

SALUTING OUR FIRST PRESIDENT

At our first reunion, Sept. 5, 1914, Edgemont Park, Pa., one of the originators of this gathering, Reuben R. Oplinger, was elected as its first president. He served two terms. Reuben was the third child of Daniel, a grandson of John, and great grandson of ancestor Isaac. Born at Danielsville, Pa., Oct. 29, 1843, died Sept. 28, 1920 at Danielsville, and is buried in nearby Union Cemetery. Was married to Catherine Clewell, deceased, and had three children: Edith, Floyd, and Walter, also deceased.

He was a great family man, enthusiastic booster of our reunion and family history, a loyal Christian and a good citizen. It was largely due to his efforts that our reunions were started.
