# Growth of Gangs



1. The UN has no statistics on gang growth by nations, and transnational gang growth.
2. Wikipedia lists [72 gang countries](#).
3. There are:
  - neighborhood-based gangs
  - national-level street gangs
  - prison gangs
  - outlaw motorcycle gangs
  - white nationalist gangs
  - transnational gangs
4. Gangs can be organized based on race, ethnicity, territory, or money-making activities, and are generally made up of members ages 8 to 22.


# Growth of Gangs



5. Most gangs are a group of people who claim a territory and use it to make money through illegal activities (i.e., drug trafficking).
6. When joining a gang, oftentimes there is an initiation that needs to be passed. This initiation is usually a violent crime that could include theft, gang rape, or drive-by shootings.
7. Gang members are more likely to be arrested or involved with drugs and alcohol than non-gang members.

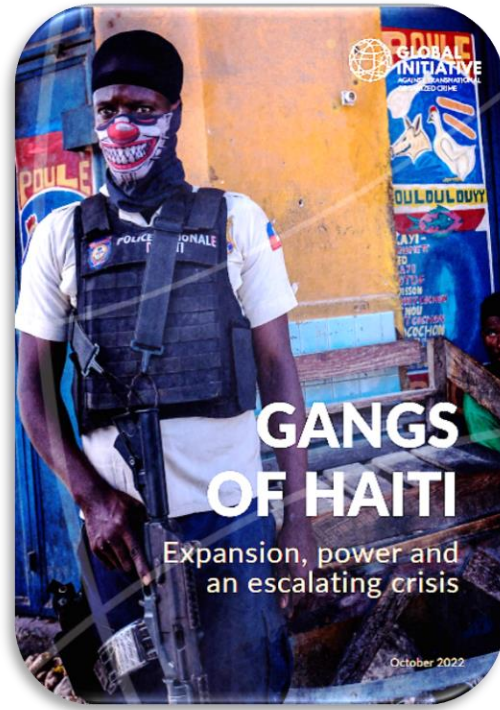
# Growth of Gangs

## Motivation for joining a Gang?

- History of Abuse or Neglect
  - Peer Pressure and Threats
  - Recognition- sense of respect and power
  - Social needs- sense of belonging "family"
  - Hero imitation
  - Gangs are glamorized by the media
  - For access to Money and Drugs
  - Non-conformist- live outside society rules
  - Problems at home
  - Low self-esteem

8. There are **33,000** gangs in the [U.S.](#), with over one million members. There are over **400** gangs in [Canada](#).
9. **86%** of US cities with a population of **100,000** or more report gang activity.
10. In recent years, gangs are participating in more non-traditional crimes such as prostitution, alien smuggling, and human trafficking, identity theft, and mortgage fraud.
11. These new, non-traditional crimes create higher profitability and lower visibility.

# Growth of Gangs



8. The transnational Mara Salvatrucha (MS-13) and 18th Street gangs continue to expand their influence in the United States.
9. These transnational gangs are present in almost every state and continue to grow their memberships.
10. They are now targeting younger recruits more than ever.
11. To counteract this growth, the [Transnational Anti-Gang \(TAG\) Task Force](#) initiative was established. TAG Task Forces are currently located in El Salvador, Guatemala, and Honduras.

- **Weak communities are places with lower communication, fewer resources, and less problem-solving to create wellbeing for their community members.**
- **They are places where gangs grow.**
- **With poor education, lack of guidance for youth, and weak community structures, gangs flourish.**
- **Gangs are growing worldwide in a culture of poverty.**

# Evolving Beyond Community Violence



There are many contributing factors to community violence.

Here are insights I gained from 50 years of working for communities – locally, nationally, and globally.

# 1. Culture



- **Children grow up seeing so much violence in the media.**
- **Many boys then enjoy playing with guns and sticks.**
- **They then enjoy playing computer games with violence.**
- **They grow up in a culture of violence.**
- **Parents don't know what to do about all this violence, so they don't talk about it**
- **Most parents seek to avoid conflict, so they don't communicate in authentic, compassionate, meaningful ways.**
- **Solving problems requires people to communicate in authentic, compassionate, and meaningful ways.**

## 2. Education



- **Children need to be guided in their schoolwork or they can easily fall behind.**
- **Many children need tutoring.**
- **Once they fall behind, it can harm their self-image.**
- **They can then feel sad about themselves.**
- **If a child feels sad about themselves, they are vulnerable to being picked on, and possibly lashing out with rage.**
- **Children can annoy each other and can then get into fights.**
- **Bullies are suffering from trauma and have a negative self-image.**
- **Hurt people, hurt people - so bullies terrorize other children.**



# Three Education Systems

Schools in the United States are mostly funding on local property taxes.

