CONSTITUTION

(THE SPIRITUAL COMPACT FOR OUR RELATIONSHIP)



A. PREAMBLE

International Ministers Fellowship is a network of ministers of the gospel across the globe that share a common passion for holiness, yielding to the Holy Spirit for leadership and empowerment and a recognition that fellowship with likeminded co-labourers is central to gaining divine approval. It is thus an organism, a living, loving network of like-minded ministers of the gospel who share a passion for intimacy with the Lord and genuine relationship with each other for accountability in an increasingly hostile world.

B. THE UNIQUE 7-POINT VISION

The International Ministers Fellowship is unique in a number of respects.

1. It is inclusive, embracing senior and younger ministers of the gospel, male and female who have a felt need to encourage one another to make pursuit of holiness a prime pursuit.
2. It breaks down standard walls that divide the Body of Christ as members cut across denominational barriers, united by faith in Christ Jesus, purity of life and dependency on the Holy Spirit for empowerment.
3. IMF does not charge any affiliation fees. Members support the network, as they are led, through love offerings and free will endowments.
4. Members are free to belong to other fellowships /networks they deem beneficial to achievement of their ministerial mandates.
5. The Fellowship shall encourage its members to make their lives and those of the flock of Jesus Christ committed unto their trust, the light and salt of their communities; to stand out for righteousness and contend earnestly for the faith once delivered to the saints and not to be ashamed of the preaching of the Cross though it seem foolish to brethren of the Laodecian complex (Matthew 5:13-16, Jude 5, 1 Cor. 1:18).
6. The Fellowship shall proactively engage with other Christian organizations to ensure unity of the spirit in the bond of peace so that the High Priestly intercession of our Lord Jesus Christ shall be a reality without compromising the essentials of the gospel. (Ephesians 4: 1-7, John 17 to attain Ephesians 5:26,27). Accordingly, the Fellowship will encourage all Christian ministries and organizations in the country to prayerfully define essentials or fundamentals of the faith to which all must subscribe in

perfect unity; ascertain those issues to which preachers are at liberty to propound their perspectives, insights and revelations received.

7. The Fellowship offers its members a clear win-win supra platform where they are able to exchange information on programmes and projects and support each other. We are all blessed as we bless each other in love and sincerity!

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C. 11 CORE OFFERS OF INTERNATIONAL MINISTERS FELLOWSHIP:

1. Provide spiritual support that enable members to excel in life and ministry by challenging them to live holy lives, as part of the Bride of Christ and keep heaven in constant view so that they will not be castaways after ministering to others
2. Provide members a process of continuing ministerial education through a regular school of ministry where they tap into the depth of wisdom available for all.
3. Provide resources to members at minimal or no cost such as books, CDs, DVDs, Cassettes, magazines, information, etc.
4. Network ministers of the gospel with each other across racial, ethnic, Denominational and geographic boundaries to create the spiritual synergy needful to positively impact cities, nations and regions. IMF has become a powerful tool of achieving our Acts 1:8 mandate as it equips ministers travelling to cities, nations and regions other than their own with contacts and recommendations that enable them to be received and assisted on their missions. Pulpits are thus exchanged seamlessly without fear as all members subscribe to the same basic code of conduct.
5. The network runs an information network through which members are able to know the gifts and callings of each other. By tapping into the divine resources represented by different callings and gifting, ministers are able to build stronger and more effective churches according to Ephesians 4: 7-16.
6. The network provides a platform for younger ministers to receive clean, honest mentoring by elder ministers endowed with grace of fatherhood.
7. For ministers who have not been ordained, the Fellowship provides ordination. For ordained ministers, IMF provides ministerial licences.

For those travelling to other cities or nations, the Fellowship provided recommendations. Ministers in need of attestations/references can look up to the Fellowship to fill this need.

8. The network provides the platform for ministers, ministries and churches within the same localities/boroughs to cooperate, pool resources together for reaching the unreached and community impact projects. The Lord has revealed that this is a key strategy for bringing this nation back to Christ.
9. International Ministers Fellowship will partner with any ministers/ ministries or organizations that promotes the teaching and practice of holiness, church health Church growth and corporate evangelism.
10. International Ministers Fellowship members are constrained to do all within their God given ability to be a blessing to others in need; support the weak and build up the Body without pecuniary motives. Strong inter personal relationships and mutual support is thus encouraged.
11. The Fellowship shall organize conferences at such intervals and in such locations as are deemed beneficial to the membership. We shall freely share every information, which will bless our brethren in fulfilling their God given vision.

