15:5-7).

TACTICS

Key Forces, and Focus: One God of all, above all, through all, and in all (Eph 4:6). God's ways are higher than ours (Isa 55:9). The heart of man plans his way, but the Lord establishes his steps (Pro 16:9). Do not be distracted, God enlisted us (2Tim 2:4). Submit to God (Jas 4:7). Respect authority (Ro 13:1-4) and pray for authority (1Tim 2:1-2). Walk as the light of the Lord and discern the Lord's will (Eph 5:8-10), pray constantly (Ro 12:12), confess (1Jn 1:9), repent (Acts 2:38), and forgive (Mk 11:25). Trust and acknowledge the Lord and He will guide us (Pro 3:5-6) and bless us (Jer 17:7). Wait for the Lord and He will renew our strength (Isa 40:31). Diligent thoughts and actions lead to plenty (Pro 10:4, 21:5).

Be: In God's image (Gen 1:27), as adopted sons and daughters (Ro 8:15) with a spirit not of fear but of power, love and a sound mind (2Tim 1:7). Be Christ like (Ro 12:9-21). Be virtuous, gain knowledge, and exercise temperance, patience, godliness, kindness, and love (2 Pt 1:5-7). Be wise (Pro 4:5), aware (Eph 5:15), humble (1Pt 5:6), honest (Pro 6:17), diligent (Pro 10:4, 21:5), patient (Ro 12:12), strong and courageous (Jos 1:9) and blessed (Lk 7:23). Be prepared to respectfully defend your faith (1Pt 3:15). Be quick to hear, slow to speak and slow to anger (Jas 1:19).

Know: (Pro 1:5-7). We are of the household of God (Eph 2:19). Know God's word (Pro 3:1). God is slow to anger, and plentiful in steadfast love (Neh 9:17). God's love endures (Ps 136), and nothing can separate us from it (Ro 8:37-39). Who does not love does not know God (1Jn 4:8). Love is patient and kind, not envious or boastful (1Cor 13). Attitudes are contagious (Pro 15:1). Seek wise counsel (Pro 24:6). We can ask God for wisdom (Jas 1:5). The Lord is our fortress, deliverer (Ps 91), and avenger (1Th 4:6). We can do all things through Christ (Ph 4:13). We are saved by grace, not works (Eph 2:8). Sin is an obstacle between us and God (Isa 59:2). Guarantees in life include change (Pro 27:1), opportunities (Gal 5:16, Eph 5:15-17, Lk 8:15), challenges (Jn 10:10, 16:33, Eph 6:10-12), and choices (Gen 1:28, Pro 18:21, Ro 12:2, 2Cor 10:5). Communication skills are powerful (Pro 18:21, 15:1-4), and misunderstandings are dangerous (Job 4-42).

Do: Love God and people (Mt 22:37-40). Praise God (Mt 6:9), worship Him (Lk 4:8), have faith in Him (Mk 11:22), and pray against temptation (Mt 26:41). Treat people how you want to be treated (Mt 7:12) and build each other up (Eph 4:29). Caution, encourage, and help people (1Th 5:14). Share life's ups and downs (Ro 12:15). Forgive people (Eph 4:32). Speak life (Pro 18:21) and the truth in love (Eph 4:15), because iron sharpens iron (Pro 27:17). Stand and put on the belt of truth, breastplate of righteousness, shoes of the gospel, shield of faith, helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit (Eph 6:14-17). The Holy Spirit can guide and comfort us (Jn 14:26, Acts 9:31). Walk in the light (1Jn 1:7) and in newness of Spirit (Ro 7:6). We should supplement our faith with virtue, knowledge, temperance, patience, godliness, kindness and love (2Pt 1:5). Fruit of the Spirit includes love, joy and peace (Gal 5:22). Faith is assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen (Heb 11:1). As for me and my house, we will serve the Lord (Jos 24:15). Seek first the kingdom of God and needs will be met (Mt 6:33). Look forward and consider your path, do not turn from it (Pro 4:25-27).