High-income and high-asset communities have greater funding, including for tutoring.

# Men & Women: Education & Work

## **Why Do Women Outnumber Men in College Enrollment?**

- For every man, there are now almost two women attending college.
- Why did female relative enrollment increase gradually since the 1960s?
- This is because fewer married women used to work in the market, so the investment aspect of college was not as relevant in the 1960s.
- As women increased their labor force participation over time, financial returns to college investment became more important, and more women chose to enter college to gain access to more lucrative careers.
- Women and men face different incentives and should be expected to make different choices.
- What these numbers reveal is that getting more education is an important way to close the gender pay gap.
- College entry—whether it is to get an AS or a BS—helps women gain access to careers where they have a comparative advantage (e.g., office work).
- Men on the other hand have better access to lucrative careers that don't require a college degree (e.g., construction work).
- This appears to be the most reasonable explanation for why women outnumber men in college.

# 3. Community



- **Gangs form in poorer communities, with few resources for healing and human development.**
- **Bullies in gangs then terrorize the community.**
- **Teens can then join gangs for protection.**
- **People then make money selling guns, drugs, and sex.**
- **Communities then become flooded with guns.**
- **Once guns are in the community, people become more afraid of each other.**
- **They stop communicating with each other.**
- **Without authentic, compassionate, caring, meaningful communication - relationships break down, and communities don't solve their problems.**

# 4. Relationships



- Many people are not in healthy, loving relationships.
- There is a lot of emotional frustration, loneliness, and anger.
- It takes a lot of work to form and sustain a healthy, loving relationship.
- Both people in a relationship must be committed to authentic, compassionate, caring, and meaningful communication to address their feelings and needs.
- The superficial, materialistic, and addictive culture we have creates images of great wealth as highly important, which then can become the goal for people.
- Women naturally seek the most prosperous, successful men for resources for their children.
- Many men may then feel rejected (INCELS Involuntary Celibates, MGTOWs Men Going Their Own Way).
- They may feel they are left with pornography for sexual satisfaction, which can then breed isolation.
- There is a lot of violence in pornography, that children and teenagers see.
- Some young men may not be socially engaged in a constructive way.
- Older men can become disconnected, angry, and resentful.
- Some men may take to conspiracy theories, guns, militias, and/or political “gangs”.

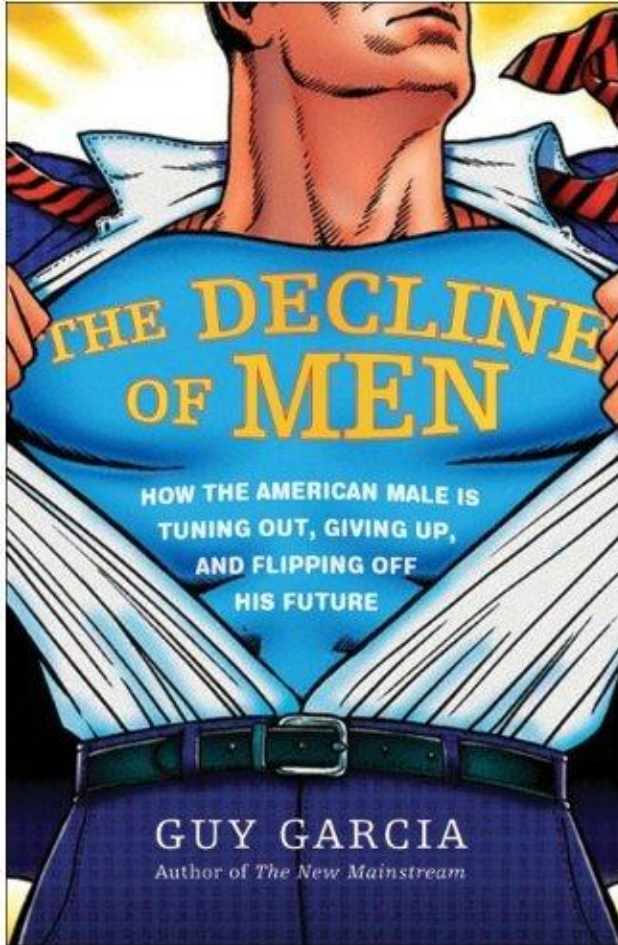
- Studies have shown that women are more attracted to wealthy men than they are men with average incomes.
- Men with high incomes and good jobs are 3.5 times more likely to attract women.
- Humans appear to have a preference for money and wealth in a partner because these things act as modern cues of a more general trait: the ability to **secure resources like food, shelter, tools, and protection.**
- Perhaps women would go for looks over resources if they didn't have to worry about the economic consequences of their mating choices.

