**MINUTES OF MORGAN TOWNSHIP
March 3, 2026**

CALL TO ORDER: At 4:00 p.m. Jeff Sholtis, Chairman, called the regular monthly meeting of the Morgan Township Supervisors to order in the municipal office building located at 1019 Third Street Extension, Mather, Greene County, Pennsylvania. The meeting opened with the pledge to the flag.

ROLL CALL: Supervisors David Harshman and Kolby Kendall were present. Also attending the meeting was Diane Tedrow, Candace Kingan, Sandy and Carl Kibler, Stacy Sholtis, Michele Harshman, Susan Nelson, Code Enforcement Officer Mark Gordon, Solicitor Dennis Makel and Secretary/Treasurer Relda Litten.

APPROVE MINUTES: A motion was made by Mr. Harshman with a second from Mr. Kendall to approve the minutes of the February 3, 2026 meeting and the motion carried with all in favor.

PUBLIC COMMENTS: Ms. Nelson asked if the township was going to have clean up days this spring. She also asked about Data Centers and AI in the township, too.

REPORTS: Roadmaster: Mr. Sholtis gave his report for the month. The township has removed ice from the roads during the Mather Apartment fire. The Red Cross now has Morgan Township as a warming center. During the fire, one resident confined in a wheelchair lost his chair and someone donated one to the fire company that the township fixed and delivered to him. Work has been done on the backhoe, bucket truck and red Peterbilt. They removed snow drifts and took down and stored the Christmas Lights for Jefferson Borough. They had a meeting with the new board of the Jefferson Volunteer Fire Department and were pleased with what is going on. They had a meeting with K2 Engineering to discuss water and sewage grants. No grants were issued yet for Hull Run Road and Meadowbrook Road. A stop sign was fixed and they cleaned up debris along the Mather Apartment building. Also 515 gallons of diesel was used in February. Roads in Mather have started to be swept of stones. Trash has been cleaned up along Reservoir Hill Road. Snow has been removed and a few military banners have been fixed and replaced. A scholarship program has been established for Greene County with one person from each school being selected.

LEGAL: Mr. Makel stated that there are two upcoming hearings on March 16th and he would like the all or some of the supervisors to attend.

CODE ENFORCEMENT OFFICER: Mr. Gordon gave his report for the month. He has issued one citation for a vehicle; attended two hearings, one for Demaske and one for Yocobet, both were withdrawn; investigated four previous complaints and send three notices out for vehicles. He also has upcoming training on March 9-11.

ORDINANCES, RESOLUTIONS AND LOT SPLITS: None

UNFINISHED BUSINESS: The cameras for the office are still on hold.

NEW BUSINESS: A discussion was held on a new Tax Collector system that Jefferson Borough has implemented from ALLPAID which will allow residents to pay their taxes using a credit card. Mr. Makel stated it is a good thing and recommended it for Morgan.

A letter was read from K2 Engineering regarding the demolition of the Mather Apartments which can begin on March 9th or 10th.

Clean Up Days will be held on May 1, and May 2, Friday and Saturday from 7:00 am to 3:00 p.m.

BILLS AND PAYROLL: A motion was made by Mr. Harshman and seconded by Mr. Kendall to pay all the bills and payroll for the month of March and the motion carried with all in favor.

EXECUTIVE SESSION: None

PUBLIC COMMENTS: Ms. Kibler asked again about fixing the fire siren in town.

Ms. Nelson thanked the supervisors for sweeping the streets and cleaning up the garbage along Reservoir Hill Road.

Ms. Kingan asked about street signs for Teagarden Homes and if the chest on the township parking area is going to be removed.

ADJOURNMENT: Being no further business, the meeting was continued at the call of the chair at 4:26 p.m.
