In Loving Memoriam JOHN D. WATKINS

1871 - 1956

Among those who have contributed most to the Oplinger Family organization and perpetuation is John D. Watkins, who for many years served as a very faithful historian of the family and an officer of the Reunion. His work culminated in a volumious typescript history notable for its detailed original family history and photographs. It is now deposited with the Luzerne County Historical Society, in the public library at Wilkes-Barre, Pa. Years of assiduous work and travel went into its preparation; and his labor of love, entirely developed at his own expense, should be recognized for its true worth.

A member of the first Luzerne County branch of the family, John D. Watkins was descended through Nicholas, George, Reuben B., and Anna Laura Oplinger, being a great-great-great grandson of our progenitor, Claus Oblinger.

An expert auto mechanic, auto driver and astute business man, John D. Watkins was much travelled, nationally and abroad. Later he was in the gasoline service station business in New Jersey. Prior to his death he resided at Rumson, N. J.

To Mr. Watkins genealogy was an absorption; one that yielded large dividends to others. In recognition of the part he played in our family, we salute his memory with praise and honor. Ave et yale!