# 5. What Is Happening To Men



- **Men cause most of the problems in the world.**
- **Close to 90% of the incarcerated in the United States are men.**
- **They really need help with psychosocial bonding, mental health, work, and family.**
- **If they don't have legal work, they get into trouble with burglary, theft, fraud, selling drugs and guns, sex trafficking, migrant smuggling, hijacking, piracy, kidnapping, militias, terrorism, and now money laundering, Internet scamming, and cyber-hacking.**
- **This has been ignored in the work to help girls and women.**
- **It comes back to hurt girls, women, families, communities, and society through more disconnected and unreliable men, gangs, organized crime, and violence.**

- Guy Garcia's "The Decline of Men" should be essential reading for everyone, not just men. If you've ever been pissed off at the way ads depict men as bumbling idiot bank machines, this book is for you.

# Crisis Facing Men

## **The Social And Economic Crisis Facing Men In America**

WBUR On Point

- The relative decline of men actually reflects women attaining more education.
- In almost every industrialized country, women are about 30% more likely to get a college degree than men.
- Historically, girls always did better than boys through primary and secondary school. And then boys went on to college, and women did not. It is important to understand it is not all just men declining. Women are rising, and that's good news.
  - It matters because we care about the welfare of all individuals.
  - It matters because it affects the people they would partner with, their potential spouses.
  - It affects their children.
  - It affects the level of crime incarceration.
  - It affects the tax base.
  - It affects our ability to grow and innovate in all kinds of ways.
- We are in this together. And the low rates of success of a big chunk of the population affect all of us. We should also be additionally concerned because this problem has gotten more pronounced over time.
- The employment prospects of less educated men, particularly less educated African American men have just gone south. That is just problematic on so many levels.
- You should be concerned about their potential spouses or partners and the children they will have. They can be disadvantaged by the choices of their parents.



# 6. Community Development



- **Civic skills and community development are not taught in schools.**
- **Community organizations need to be run well with effective board oversight, insight and foresight, and good bookkeeping and accounting practices.**
- **Pouring money into poorly managed and ungoverned community organizations is like pouring water into a bucket with holes in it.**
- **The leaders can look good, and sound good, but not be effective, efficient, and efficacious.**
- **Efficacious means meeting the right goals.**
- **A leader can actually seem effective and efficient, and not be efficacious, because he or she is not really meeting the right goals.**
- **Ineffective community organizations lead to stagnation in the community, and not addressing people's real feelings and needs.**

# 7. Addictions & Traumas



- Many people are not taught how to regulate their thinking and their emotions/feelings.
  - So, when they build up frustration, anger, sadness, and fear, and have confused thinking, they are in emotional and mental pain.
  - They can feel lost, lonely, and loveless.
  - Many don't have healthy goals, and good mentors to help guide them to reach their goals.
- 
- They then turn to addictive processes to numb their emotional pain and shut down their negative thinking.
  - Many people have had numerous traumas in their lives
  - Trauma memories become emotional trigger points, and they keep getting emotionally triggered.
  - They turn to addictions to numb the pain from the traumas.
  - They need to be taught how to heal their trauma with a daily practice of self-awareness, self-compassion, self-forgiveness, self-appreciation, self-kindness, and self-care.

