Introduction

I first met Tom Ziglar in August 1983. We were both incoming freshmen at Austin College in Sherman, Texas, and we were both moving into the same dorm. Even then, Tom was very much the same person that he is today – a man of deep faith who is motivated by opportunities to help others. In the years that followed, Tom modeled his Christian faith. And so it happened in December 1986, on a cold, rainy night, that Tom and his parents talked with me about their faith in God and some of the ways that it has shaped their lives. My faith was renewed that night, and my life changed as a result. Mostly I remember Tom’s father telling me the importance of the Bible to his life and faith. He placed a Bible in my hand and planted a seed in my soul. Written in his hand, the words continue to speak to me even today: “The best way to stay in the Will of God is to stay in the Word of God.”

Time and time again, I returned to this book, committed to the idea that the Bible should be read all the way through, from beginning to end. New in my faith, I began an annual tradition. Year after year, I resolved to read every day. Eventually, I made it all the way through the Bible. Rather than feeling like I had finished a project, I knew that something new had begun. I wasn’t even sure how to describe the book. “Ancient writings?” “Words of wisdom?” “A collection of books?” Only in time did I come to understand that the Word of God had apprehended my heart. Something new – something powerful – was at work in my life.

Make no mistake about it, reading through the Bible can be a life-changing activity. Done regularly, this can be a life-enriching, faith building act of Christian discipline. And the practice of reading the Bible is exactly that for many people. But for others, (many, Many, MANY others), their attempts to read through the Bible have been unsuccessful.

For many of us, our first attempts to read through the Bible goes like this: You resolve to read through the Bible in one year. (Usually beginning on January 1st). Then, after a strong start, the reading feels a bit more cumbersome. The familiarity of the creation stories give way to unusual (and maybe even unexpected) events. The city and region names sound a bit more foreign. The reading becomes a bit of a chore. Some make it all the way through the Gospels. Others read well into the Old Testament. But, eventually, most readers don't get all the way through the Old Testament History. And, from my experience, even if you get through the Bible in a year, you're then reading *The Revelation to John* at Christmas. These oddly paired messages hardly feel like a reward for a job done well.

You now have a reading guide that has been prepared with all of this in mind. So, you may ask, just how is this guide different from all the others?

This reading guide has been prepared with one objective in mind: to connect you with the Bible. Yes, it does subdivide the whole of the Bible – the texts of the Old and New Testaments – but, it does this with unique attention to the Bible's literature and narrative. This is different because the objective is not simply to read a chapter and to cross it off your list; though you certainly can do that. This Reading Guide was prepared with the Bible in one hand, and a calendar in another. Here are a few of the distinguishing characteristics of this guide:

- The readings begin in December – not in January – and they begin with the Gospel of Matthew. As a result, in the weeks leading up to Christmas, you will be reading the Gospels and their stories of Jesus. On December 25, you will read Luke 2 and its beautiful words of hope, “And the angel said to them, ‘Be not afraid; for behold, I bring you good news of a great joy which will come to all the people; for to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord.’” (*Luke 2:10-11*)
- Each book of the Bible is given time and space to speak for itself. Some of the writings are very brief. In the New Testament you will find the books of Philemon and Jude (25 verses each). But even these seem expansive when set next to 2 John (13 verses) and 3 John (15). Throughout the year, there are times when the length of the daily reading is reduced. Such brief readings may seem to work against the goal of reading all of the Bible in one year. But, this arrangement of readings reflects the value of connecting you with the Word of God.
- While the Bible is divided into 365 daily readings (like many others), the boundaries of the daily readings – the beginning and ending of each – were determined with consideration of the narrative flow. On some days, you will read complete chapters (for example, “December 1: Matthew 1-2”). On other days, your reading may begin or end in the middle of a chapter (e.g., “December 2: Matthew 3 – 4:16”).
- The reading guide is also distinguished by a related attempt to build a community of readers. Beginning in December 2018, I will attempt to post weekly videos to encourage us all to stay the course and to *Read On!*

Finally, I should acknowledge that the work of reading through the Bible in one year is exactly that – work. Having done this before, some years more successfully than others, I do have a bit of advice.

- The best translation of the Bible is the one that you will read. Find a modern translation that works for you. If you prefer the old formality of the King James Version (*KJV*) of the Bible (and can make sense of “*Thee*” and “*Thou*”), then this may be the best translation for you. If you prefer the more narrative reading of a different translation, then that is what you should read. For what it’s worth, my wife and our kids all prefer the narrative style of the New International Version (*NIV*). My preference is the English Standard Version (*ESV*).
- If you do not already have a Bible, or if you are curious about a different translation, you may want to begin by using an online service that allows you to read varying translations. For example, *Bible Gateway* is available on the internet (www.BibleGateway.com) or with an App for your smartphone. Once you settle on your preferred translation, I wholeheartedly recommend that you invest in a good, high quality printed copy and in an electronic version. I have bound Bibles on my desks at home and at my office. But my daily reader is almost always a smartphone or tablet using an app and bibles purchased from *Olive Tree* (www.OliveTree.com). Through the years, I have been pleased with their software. My purchases have endured through generations of technological innovation (from the Palm Pilot to the iPad), and allowed my notes and highlights to be visible on every platform. Please know that I have no

financial incentive to recommend *Bible Gateway* or *Olive Tree*. My only interest is helping you to find the resources that you need to stay connected with the Word of God. You should investigate your options and make purchases that best accommodate your needs.

- Be forgiving of yourself. If you happen to miss a day or two (or even months), resist the feeling that you need to pick up where you left off. All too often this leads to the feeling of being behind and the sense that you need to work *extra* hard to catch up. My best advice to you is this: pick-up with the reading for the correct date and simply *Read On!* At the end of the year, you will be glad that you did.
- Read the Bible as if you are reading it for the first time. Stay in the moment and allow yourself the luxury of focusing on the words that are before you. This can be hard to do. We all have preconceived ideas as to what the Bible *should* say. Or we may want to compare the current reading with something that we read elsewhere in the Bible. That kind of Bible study can be fruitful. But it is not the same thing as the gift received from simply reading and receiving the Word of God.
- Make a commitment to read through the Bible and then tell someone about it. Some people are motivated by the thought that a friend may ask about our progress.

Your commitment to read through the Bible is important. The Bible is more than a collection of ancient writings from far-away places. This is the Word of God. Even more than that, this is the Word of God for you. This discipline really can be a life-changing practice. My prayer for you is that you, your heart and your life, will be filled with the richest blessings of God.
