THE FAMILY CREST

The HERALDIC CREST of the Uberlinger family was researched and reproduced in 1947 by our former Historian of 28 years -(1937 -1965) - William H. Rinkenbach.

This FAMILY CREST is registered on the rolls of the Society "Zur Katze" in Constance, Switzerland as of 1547. A framed colored hand drawn sketch is on display at the historical exhibit at the eating pavilion. The shield of white and blue is surmounted by a helm, topped by a head of a white greyhound with a blue mantle.