# 8. Isolation & Disconnection



- Traumas and addictions lead to people disconnecting from each other and not working on community problems together to find solutions to address people's feelings and needs.
- People need to learn and practice communication skills, because if they're not authentic with each other regarding their feelings and their thoughts, then they end up not being authentic.
- People don't trust each other when they are not authentic.
- To stop violence, we need men and women who have the ability to communicate authentically, meaningfully, and compassionately, have legal jobs, and have healthy, loving relationships.

# 9. Housing Insecurity



- **Corporations and investors have bought up affordable housing, creating housing insecurity through super high rents and the inability for people to buy affordable homes.**
- **This can lead to men's inability to form and sustain healthy, loving relationships, opening them up to pornography, isolation, and illegal activities in gangs.**

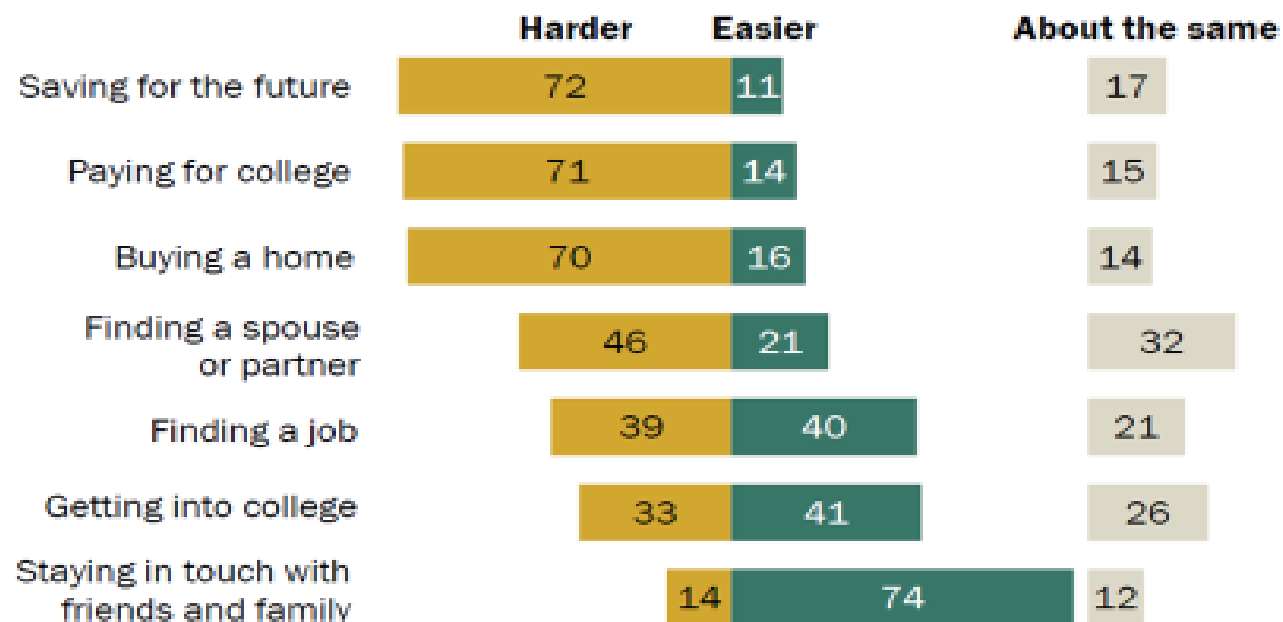
# Challenges for the Young

## **What is Community Mental Health?**

- Working towards increasing the acceptance of mental health patients by society.
- Improving rehabilitation opportunities for mental health patients.
- Discovering social root causes for mental illnesses.
- Developing social remedies for social components of mental illnesses.

## **The following social factors could potentially result in a period of poor mental health:**

- Childhood abuse, trauma, or neglect
- Social isolation or loneliness
- Experiencing discrimination and stigma, including racism
- Social disadvantage, poverty, or debt
- Bereavement (losing someone close to you)