Personal Growth: Get wisdom (Pro 3:13-35), learn (Pro 1:5-7, Php 4:8), and be sanctified (1 Th 5:12-24). Pray, intercede, and give thanks for people (1Tim 2:1). Honor your parents (Ex 20:12). Repent (Mk 1:15). Respect (Mt 7:12). Be courteous (Ti 3:2), and grow with other people (Eph 4:15), knowing all have sinned, and are justified by grace (Ro 3:23). If someone sins against you, first talk with them about it alone (Mt 18:15). Beware of dissension, blessed are peacemakers (Mt 5:9). Speak with grace and know how to answer each person (Col 4:6). Bad decisions will be made (Ro 7:15), wrong words will be said (Jas 3:2), but the gifts and calling of God remain (Ro 11:29). Faith, hope, and love abide (1Cor 13:13).

Professional Growth: Everyone has a gift for serving people (1Pt 4:10, Gal 5:13). Let people walk out the calling the Lord has given them (Eph 4:1, 1 Cor 7:17). The thoughts and hands of the diligent lead to plenty (Pro 10:4, 21:5). Let no one despise you for your youth, but be an example in word, love, faith, and purity (1 Tim 4:12).

Leadership Growth: To whom much is given, much is required (Lk 12:48). Mercy and truth preserve the king (Pro 20:28). Families will have challenges (Lk 12:52-53), husbands love your wives, and wives respect your husbands (Eph 5:33). Children are a blessing (Psa 127:3-5), raise them in discipline and instruction in the Lord (Eph 6:4). Obey leaders and submit to them (Hb 13:17). With many counselors there is safety (Pro 11:14). Where there is no vision the people perish (Pro 29:18). Provide for your people willingly not greedily, and not controlling, but be an example (1 Pt 5:3). Look for people who fear God, who are trustworthy and hate a bribe, and place them over people (Ex 18:21).

Organization Growth: God is not partial (Ro 2:11), be fair to your employees (Eph 6:9). God hates deceptive weights, and a false balance is not good (Pro 20:23). Better is a little with righteousness than great revenue with injustice (Pro 16:8). Those diligent in their work will stand before kings (Pro 22:29).

FOUNDATION

Salvation: For God so loved the world, that he gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life (Jn 3:16). Confess that Jesus is Lord, believe in your heart God raised Him from the dead, and you will be saved (Ro 10:19).

Believe: Jesus was delivered for our offenses and raised for our justification (Ro 4:25). By one man's disobedience many were made sinners, so by the obedience of one will many be made righteous (Ro 5:19). Don't fear, believe (Mk 5:36).

Prophecy: A virgin will bear a son (Isa 7:14 / Mt 1:23). Bethlehem will bear the ruler of Israel (Mic 5:2 / Lk 2:4-7). He was despised and rejected (Isa 53:3 / Jn 1:11). They pierced Him (Ps 22:16 / Mt 27:35). He was numbered with the transgressors (Isa 53:12 / Mk 15:27).

Relationship with God: We are a spirit with a soul in a body (1Th 5:23). God gave us a spirit not of fear, but of power, love, and a sound mind (2Tim 1:7). God knows our heart (Pro 21:2). Without faith it is impossible to please Him: for he that comes to God must believe that He is, and that He rewards them who diligently seek Him (Heb 11:6). Jesus answered them saying, Have faith in God (Mk 11:22).

Grace: Grace and peace to you (Ro 1:7). All have sinned (Ro 3:23). He saved us, not because of works (Ti 3:5), by grace are you saved through faith (Eph 2:8). The law was given by Moses, grace and truth came by Jesus Christ (Jn 1:17). Jesus fulfilled the law for us (Mt 5:17).

Truth: By God all things were created (Col 1:16). God's word is truth (Jn 17:17). God judges everyone equally (Ro 2:11), even our secrets (Ro 2:16). The wrath of God from heaven is against those who manipulate the truth (Ro 1:18). Worship in spirit and truth (Jn 4:24).

Sin: Christ Jesus has freed us from the law of sin and death (Ro 8:2). Let him who is without sin be the first to throw a stone (Jn 8:7).

