A Legacy in Color: One Art Teacher's Journey Through Creativity and Community

For many, a single moment or person can change the course of their lives, from one dedicated art teacher to another. Carl's high school art teacher said that if he went back to college to become an art teacher, she would retire when he got his degree. Many years later, he is retiring at the end of this year.

His first day in the classroom may be a blur, but what stands out is the warm welcome he received as a new Cornjerker. "I was also hired as an Assistant Football coach," he says, "so I actually showed up to practice before school even started." From the beginning, he wore multiple hats, defining his flexible and community-focused approach throughout his career. Over the years, art education has evolved. "Technology now plays a big role," he explains. "Younger students don't like downtime—they need to stay busy." Still, his love for hands-on, engaging projects never wavered. Some of his favorite lessons were "Any time I can use Jerky to

get a lesson taught, especially during Homecoming Week," he says with a laugh.

When asked about standout students or unforgettable moments, he quickly replies, "Too many to list." However, one name that comes to mind is Alex Lugo, a former student who followed in his footsteps and now teaches art in Arcola. "Many of my students have used their artistic abilities in their careers," he says proudly. I'm unsure how many students I've taught over these years, but I cherish their conversations and hearing about their lives. "All I really want is for them to be successful citizens wherever they end up."


Perhaps the most rewarding part of the job has been witnessing artistic growth. "Watching them blossom as artists over the years makes me proud," he says. As for funny or heartwarming classroom stories, he says, "Too many to list!"

When it comes to what art can teach young people, he keeps it simple but powerful: "To try." He encourages his students to embrace mistakes and turn them into something meaningful. "Whatever they end up with is a work of art they created. **Create art, not problems**." His teaching philosophy centers on flexibility and resilience. "To survive! Be flexible. Make a difference in your students' lives," he says when asked how he defines success. Beyond

technique, he hopes his students leave his classroom with creativity, confidence, and the drive to do their best.

After years in the classroom, he looks forward to a slower pace in retirement—but not too slow. "I plan to drive the school bus and maybe sub," he says. "I also hope to hunt more and enjoy living in the country." And yes, art will still play a role. He immediately answers what he'll miss most: "The relationships you build with your students over time." His advice to future art teachers is both practical and heartfelt: "Be flexible, be patient, and utilize your sense of humor." And if he could go back in time? "Invest more!" he says with a knowing grin.

From humble beginnings to a lasting legacy, this art teacher's journey is a beautiful reminder of the impact educators make—not just with paint or pencil, but with compassion, creativity, and care.






