In dedicating a memorial it is customary to have a young person perform the unveiling. When the memorial is of a family nature, special considerations are involved in selecting such a person.

Although often unrecognized in this country, each family has a titular head-the oldest living son of the oldest son of the oldest son, etc., of the progenitorcorresponding to the head of a Scottish clan. The oldest son of the titular head of the family therefore would be the most appropriate young person to unveil a family Our historian finds that Roy Uplinger, Reynoldsville, R. D. No. 3, Pa., the 5-great-grandson of Claus Oblinger, is the titular head of the Oblinger-Uplinger family. He is the president of the Jefferson County, Pennsylvania, reunion. He and his wife, Elsie (Dickey), have one son, James Uplinger.

Roy Uplinger, wife and son are with us today and James Uplinger was selected by the Executive Committee to unveil the Memorial Monument. His selection and attendance exemplify the far-reaching bonds of our family based on common origin and interest.

OUR MEMORIAL TRIBUTE

At last, in our 237th year in America, our family has accomplished a visible memorial project which was unveiled today at the Indianland Church graveyard, near Cherryville, Pa.

Erected by the local branch of our family association, with the financial assistance of the other three branches, this memorial provides a concrete common interest for the four family branches that will endure beyond the fleeting lifetime of concerned relatives. Its very existence provides a bench mark for future reckonings of family relationships and a focus for the common interest of our nationwide scattered family.

But the dedication of this monument is not primarily for our own gratification or benefit, or that of future generations. It is, instead, a tribute to, and an acknowledgement of, the debt to our nearly-forgotten forefathers. Obscure and handicapped in many ways, they nevertheless contributed much to the economic and political development of our country; and then sank into near-oblivion leaving only us, their descendants, as almost the only tangible evidence that they had existed.

By this memorial monument we rescue them from the general oblivion of the past and pay loving tribute to their eternal sterling worth. They had neither fame nor riches; but they bequeathed to us a heritage of ancestry which affords us a justifiable pride and to which we acknowledge our indebtedness. In imperishable granite stone this is written for the centuries to come to witness and remember, and for us to cherish and exemplify as worthy pioneers of our day and of the future, of family and country.