Repent: Repent, and be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of sins, and receive the gift of the Holy Spirit (Ac 2:38).

Confess: If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness (1Jn 1:9).

Baptism: He commanded them to be baptized in the name of the Lord (Ac 10:48). Buried with Him through baptism, raised by faith (Col 2:12).

Holy Spirit: But the Comforter, which is the Holy Spirit, who the Father sent in the name of Jesus, He will teach you all things (Jn 14:26). You will be baptized with the Holy Spirit (Ac 1:5). The Holy Spirit dwells in us (2Tim 1:14). The Spirit also helps our infirmities (Ro 8:26).

New Covenant: God spoke of a new covenant (Jer 31:31). If the ministry of condemnation has glory, the ministry of righteousness exceeds it in glory (2Cor 3:9). If righteousness come by the law, Christ died in vain (Gal 2:21). Serve in newness of Spirit (Ro 7:6).

New Life: Put on a new self in the likeness of God in righteousness and true holiness (Eph 4:24). Follow that which is good (3Jn 1:11).

Courage: Be strong and courageous. Do not be scared, or discouraged, for the Lord your God is with you wherever you go (Josh 1:9).

Trust: Blessed are those who trust in the LORD (Jer 17:7). Cast your cares upon Him (Php 4:6). Christ makes all things new (Rev 21:5).

Faith: Faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the Word of God (Ro 10:17). Jesus answered them saying, Have faith in God (Mk 11:22). Faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen (Heb 11:1). Our conversation is in heaven (Php 3:20).

Hope: Hope that is seen is not hope (Ro 8:24). With people this is impossible; but with God all things are possible (Mt 19:26). Be sober and hope to the end (1Pt 1:13). The LORD has plans for you, for peace not evil (Jer 29:11). Faith, hope, and love abide (1Cor 13:13).

Love: Nothing can separate us from the love of God, in Christ Jesus our Lord (Ro 8:38-39). Let us not love in word; but in deed and in truth (1Jn 3:18). No person has greater love than to lay down their life for their friends (Jn 15:13). Love suffers long and is kind; love envies not; love brags not, is not puffed up or behaves badly, is not demanding, is not easily provoked, thinks no evil; rejoices not in iniquity, but rejoices in truth (1Cor 13). Let all things be done with love (1Cor 16:14). Bear with one another in love, and maintain unity of the Spirit in peace (Eph 4:2-3).

Commandments: Love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the first and great commandment. And the second is like it, love your neighbor as yourself. On these two commandments depend all law (Mt 22:37-39).

