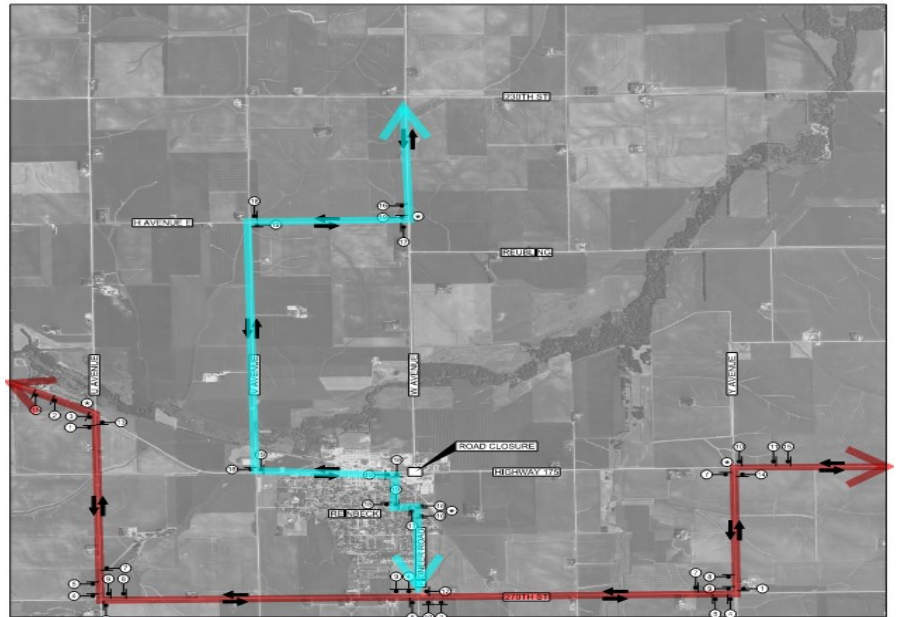

ORDINANCES TO REMEMBER

- Please remember to register your golf carts and equip them with the proper safety equipment.
- Grass is not to exceed 6" and is not to be mowed into the street. No noxious weeds.
- All vehicles stored on properties must have valid licenses and be operable.
- Trees are to be trimmed so that all branches are 12' above the surface of the street and 8' above the sidewalks.
- Burn days are Monday, Thursday, and Saturday 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. **NO BURNING UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE**

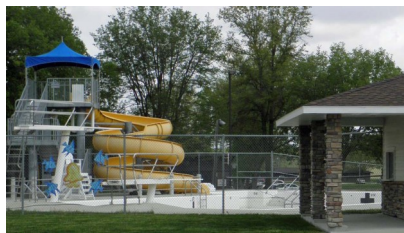

LEAD SERVICE LINE INVENTORY

Under the EPA's Lead and Copper Rule requirements, our community is gathering information to create a comprehensive inventory of potential lead and copper water service lines across our water system. To make this effort successful and provide safe, clean water to our residents, we encourage all to assist with these efforts.

Homeowners are asked to examine their home's incoming water service line and determine the material. If able to confidently report the material as copper, plastic, or lead, this information will help with the inventory reporting requirements. Typically, the water service line will enter a home through the basement before connecting to the water meter.