D. STRUCTURE OF THE FELLOWSHIP

As a spiritual organism, International Ministers Fellowship needs minimal organizational structures. However, because of the realities of civilization, law and order, basic structures are hereby activated for the purpose of ensuring due order in the fellowship, ensure that purity of the vision is preserved and to ensure adequate documentation which will guide national and local chapters in how to set up. The Fellowship is structured to tap into the widest possible spectrum of ministers rooted in the Word and pursuing intimacy with the Lord.



Global Board of Trustees

- » International Ministers Fellowship shall have a minimum of 3 and maximum of 5 senior ministers who will hold the vision in Trust at the Global level to ensure there is no diversion or derailment.
- » These shall act within the ordinary and regulatory meaning of the word 'Trustee' and serve as Board of Directors where that is the nomenclature in the national jurisdiction of global registration.
- » They shall exercise due diligence to ensure that all regulatory requirements concerning the Fellowship are met with regulatory authorities at the National and State levels.
- » They shall, on behalf of the Fellowship sign relevant documents at global level.
- » Trustees of the Fellowship shall take charge of each and every asset and ensure that such are accounted for as and when required. This includes assets that former regional or national officers are required to release upon exit.

Global Governing Council

The Global Governing Council will be a policy making organ of the Fellowship. It will, among other functions:

- » Make policies for implementation
- » Approve the Constitution of the Fellowship
- » Review the Constitution where need be
- » Provide oversight of the Fellowship as its functional Elders' Board
- » Provide spiritual direction for the Fellowship world-wide
- » Ensure that biblical principles are upheld in matters pertaining to the Fellowship
- » Approve appointments of International Officers
- » Take responsibility for biblical conflict resolution in matters that concern International officers
- » Ensure that biblical discipline is applied within the Fellowship
- » Provide guidelines and approve qualifications for issuance of ministerial credentials to applicants in the network

Global Executive Committee

This shall be a body of ministers who will essentially focus on these issues at the global level, working closely with the Global Governing Council to deliver on the vision and mission of the Fellowship:

- » Implement policies approved by the Governing Council
- » Ensure that the provisions of The Constitution are adhered to
- » Take responsibility for expanding the Fellowship into all nations of the world and supervise their activities
- » Approve appointment of officers of the various national chapters
- » Approve appointment of Regional Officers
- » Resource and provide national chapters with the required direction and support so that they can be strong and viable. In this regard engage in fund raising using biblical principles and account for revenue through annual reports and accounts.
- » Implement guidelines approved by Council for issuance of credentials to applicants.
- » Initiate and recommend networking with other networks so that the Fellowship will walk in the unity of faith with other networks to generate the required level of synergy
- » Prepare annual budgets and present for approval of the Council
- » Undertake ethical fund raising projects to ensure that the resources for running the network are available
- » Ensure that national chapters which need help are supported.
- » Provide letters of recommendation for members of the fellowship travelling outside the National borders
- » Plan and organize annual Council meetings; Annual General Meetings and other meetings involving different chapters such as Open Gates and Global Apostolic & Prophetic Summit..
- » Execute other policies, resolutions and deliberations of the Governing Council
- » Recommend to the Governing Council, issues which require its attention.

- » Ensure the generation and maintenance of a detailed data bank of membership for the purpose of production of annual directories.
- » The International President and Members of the Global Executive Committee shall oversee the global network on behalf of the Global Governing Council and Trustees.

National Board of Trustees

- » International Ministers Fellowship shall have a minimum of 3 and maximum of 5 senior ministers who will hold the vision shared by the visionaries in Trust to ensure there is no diversion or derailment.
- » These shall act within the ordinary and regulatory meaning of the word 'Trustee' and serve as Board of Directors where that is the nomenclature in the national jurisdiction.
- » They shall exercise due diligence to ensure that all regulatory requirements concerning the Fellowship are met with regulatory authorities at the National and State levels.
- » They shall, on behalf of the Fellowship sign relevant documents.
- » Trustees of the Fellowship shall take charge of each and every asset and ensure that such are accounted for as and when required.