An angel warns Joseph in a dream that the ruler, Herod, wants to kill Jesus, so they flee to Egypt. Later, after Herod dies, an angel tells Joseph in a dream, Herod is dead, return to Israel. They move to Nazareth, in the region of Galilee, where Jesus is raised. **3.** John the Baptist (cousin of Jesus) is baptizing people when Jesus comes to him to be baptized. As Jesus was baptized God spoke from heaven and declared Jesus is His Son. **4.** Jesus was led by the Spirit into the wilderness to fast for forty days, then to be tempted by the devil. Temptation one was of food, temptation two was to get Jesus to put himself in harm's way to tempt God to supernaturally intervene and save him. Temptation three was pride, as the devil offered Jesus status. In all three temptations Jesus quoted God's word after saying, it is written. Jesus then told Satan to be gone. He begins his ministry, calls his first disciples and starts teaching and healing. He draws big crowds. **5.** Jesus starts his famous speech, the Sermon on the Mount, or the Beatitudes, which continues through chapter 7. Jesus said, Blessed are... the poor in spirit, who mourn, the meek, who hunger for righteousness, the merciful, pure in heart, peacemakers, and who is persecuted for righteousness, or for the sake of Jesus. You are the light of the world. Let your light shine. Jesus did not come to destroy the law or the prophets, but to fulfill them. Be careful with anger. If you look at another with lust, you commit adultery in your heart. Be careful with divorce, and oaths. Turn the other cheek. **6.** Give to the needy. Pray like this: Our Father who art in heaven, Hallowed by thine name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done in earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread and forgive us our debts as we forgive our debtors. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever. Amen. Fast. Lay up treasure in heaven. Do not be anxious, seek first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness, and your needs will be met. **7.** Judge not, so you will not be judged. For how you judge, you will be judged. Ask and it will be given, seek and you will find, knock and it will be opened. Do to people as you would have them do to you. Jesus warns of false prophets, and says you will know them by their fruit. Not everyone who claims to believe Jesus is Lord will get into heaven, but those who do the will of God. Whoever hears the words of Jesus and does them will be like a man who built his house on rock. Whoever does not do them will be like a man who built his house on sand. **8.** Jesus continues teaching and healing. Jesus calms a storm. Jesus casts out demons. **9.** Jesus forgives sin and heals. A woman is healed by her faith, after she comes up behind Jesus and just touches his clothes. Jesus raises a young woman from death. **10.** Jesus sends out his disciples, after a speech with some instructions and warnings. **11.** Jesus continues teaching. **12.** Jesus heals on the Sabbath. Some leaders claimed Jesus is casting out demons by the power of the devil. Jesus says a kingdom divided cannot stand. **13.** Jesus give parables of the sower and weeds, and others. Jesus returns to his hometown of Nazareth but they did not believe in him. **14.** Jesus feeds five thousand. Jesus walks on water, and calls Peter to come, and Peter walks on water until he becomes afraid. Jesus continues to heal. **15.** Jesus continues to teach and heal, and feeds four thousand. **16.** Jesus continues to teach, and asks Peter, who do you say I am? Jesus foretells his death and resurrection, and Peter takes Jesus aside to rebuke him, and says such a thing will not happen, then Jesus rebukes Peter. Jesus says to take up your cross and follow him. For whoever would save their life will lose it, but whoever loses their life for his sake will find it. **17.** Jesus invites Peter, and the brothers James and John to witness his transfiguration. **18.** Jesus says whoever humbles themselves like a child will be great in heaven. Jesus tells the parable of the shepherd who leaves 99 sheep to look for one lost sheep. Jesus tells them if someone sins against them that they should talk about it with them in private. Jesus tells the parable of the servant who was forgiven, but refused to forgive another, so he was put in prison. **19.** A rich man addresses Jesus as Master or Teacher, not as Lord, and asks, what must he "do" for eternal life. Their talk ends with him walking away sad. Jesus said it is difficult for rich people to enter the kingdom of heaven. The disciples ask Jesus, who then can be saved? Jesus tells them, with man this is impossible, but with God all things are possible. **20.** Jesus tells the parable of the master who hires different people to work his vineyard at different times of the day, but for the same price. The early workers complained, but the master reminded them that they voluntarily agreed to the price. **21.** Jesus cleanses the temple. **22.** Jesus gives the parable of the wedding feast. Some leaders question Jesus. Jesus said the greatest commandments are to love God and love people. On these two commandments depend all the law and the prophets. **23.** Jesus gives seven woes to the religious leaders. **24.** Jesus teaches on the signs of the end times, and says the one who endures to the end will be saved, and concerning that day, no one knows. **25.** Jesus gives the parable of the ten virgins with lamps, and the three servants who received different amounts of talents. Jesus teaches about the final judgment. **26.** The last supper. Jesus foretells of his betrayal and Peter's denial. Jesus prays in the garden of Gethsemane. Judas was paid to guide some leaders, elders, and soldiers to arrest Jesus, and betrayed Jesus with a kiss. Peter attempted to defend Jesus, but Jesus rebuked him. Jesus was questioned by the high priest, and was labeled a blasphemer for claiming to be the Son of God, and was sentenced to death. **27.** Jesus is delivered to the Governor, Pilate, who declares Jesus undeserving of death. Some leaders manipulated the crowd to insist on crucifying Jesus. Jesus is mocked, then crucified beside a couple criminals, and dies. Jesus is wrapped and buried in a guarded tomb, because some leaders were afraid the disciples would steal the body and say he was resurrected. **28.** After Jesus was resurrected he first met with his mother Mary and Mary Magdalene. Some leaders bribed the guards to tell people the disciples stole the body. Jesus met with his disciples and gave them the Great Commission.



