His strong spiritual and moral character became increasingly evident as he matured.

His selfless demeanor, integrity, and generosity became well-known to his classmates.

He was elected President of his senior class at Woodward Academy and Student Body President at Georgia Tech.

All who know Tyler are aware of his unconditional, profound commitment to America's military.

After earning dual degrees from Georgia Tech, he became an active-duty 2nd LT at Fort Benning.

He was selected to train as an Airborne Ranger. After serving two years in Korea, his unit was redeployed to Kuwait and then to Iraq.

Tyler was killed in AR Ramadi, Iraq September 14, 2004.
