CITYWIDE CLEAN UP

The City Wide Cleanup Day has been set for October 17th with a rain date of October 24th. All junk items can be disposed of, **free of charge**, by taking it to Cooley Sanitation at 307 Main Street from 8:00 a.m. – 1:00 p.m. No tires, liquids, yard waste, garbage, batteries or construction project materials will be accepted. White goods, such as washers, dryers, A/C's, stoves, refrigerators, freezers, water heaters, water softeners, dehumidifiers, furnaces, dish washers, light ballasts, microwaves, and humidifiers, will require a disposal fee of \$10 per unit. Monitors, printers, and copiers will require a \$1 disposal fee. If you are unable to get your junk items to Cooley's, they will pick your items up for a \$20 fee as long as they are placed outside of the house. This is a great time to get rid of unsightly junk that may have accumulated around our homes or back yards. City officials and residents really do appreciate you taking pride in your neighborhood. Please utilize this service to help ensure that the city is maintained in a clean, healthy, safe and attractive condition. Thank you in advance for your participation!

CITY TREE REMOVAL

The city & JBL Tree Service has done an assessment of city trees on the berm (between the sidewalk and the street). The City has hired JBL Tree Service to take down these damaged city trees. After all trees are removed, the stumps will also be removed and filled in with dirt. This will be done at no cost to the homeowner. Some of these trees may look good but they are cracked, split, dying, topped, or one side heavy. These trees will eventually die or fall onto homeowner property. Grundy County has been approved by FEMA, so, while there is funding available, we want to take care of these damaged trees. MIRACLE ON MAIN

Reinbeck's Miracle on Main event will be Friday, November 13th and Saturday, November 14th. The Park Board will be hosting Breakfast with Santa on Saturday morning from 8:00—12:00 at the Memorial Building for a free-will donation for the bathhouse. Due to COVID-19, the Memory Tree ceremony has been cancelled. There will be a tree in the lobby of Lincoln Savings Bank with tags honoring those who passed away during the past year. Anyone is welcome to bring an ornament to hang on the tree in memory of them. After the holidays come to close, we ask you to stop back to remove your ornament.

The Memory Trees have been a beautiful tradition for over 20 years and we thank everyone who helped us honor those family and friends who forever live on in our hearts. The large trees will no longer be used leaving 300+ ornaments to be claimed. If you honored a loved one in the past and would like the ornament back, they will be on display at Reinbeck City Hall starting Nov. 12 thru Dec. 11 for you to pick up. After that they will be donated to a local charity. Thank you!

GIVING TUESDAY

REINBECK'S LEASH LAW

A Reminder that the City of Reinbeck has a Leash Law. It is unlawful for any owner to allow an animal to run at large within the corporate limits of the City. This law also includes cats. There are a number of cats running at large that have collars and tags on. Please be respectful to the City Ordinance and also to your neighbors, whose garbage they get into.

COMPOST & BRUSH SITE RULES

Please only dispose of acceptable items at the compost and brush site.

Acceptable items at the compost site are leaves and yard & garden waste ONLY. Acceptable items at the brush site are trees & branches ONLY.

Security cameras are installed at the compost & brush sites. You will be fined if you are caught dumping any other items at the site.

ELMWOOD PARK SHELTER HOUSES

The bathrooms at Elmwood Park will be closed for the winter on October 19th. Reservations for the shelter houses can still be made after October 19th but the restrooms will not be available to use. You must contact City Hall to reserve a shelter. The keys can be picked up at City Hall Monday through Friday before 4:30 p.m. If your reservation is on the weekend, the key must be picked up the Friday before by 4:30 p.m.

SNOW ORDINANCE REMINDERS

So that the streets can be plowed, no person shall park, abandon or leave unattended any vehicle on any public street, alley or City-owned off-street parking area between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. during the months of November, December, January, February and March. It is the responsibility of the abutting property owners to remove snow, ice, and accumulations promptly from sidewalks. It is unlawful for any person to throw, push, or place any ice or snow from private property, sidewalks, or driveways onto the street. You will be charged if the city must go back and clean up in front of your property due to pushing snow in the street after plows have cleared the street. Thank you for your cooperation in allowing the city streets and alleys to get cleared in a timely manner.

<u>TREES</u> - Property owners shall keep trees trimmed so that all branches will be at least twelve (12) feet above the surface of the street and eight (8) feet above the sidewalks. These requirements allow residents to utilize the sidewalks safely and allow for garbage trucks and other service vehicles to utilize the streets without damage to their vehicles or injury to their employees. The homeowner will be charged if the city trims the branches. Fall is a good time to make sure your trees are in compliance.
