Approves developer waivers without questions and refuses to tighten zoning laws	All waivers are challenged because they are publicly voted upon. Our Township is preparing for our next comprehensive plan, where zoning can be examined with community input.	Challenge waivers & tighten zoning laws
Does not question necessity of purchases and only obtains one quote	COSTARS program saves township funds (\$3,600 on average) by moving the competitive bidding process from the township to state responsibility and all residents have the ability to question spending. No plan to sunset the Land Preservation program despite \$8 million in account	I have written and discussed extensively on examining the Land Preservation program and a "final push" for landowners to participate (April 22, Facebook). With facts and information in hand, we can have neighborhood meetings to assess the need of the Earned Income Tax.	Consider timeline for sunseting Land Preservation Program and reducing EIT to support the program
No annual Review of Township vendors (Technicon, external auditor, solicitor) to ensure competency and value	Why just an annual review? Why not review every decision our vendors render and act accordingly	Perform annual review of Township vendors
No follow up or resolution to a majority of complaints	Create a process where all complaints are submitted in writing, via online or in person and open to "Right to Know" requests.	Ensure follow up and resolution of complaints
Refuses to examine options for local law enforcement within current budget.	Our population is on par with West Brandywine Township. Their police budget is the size of our entire budget, + \$100,000.