A SHORT HISTORY OF CHRISTIANITY AND THE BIBLE

Christianity and its sacred Scriptures of the New Testament started with the physical life of Jesus Christ, born in Bethlehem about 5-3 BC, and raised in Nazareth of Galilee. He started his ministry around 30 years old, and was crucified about three years later. Afterwards, his disciples went on to start Christianity, which became the largest religion on earth, despite being persecuted. As the Christian Church grew after the death of Jesus, there were inaccuracies of the teaching of Jesus. This led to the Old Roman Creed, that became The Apostle's Creed, and later, the longer Nicene Creed was created. These gave churches an official foundation for doctrine. Many churches still refer to these documents today.

The early churches were just groups of followers of Jesus who met to learn about the teachings of Jesus, disciple new believers, share life, and to share the good news of Jesus. The first official church was, and still is, referred to as the Catholic Church. The word Catholic means united. Like most organizations, as it grows over time, it became more complex. John Wycliffe, Martin Luther, and John Calvin, had many disagreements with the Catholic Church doctrines and traditions, and eventually started the protestant movement, also referred to as the evangelical movement. The protestant movement brought new protestant doctrines and traditions along with new titles. Many of the larger protestant denominations include the Baptist, Presbyterian, Lutheran, Methodist, Anglican, Pentecostal, and the Nondenominational Church. Today, we are seeing most of these protestant denominations are being divided along political lines, and adopting slightly different subtitles. You can find the political leanings of most religions and denominations online.

The Christian Bible includes sacred Scriptures of Judaism, the main religion of the Jewish people of Israel. The Hebrew Bible of Judaism makes up the Christian Bible Old Testament. Many of the books in the Bible do not have an exact known date they were finished. The earliest records of the Old Testament were written on scrolls of dried leaves or animal skins, and were rolled up for storage. Overall, the books of the Bible were written by about 40 authors, on three continents, over the course of about 1500 years. There are 39 books in the Old Testament. The oldest book of the Old Testament is Genesis and is believed to be written around 1420 BC. The most recent book of the Old Testament is Malachi and is believed to be written around 430 BC. The Old Testament has many prophecies about Jesus confirmed in the New Testament (Isa 7:14 / Mt 1:23; Mic 5:2 / Lk 2:4-7; Isa 53:3 / Jn 1:11 and Mt 13:57; Isa 53:12 / Mk 15:27) and God's New Covenant (Jer 31:31 / Jn 1:17, Ro 7:6 and 2 Cor 3:6).

There was about 425 years between the last book of the Old Testament and the birth of Jesus. There are 27 books in the New Testament. The first four books of the New Testament are referred to as the Gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John. These record some of the life of Jesus. Then there are the rest of the books of the Bible, mostly letters of correspondence from Christian leaders, which are called the epistles. The New Testament books were written within 100 years, shortly after the death of Jesus. Most of the epistles were written by Paul, a former Pharisee who persecuted Christians. Paul converted to Christianity after an encounter with Jesus that transformed him. A couple of Jesus' brothers wrote the books James and Jude.

As the Christian Bibles became more popular, different translations were created. There are basically two approaches to translation, a literal word by word translation, or translation by phrase (paraphrase). One of the most popular translations, if not the most popular, is the King James Version (KJV) Bible, it was finished in 1611, after about seven years of work by a group of Christian leaders. The KJV is a literal word by word translation. The KJV copyright is public domain, so it is available free to download online. Other popular Bibles include The Message, which is a paraphrase Bible. The New International Version (NIV) is more in the middle of the word by word and paraphrase spectrum. Then there is the English Standard Version (ESV). The ESV is the latest effort to clarify the Bible, led by a team of more than 100 evangelical scholars and pastors. It is a word by word translation, based on many original Hebrew, Aramaic, and Greek texts.