The National Advisory Council

- » This is a body of elect ministers who have attained seniority by reason of long walk with the Lord and consistency in serving the Lord in His vineyard, braving all manner of odds in the process. The Advisory Council shall fulfil the following responsibilities:
- » Members shall make themselves available to bring their individual wisdom and insight available to the Executive Council and brethren on any issue of interest.
- » Members shall make their corporate wisdom available to the Fellowship on issues of Doctrine and biblical standards so that errors are not allowed to creep in.
- » Members of the Advisory Council shall offer themselves as instruments of mentoring younger ministers who desire same.

- » Members of the Advisory Council shall be available to teach, exhort and minister to brethren at major conferences and meetings.
- » The Council shall arbitrate on issues or brethren at dispute within the Fellowship.
- » The Advisory Council will function as the National Ordination Board of the Fellowship to ensure that members who desire to be ordained and licensed in ministry are properly processed and supported to attain same.
- » The President, Deputy President and Secretary General shall be co-opted members.

The National Executive Committee

This shall be made up of ministers elected by the Holy Spirit through the visionary and trustees to direct affairs of the Fellowship to ensure attainment of its purposes. Though assigned specific portfolios, the Executive shall operate as a core group and act in unity according to 1 Corinthians 1:10. Those to be installed into office will be first tested during a one year probationary period. Those who meet standards of excellence prescribed by the Trustees will be formally installed into office to serve out the remaining two years that makes a full term. In cases of excellent service, an officer may be given opportunity to serve another term of office.

A. The National President

This officer shall model servant leadership of the Fellowship and in so doing chair meetings of the Executive Committee, the General monthly meetings.

- » Coordinate the work of all the officers and organs within the remit granted him/her to ensure synergy
- » Act as official spokesman of the Fellowship
- » Provide spiritual leadership and direction according to the scope delegated by Trustees.
- » Ensure that all the objects of the Fellowship are attained.

- » Embody biblical leadership principles and motivate all officers to follow
- » Function as delegated by the Board of Trustees and shall walk in alignment with them and the Advisory Council

B. The Deputy President

- » This officer shall work closely with the President to provide leadership and take responsibility for providing inputs into policy formulation and assisting the President in spiritual formation amongst the membership.
- » Deputize for the President in his absence.
- » Chair the ethics and ministerial discipline subcommittee of the Executive which meets on ad hoc basis to consider and deal with reports of misdemeanour or moral failure filed against any member or officer.
- » Execute further responsibilities assigned to him by the President.

C. Secretary General

This officer shall be responsible for:

- » Recording proceedings of various organs of the Fellowship other than the Board of Trustees
- » Ensure proper safekeeping of all documents of the Fellowship
- » Assist the President to coordinate the various organs of the Fellowship
- » Assist the President to ensure adequate membership services is rendered
- » Maintain a working register of all registered members with such information as are considered necessary to give them adequate service.
- » The Secretary General shall be a signatory to accounts of the Fellowship
- » The Secretary General shall oversee the secretariat and ensure adequate human and material resourcing of all officers and organs of the Fellowship by providing what they need to excel.

- » Organize an integrated calendar of annual conventions of members so that clash of dates and events are avoided.

D. Treasurer

This officer shall be responsible for

- » Receiving, recording and safe keeping of all funds of the Fellowship
- » Shall be a signatory to accounts of the Fellowship
- » Shall maintain the relevant books of account
- » Shall cooperate with internal and external auditors
- » Shall ensure prudent utilization of unencumbered funds of the Fellowship so that the best possible returns on investment accrue to the Fellowship.
- » Perform such other responsibilities as assigned by the President.

E. Director, Family Development

This officer shall have specific responsibility for:

- » Making the family a prime concern of members of the Fellowship.
- » Receiving revelation concerning the subject matter and sharing same with the Body of Christ.
- » Conducting research into the subject matter for the benefit of the Body
- » Convening, with the approval of the Executive Committee, special meetings and conferences on family matters including knowing the will of God, courtship, marriage, parenting and ministerial family life.
- » Chair the Family First working group of the Fellowship
- » Execute other responsibilities assigned by the President.

