

These hubs will serve as incubators for ideas and local action, empowering people to shift from passive observers to active participants in shaping a better world.



2. Understanding the Carrying Capacity of the Earth

- Each person must recognize that the Earth has finite resources.
- Our current consumption levels, particularly in wealthier nations, are unsustainable.
- If everyone lived like the U.S., we would need 5 Earths.
- If everyone lived like the **top 1%** of the wealthiest individuals, estimates suggest we would need at least **10 Earths**—and possibly far more due to luxury consumption, private jets, yachts, multiple homes, and high-resource lifestyles.
- A billionaire's annual carbon footprint can be a million times larger than that of the average person.
- Some of the ultra-rich have footprints exceeding **2,000 tons** of **CO2** per year, compared to the global average of **4–5 tons** per person.
- If this level of consumption were universal, Earth's resources would be depleted at an astonishing rate, far beyond what is sustainable.

Understanding the environmental impact of daily choices.






3. Defining a Just and Sustainable Standard of Living

Hubs will explore how to ensure these essentials are accessible to all while reducing excess consumption that harms the planet.

- **Skills training** (e.g., permaculture, renewable energy, cooperative business models, leadership, negotiation, and cooperation skills).



When we encounter gaps in our understanding, we must **continue to learn.**





The Hubs will:


