The Level III Police Science students earned their DUKE University TIP (Talent Identification Program) Forensic program certificate. Students have already completed units on physical evidence, digital composite sketches, latent fingerprints, handwriting analysis, casting tire tracks and footprints. The remaining modules include hair and fiber analysis, blood identification and stain pattern analysis. Students are required to complete a crime scene and solve the crime. All modules include a lecture from a DUKE professor, digital interactive module and actual physical labs and unit exams.

His final positions were the Cooperative Education Instructor and Adult Education Coordinator. He began at the Career Center in January, 1979 as the Distributed Education Instructor, in which he taught Color, Line and Design Display, Advertising, Salesmanship, Human Relations, Retail Math and Marketing Essentials.

The Distributive Education program later changed to Computerized Marketing & Management where Word, Excel and PowerPoint were added to the curriculum.

As the Cooperative Education Coordinator, Frank has worked with over 500 students on how to be responsible and professional employees at their shop specific co-op job site. He has also worked with over 300 employers during this time period. He has been a member of the Clarion Rotary since 2004 and was involved with taking Career Center juniors every year to the ROVA (Rotary Outstanding Vocational Award) Leadership Conference. Frank has also served as a mentor at the Career Center sharing his knowledge and experience to guide new Career Center instructors.

In 2009, Frank was named the PA State Co-Op Director of the Year. He later received the Laretta Woodson Award in 2018, which is given to an educator who is doing an outstanding job within their school district.

2022 Senior Recognition Program



The Clarion County Career Center returned to an in-person Senior Recognition program, which was held on Wednesday, May 18th at the Keystone Junior-Senior High School auditorium. The Class of 2022 had 94 seniors who were recognized at the awards ceremony.

Traci Wildeson, Director of the Career Center, led the event as the Master of Ceremony. The program began with the Pledge of Allegiance and the National Anthem, which was sung by soloist, Lauren Skelley-Grey.

Sixteen students were recognized for achieving an Advanced score on the NOCTI exam and thirty-seven students earned a Competent score. These students will receive a PA Skills Certificate. NOCTI is a performance assessment and is made up of a written test and hands-on test components. The NOCTI assessment allows students to demonstrate their acquired skills by completing actual jobs using the tools, materials, machines and equipment required in their program/occupation.

Additional recognition was given to students who were named to the National Technical Honor Society, those who competed in SkillsUSA events and HOSA competitions. **Kaylee LaVan** (Keystone) from Allied Health Science achieved second place in Nursing Assisting at the state level HOSA conference and will be competing at the International HOSA Leadership Conference, Nashville, TN in June.

Tom Spence from the Clarion Rotary Club was on hand to present the Thomas B. Burkhardt Rotary Scholarship Award of \$1000 to: **Mackenna Davis** (Union) in the Allied Health Science program and participated in the Cooperative Education program by working at Clarview Nursing & Rehabilitation. 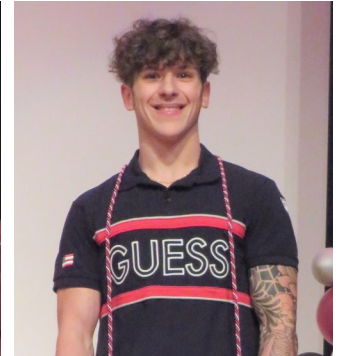