It is my understanding the Bible is the only sacred Scriptures from any of the four largest religions to declare it is from God. If you search a digital KJV Bible for the phrases, "saith the Lord," "the Lord said," and "God said," or search a digital ESV Bible for the phrases, "says the Lord," "the Lord said," and "declares the Lord," and you will find over 1,000 results. There are also some great study Bibles with helpful notes that explain some hard to understand verses, and add some articles based on the topic of the study Bible. My favorite study Bibles include the Apologetics Study Bible (apologetics meaning, in defense of), the Life Application Study Bible, and the basic ESV Study Bible, with no specific topic of study.

CLOSING THOUGHTS

I have found it very helpful to get into a habit of reading the Bible regularly, especially a “Study Bible.” Reading the Bible has also raised questions about God and the Bible, but it provided me a lot more helpful knowledge. There are general study Bibles based on a specific Bible translation, that help explain specific verses, like the Life Application Study Bible. There are study Bibles specifically for men, women, teens, students, and for many different careers, that offer insightful comments on verses. Other helpful study Bibles include the English Standard Version (ESV) Study Bible, and the Apologetics Study Bible that provides many articles that help explain and defend the Christian faith.

I believe the core of Christian doctrine can be found in the Nicene Creed. It’s my understanding the Nicene Creed is a public domain document. It’s my understanding that it was created in the early 300’s by the Council of Nicaea, and updated in the late 300’s by the Council of Constantinople, because some church leaders were teaching some interesting things that were not mainstream beliefs at the time. I noticed different versions of the Nicene Creed online. The key points of the Nicene Creed include belief in one God, the maker of heaven and earth. Belief in the Lord, Jesus Christ, the Only Son of God, who, for our salvation, came to earth as a man, was crucified, died, and was buried. On the third day God raised Him from the dead, and He ascended into heaven to be with God. Jesus Christ will come again, with glory, and judge all people on earth, and bring heaven to earth. Belief in the Holy Spirit, who is worshipped and glorified, and has spoken through the Prophets. Belief in one holy united Christian Church, and one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.

I believe there are guarantees in life including opportunities, challenges, and choices. When we gain new knowledge it helps us to better manage our opportunities and challenges, and make better choices. I also believe there are shortcuts in life. When we gain knowledge from other people, it can save us years of personal experience, of trial and error. While there is no shortcut for doing the necessary work, many people have found, and shared, ways to work smarter and faster. Some of our most important work is learning to overcome the desires of the flesh and negative emotions, especially envy, arrogant pride, and fear. Envy often ends in pride or fear, and these tempt us to do things that are not helpful, and to not do things that are helpful. Other key negative emotions include, anger and shame, which can also be the result of envy pride, and fear. The keys to these negative emotions are gratitude, humility, courage, peace, and love. Beware of our spiritual adversaries who stir up our desires of the flesh and negative emotions. I have found that sometimes there is a fine line between fear and wisdom.

Consider the story where Jesus told Peter (a professional fisherman) to go to deep water and cast out his net to catch fish. Peter responded that they had already fished all night and caught nothing, but he would do it anyway. The result was a large catch of fish (Luke 5:3-6). We all have much to learn, especially from the Holy Triune and the Bible, but also from each other. Iron sharpens iron (Proverbs 27:17). Some other good Christian books include, EPIC: The Story God is Telling; The Purpose Driven Life: What on Earth Am I Here For?; Making Sense of God: Finding God in the Modern World; The Case for Christ: A Journalist’s Personal Investigation of the Evidence for Jesus; Cold-Case Christianity: A Homicide Detective Investigates the Claims of the Gospels; Evidence that Demands a Verdict: Life-Changing Truth for a Skeptical World; The Complete C.S. Lewis Signature Collection (includes Mere Christianity); Love & Respect: The Love She Most Desires; The Respect He Desperately Needs; Jesus Calling: Enjoying Peace in His Presence (a 365-Day Devotional); Renovation of the Heart: Putting on the Character of Christ.