F. Director, Business, Professional and Public Affairs Network

This officer shall have specific responsibility for

- » Advancing the concept of priesthood of all believers in the Fellowship

- » Encourage members of the Fellowship to train, equip and release brethren in their churches into productive ministry
- » Provide a platform for business, professional people and public servants such as Christians in politics, councillors, Members of Parliament to be trained to understand that they are on divine assignment as ministers in the market place
- » Chair the Business, Professional and Public Affairs network through which brethren of such standing from various churches pool their strength together to have a distinct voice and make maximum impact
- » Perform such other functions as delegated by the President

G. Director, Church Growth

This officer shall have specific responsibility for:

- » Fanning the flame of revival amongst membership of the Fellowship
- » Keeping members of the Fellowship in full consciousness of the primacy of the Great Commission
- » Conducting training and impartation sessions for evangelists, ministers and members of their evangelism teams
- » Chair the Church Growth working group of the Fellowship
- » Coordinating group evangelistic campaigns/crusades in various boroughs across the nation through which multitudes stream into the Counties
- » Perform such other functions as delegated by the President.

H. Director, Prayer and Spiritual Warfare

This officer shall be responsible for:

- » Stoking the fire of prayer amongst members of the fellowship through a variety of media including the Internet, prayer sessions of Fellowship meetings, telephony, text messages, etc.

- » Conducting prayer and spiritual warfare training sessions for intercessors and prayer warriors of member churches
- » Design and oversee implementation of a prayer and spiritual warfare shield for members of the Fellowship; the Body of Christ in the area, the government and civil society including issues of public safety and the making and implementation of just laws.
- » Chair national Prayer and Spiritual Warfare Network
- » Ensure effective networking with other Kingdom prayer movements.
- » Perform other responsibilities as may be assigned by the President.

I. Director, Next Generation Project

This officer shall have responsibility for

- » Chairing the Next Generation Project which will develop policies and strategies for engaging youths born of Christian and ministerial homes with the faith of their parents in order to secure a godly leadership for the next generation. The committee will also explore ways and means that the full Gospel can be preached to reach youths of the nation irrespective of their colour or background.
- » Lead the IMF effort to embrace and encourage young ministers to take their rightful place in the on emergent revival.
- » Enable young ministers to find acceptance and support within the Fellowship
- » Ensure that the Fellowship is youth friendly.
- » Constantly remind ministers to invest in the next generation in their churches and the community.
- » Organize various programmes designed to empower youths in the Body of Christ and communicate with them through retreats, conferences, Internet, pod casts, literature, CDs, DVDs, etc
- » Provide research reports and proposals to local and national governments
- » Perform such other responsibilities as may be assigned by the President.

J. Director, Women In Ministry

This officer shall have responsibility for

- » Chairing the Women In Ministry working group that will constantly develop actionable, biblical concepts for ensuring that the priesthood of all believers and the endowment of power upon prepared vessels both of which occur in the realm of the spirit, irrespective of gender, is constantly kept in the public domain so that the Body of Christ sets aside traditions of men and remove all limits to women in ministry.
- » Through the Women in Ministry working group, she will organize various educative and enlightenment programmes designed to equip them for ministry and excel in their lives, families and callings.
- » Ensure that women who are called to ministry receive practical encouragement, support and assistance to yield to God.
- » Ensure that women in ministry love, appreciate and strengthen each other
- » Ensure that a calendar of various women events in the country is produced and circulated to avert clash of events/dates and that female ministers in the fellowship participate in events organized by various women ministries connected with IMF or which the Fellowship connects with.
- » Organize retreats, seminars and conferences for women in ministry
- » Perform other responsibilities assigned by the President.

K. Director of Mobilization

This officer shall have responsibility for

- » Developing strategies for promoting the work of the fellowship to ministers of like faith who need to know.
- » Reach out to such people, invite them to Fellowship meetings and follow them up until they are properly integrated.
- » Recommend Coordinators at State and City levels who will act as mobilization officers in their localities as well as rallying points for local chapters.

- » Chair the mobilization committee of the Fellowship.
- » Perform other functions as may be assigned by the President.

