**Endangered Species:** A species of animal or plant that is seriously at risk of extinction


**Environmentally friendly:** Something that does not harm the planet


**Hummingbird:** A small nectar-feeding tropical American bird






### DIRECTIONS: THE HUMMINGBIRD STORY

- 1. Once upon a time there was a little egg. Draw a small spot for the egg.
- 2. The egg was sitting inside of a round nest. Draw a circle around the spot.
- 3. The nest was on top of a long skinny branch. Draw a line that comes to point and back to the nest.

- 4. This nest was next to a big pond. Draw an oval for the pond.
- 5. The day the egg hatched was a very windy day. In fact, there were waves on the water from the wind. Draw wavy lines in the pond.



6. It was so windy that the two clouds in the sky flipped upside down! Draw a straight line, with a curved line underneath it for the cloud. Repeat for the second cloud.



- 7. It was so windy that day, that the wind knocked two little branches off a tree. Draw straight lines for the two tree branches.
- 8. When the branches fell, a bunch of mosquitos flew up above the pond. Draw dots for the mosquitos.
  - 9. There was a little frog on the edge of the pond who was so excited to eat the mosquitos, he jumped up and down FOUR times! Draw four dips at the edge of the pond.







THAT'S HOW THE HUMMINGBIRD HATCHED FROM HIS NEST!


# **CONTINUE DRAWING**

10. Draw a funky flower. Use the lines and shapes we've created as inspiration to create your unique funky flower for your hummingbird!










12. Color in your hummingbird and flower. Use bright colors and the line techniques you've practiced to color in your hummingbird and flower.


Use your imagination to draw a background however you'd like!









Cut out shapes with colored paper and glue them together to create a unique background!
