Presentation

The calendar of the Church Orthodox Celtic begins Sunday after All Saints' Day and All Souls' Day (1 November). This choice reconciles two traditions: one linked to the Syrian Orthodox Church, which begins the liturgical year on the first Sunday of November (after All Saints' Day), and the other following an ancient Western, non-Roman custom. The calendar includes all the feasts and biblical readings of the liturgical cycle. It presents the saints of the universal Church as well as the principal saints who have illuminated the history of the Celtic Orthodox Church.

The liturgical year unfolds before us as a constant call to spiritual growth. The calendar responds "present" to this call to deepen our faith in Christ Jesus. The readings for Sundays and feast days are a centuries-old heritage that belongs to our spiritual patrimony.

The liturgical cycle was built up over time and established by our Fathers under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit. It is a divine-human work, providentially offered to our generation so that it may rediscover its spiritual roots in an increasingly de-Christianized world.

In this sense, this calendar is prophetic because, drawing on ancient Western sources predating the Carolingian reforms, it is simultaneously strikingly relevant today. This becomes very clear when we allow ourselves to be guided by this set of festivals and readings that punctuate our daily lives.

We hope that the liturgical cycle, lived day after day through biblical reading, understood as the Word of God, continuing to guide and challenge his people in history, will be a source of grace and strength throughout this year.

Fasting rule:

- ◆ Every ordinary Friday with bread and water.
- ◆ Exaltation of the Cross: day of fasting, unless the day falls on a Sunday.
- ◆ Advent begins on November 12th. On Sundays, the fast is partially lifted. Animal by-products may be consumed, except for monks who observe a strict fast until the Feast of the Nativity.
- ◆ Preparation for Great Lent: Ten days before Ash Wednesday, abstinence from meat. Dairy products and animal by-products are permitted until Shrove Tuesday. From Ash Wednesday onward: strict fasting (no animal products).

- ◆ Fast of the Dormition of the Mother of God: from 1stas of August 14th.
- ◆ Eucharistic: Morning Liturgy: from midnight
Liturgy for the Lenten season (6 hours before)

No fasting:

- ◆ From Christmas to the Presentation of Our Lord Jesus Christ in the Temple (Candlemas).
- ◆ From Easter to Pentecost.

Lenten services:

- ◆ From Ash Wednesday until Easter. The Eucharistic Liturgy takes place in place of Vespers, on Wednesdays and Fridays, (practice at the Cathedral of Our Lady of the Sign).
- ◆ The prayer of Saint Ephrem the Syrian during Lent is said at the end of all services from Ash Wednesday to Holy Wednesday. It is omitted from Friday after Vespers until Sunday inclusive, up to and including None.
- ◆ No Angelus during Holy Week.

CHow to Use This Calendar:

Reading of biblical references: For

example :

2 Co**3**4-15, 18-**4**1;**6**, 13 - 15a

2 Cor: refer to biblical abbreviations on page 9;

numbers in bold: chapters; following numbers: verses;

a dash between 2 Arabic numerals (4-15) means that we read from verse 4 to verse 15 inclusive;

a period (15. 18) means that we read verse 15 and skip to verse 18; a semicolon means that we change chapters;

[a] means the first part of the verse; [b], the second.

For the example given, we will read:

2eEpistle to the Covenants, chapter**3**from verse 4 to verse 15 inclusive; then from verse 18 to chapter**4**verse 1; then in the chapter**6**, from verse 13 up to and including the first part of verse 15.

Psalms:

We remind you that the numbering of the Psalms, indicated in this calendar, is that of the Greek translation of the Old Testament, known as the Septuagint.

We have begun a revision of the psalms for vigils and vespers of the major feasts. This work is ongoing and will continue throughout the year, with the aim of being ready for the 2026-2027 calendar.
