- ✓ Research and participate in extracurricular activities and community service.
- ✓ Explore course options such as AP (Advanced Placement), honors, and IB (International Baccalaureate).
- ✓ Research occupational options. Develop relationships. Engage in career exploration visits.
- ✓ Find a mentor for personal growth and development, and for educational growth.