L. Director of Special Duties

This officer shall be responsible for

- » Performance of special assignments in the Fellowship
- » Develop and advise on strategies for fulfilling the mandate of the fellowship and examine legal implications of Fellowship projects
- » Undertake assignments such as liaison with external bodies
- » Property acquisition and or development/redevelopment
- » Liaison with special interest groups, other networks and kingdom oriented organizations the Fellowship should relate with.
- » Perform other functions as may be assigned by the President.

M. Director of Communication

This officer shall be responsible for

- » Designing a communication strategy for relating with the various publics of the Fellowship
- » Design and execute various promotional and marketing strategies for selling the Fellowship to its stakeholders
- » Develop rapport with the mass media and ensure effective liaison
- » Advise the Fellowship on sponsorship opportunities
- » Ensure that the Fellowship enjoys a house style for easy identity.
- » Oversee the website, newsletter, TV/Radio and other media outlets.
- » Perform such other functions as may be assigned by the President.

N. Director of Community Engagement and Social Action

The officer in charge of this portfolio will:

- » Function concurrently as The National Director of We Care International, the non-Governmental Organisation established by International Ministers Fellowship. We Care shall function as a Kingdom agency serving the whole Body of Jesus in the nation with a distinct Board and registered as a Charity/Non profit.

- » Be responsible for challenging all Leaders, ministries and ministers connected to International Ministers Fellowship to go beyond their locations and meeting places and take the Church to the Community where it demonstrates the love of Jesus our King to the most vulnerable and marginalized individuals in the society more so as the social safety net of governments world-wide seems broken.
- » Be responsible for challenging all Leaders, ministries and ministers connected to International Ministers Fellowship to go beyond their locations and meeting places and take the Church to the Community where it can fulfill the biblical injunctions of Matthew 25:31-46 and Matthew 5:13-16
- » Be responsible for challenging all Leaders, ministries and ministers connected to International Ministers Fellowship to go beyond their locations and meeting places and take the Church to the Community where it demonstrate true Compassion as a critical aspect of Kingdom life and ministry which is often neglected or downplayed by the Body of Christ world-wide
- » Be responsible for challenging all Leaders, ministries and ministers connected to International Ministers Fellowship to be instruments Holy Spirit uses to inspire, advocate and challenge ministries and Churches world-wide to do likewise within their spheres of Kingdom influence

O. Scope of Activities of We Care International Officer:

We Care International in the nation shall concentrate on sectors of the populace who are most affected by social and economic imbalance and effects of natural disasters. These includes but not limited to generating Kingdom responses to these issues:

1. **Poverty:** Studying the root causes; proposing short, medium and long term solutions for alleviation and eradication amongst the general populace and in the Church.

2. **Prostitution and Sex Trafficking:** Studying the root causes and proposing short, medium and long term remedies to change the lives of practitioners and root such out in targeted communities.
3. **Social abuses against women especially rape in times of Peace and War:** Proposing ways to sensitize society on these evils.
4. **Child Trafficking:** Weigh in with the process of stamping out this great evil
5. **Homelessness:** Short, Medium and long term remedies
6. **Widowhood:** Proposing and activation of short, medium and long term strategies
7. **Natural Disasters:** We Care shall coordinate responses of the Kingdom Church to provide immediate, mid and long term assistance to victims of Earthquakes, Tsunamis, Flood; Adverse weather and the like
8. Undertake Kingdom responses to other social issues which are prevalent in society of the national jurisdiction of International Ministers Fellowship.

Nature of Activities

The officer who heads the Directorate of Community Engagement & Social Action will work to bring the IMF-National Chapter and We Care to engage in these activities:

1. **Advocacy.** We Care shall be vigorous in calling upon Governments at all level and United Nations and its agencies to consider, plan and do more to reduce poverty as a way of life
2. **Education & Training.** Seminars, workshops and various training courses shall be mounted by both the International Headquarters and country Coordinators towards sensitization and education on the wider implications to society when an increasing number of people feel marginalized and denied access to the good things of life.

3. **Direct action.** We care shall initiate and execute projects within the ambit of available resources
4. **Support.** It is not always that We Care is able to initiate projects. In some cases, it will support various local or national initiatives through provision of grants and other means of support including provision of wider platforms of exposure and publicity which will provide breakthrough.

P. Ex- Officio

Ex Officio officers include all City or Regional Coordinators of the Fellowship in addition to not more than four people chosen on the merit of the grace of God on their lives. It must be noted that in the Fellowship, couples minister together in the same office, provided the spouses concerned live right and show a great sense of responsibility. National chapters that are still growing can put in place what is required to take off and fill the vacancies as the Lord brings more committed people into Fellowship.

Q. Administrative Director/Secretary/Officer

Subject to need and resource availability, the Fellowship shall engage the full time services of an Administrative staff who, depending on experience and capacity may be designated Administrative Director/ Secretary/Officer. His/her responsibilities for day to day management shall be defined by the Executive Committee.

Meetings

1. 1. The National Advisory Council & Executive Committee – Officers of the Fellowship shall make good use of technology to ensure that communication is smooth and functional. Accordingly, the Fellowship shall avail itself of Conference call telephone lines; Skype, face book, group mail and other video conferencing facilities that are free or cost effective. Where necessary, officers

shall leverage special occasions that bring them together to schedule meetings.

2. Regular live meetings of the Fellowship will take place at State and City chapter levels, due to the logistics of the vast territory.
3. General Fellowship meetings will tap into modern technology including conference calls, video telephony, webcasts, and face book groups to ensure adequate communication.

The General Congress/Convention

This is the annual convention of the International Ministers Fellowship and may be held once or twice a year as the Trustees will direct as led by Holy Spirit. It is a time of

1. Deep spiritual introspection into personal Christian life.
2. Enhance Quality of ministerial lifestyle and labour in the Lord's vineyard
3. Spiritual refreshing in the presence of God
4. Warm fellowship with brethren of like faith and passion.
5. Strong exposition of the Word and receiving fresh insights thereof
6. Receiving the fullness of 5 fold ministry as Apostles, Prophets Evangelists, Pastors and Teachers are used of the Lord to bring perfection, correction, guidance and encouragement (Eph.4: 11,12).
7. Transacting any due ordinary or special business listed on the agenda including receiving, discussing and approving annual budgets, reports or receiving the leadership team that is presented for the Fellowship.

State/City Chapters

For logistic purposes, brethren living within geographic territories such as States or even cities shall be encouraged to constitute Area chapters. These will act on behalf of the Executive Committee to:

1. Ensure warmer inter-personal loving relationships amongst members of the Fellowship so that the world is made to see the power of unity.
2. Provide a platform for joint action to tackle existing spiritual, social and economic challenges prevalent in the area.
3. Promote deeper understanding of the gifts and callings of each other so that brethren can utilize same in pulpit exchanges to ensure that the flock of Jesus Christ is well nourished.
4. Act as instruments for affirming information required for purposes of issuing references and or recommendation letters.
5. Brethren located within such environments shall support and strengthen each other so that together they all can be fulfilled and succeed.
6. Area chapters shall be vital instruments of promoting the work of the Fellowship and inducting prospective members.
7. In all things, State/City shall focus strongly on catalysing revival.

State/City chapters shall have officers and offices modelled after the national chapter making allowance for local peculiarities-.

Effective Membership

For effective participation, members of the Fellowship are expected to:

1. Attend the Annual Congress, special and ordinary meetings
2. Participate effectively in the monthly School of Ministry Project designed to ensure continuous ministerial education and training

which enables them to be personally ministered to, revived and thus instruments of reviving the flock of Jesus Christ committed to their trust.

3. Reach out in love to other members, make friends, relate as ministers, exchange pulpits based on the leading of the Holy Spirit.
4. Honour invitations to special programmes of others; contribute to enable others achieve their God given dreams; speak well of others.
5. Utilize the logistics and facilities of the Fellowship according to need: ordination, ministerial licence, attestation letters
6. Use the network effectively to fulfil their Acts 1:8 mandates in short term missions and church planting projects across the world by sincere and transparent relationship with brethren in territories they are led to.
7. Support the Fellowship as they are led, promote it and invite friends!
8. Live a life that is above reproach, in love, faith, holiness and righteousness.
9. Serve in any of these functional committees where they have deep spiritual or professional capacity:
 - Spiritual Formation/School of Ministry
 - Family First
 - Prayer & Spiritual Warfare Network
 - Church Growth
 - Business, Professional & Public Affairs
 - Women in Ministry
 - Next Generation Project
 - Mobilization
 - Communication
 - Special Projects
 - We Care International (National Chapter)