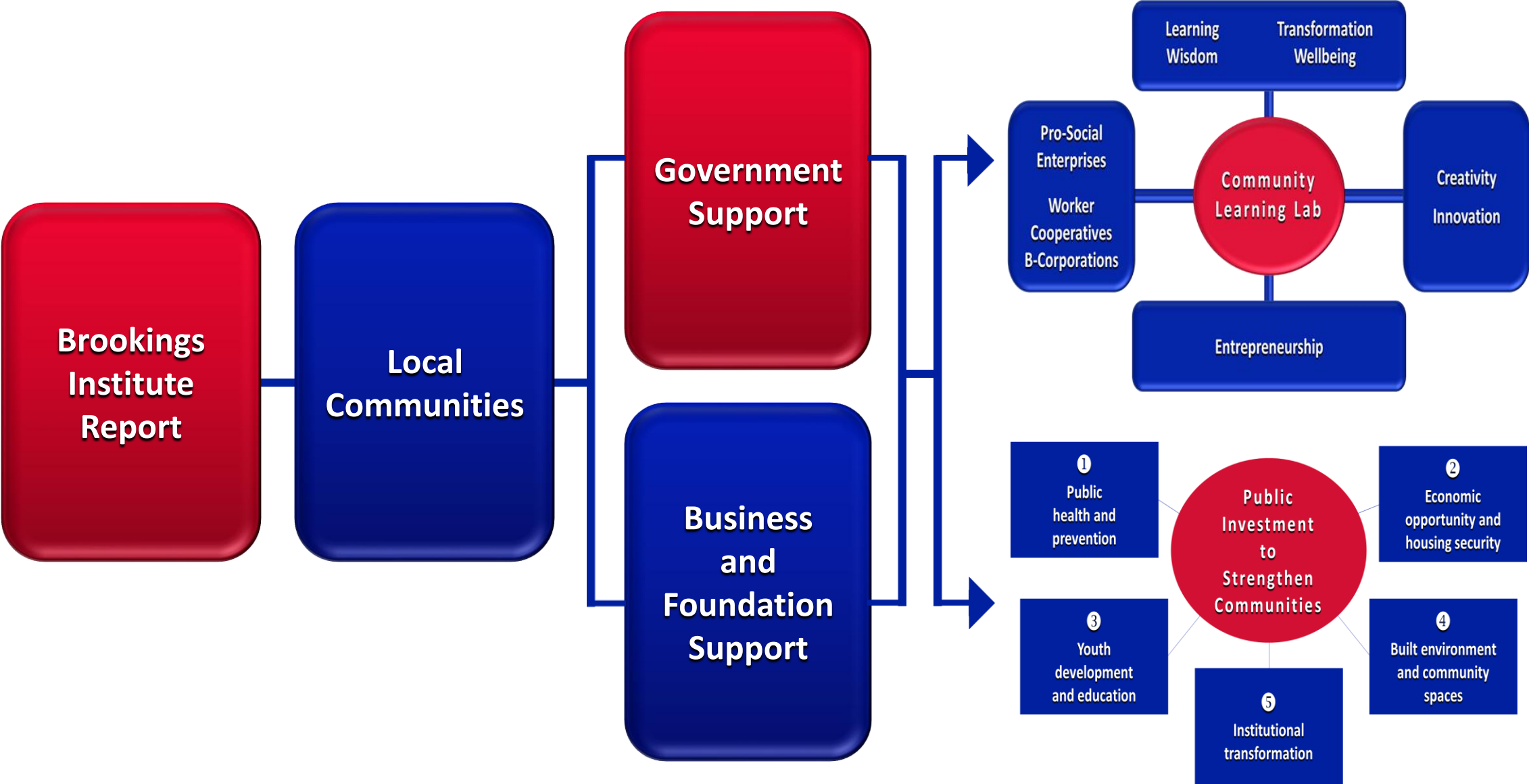

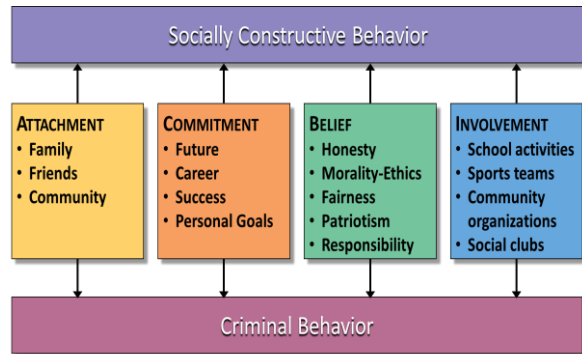

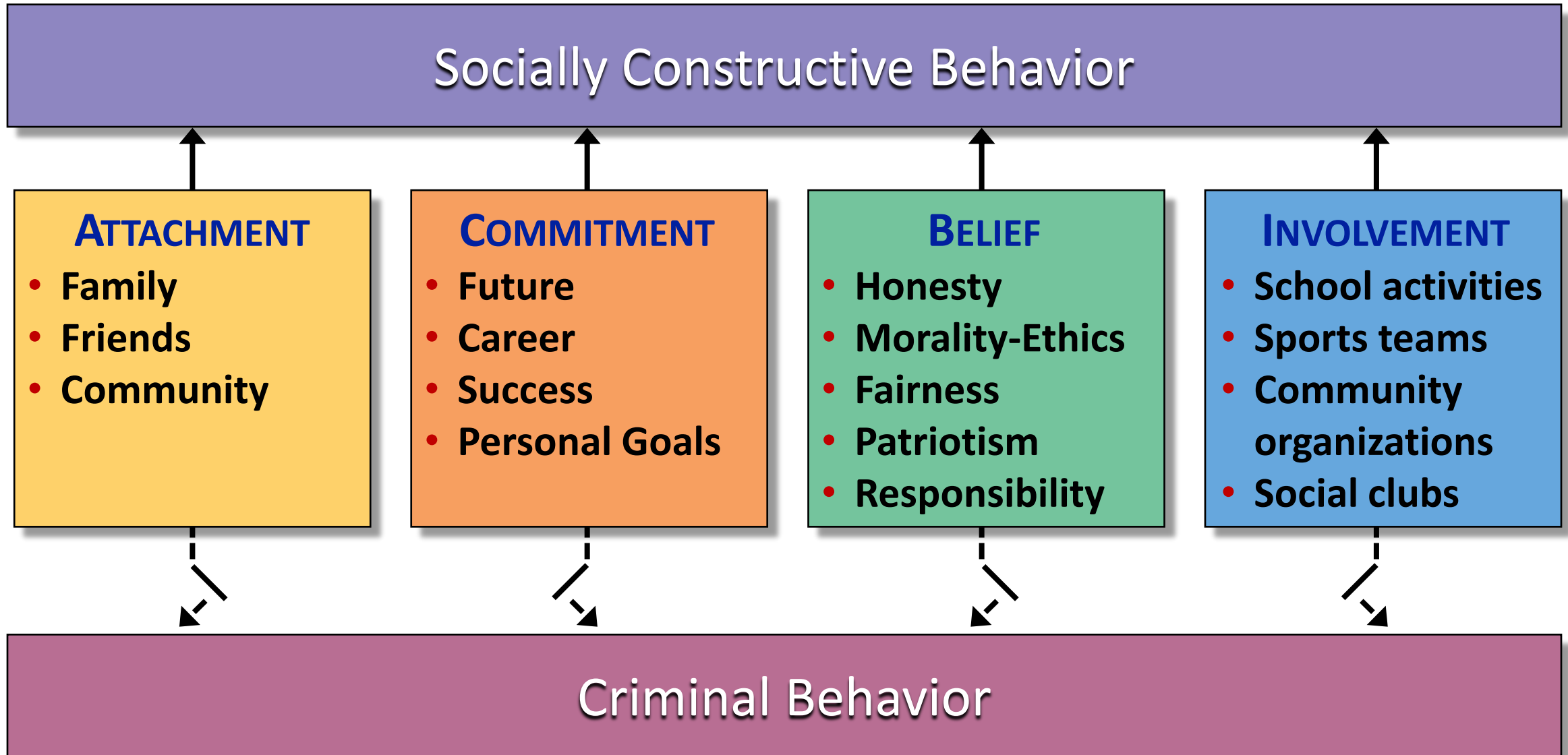


# Psychosocial Bonding



- Sociologist and criminologist Travis Hirschi (1935-2017) believed criminal activity occurs when an individual's attachment to society is weakened.
- This attachment depends on the strength of social bonds that hold people to society.
- Crime is a result of social institutions being irrelevant to individuals.
- Hirschi's *social control theory* suggested delinquent adolescents fail to develop societal bonds consisting of:
  - 1) attachment to parents, peers, and school
  - 2) occupational and educational commitment

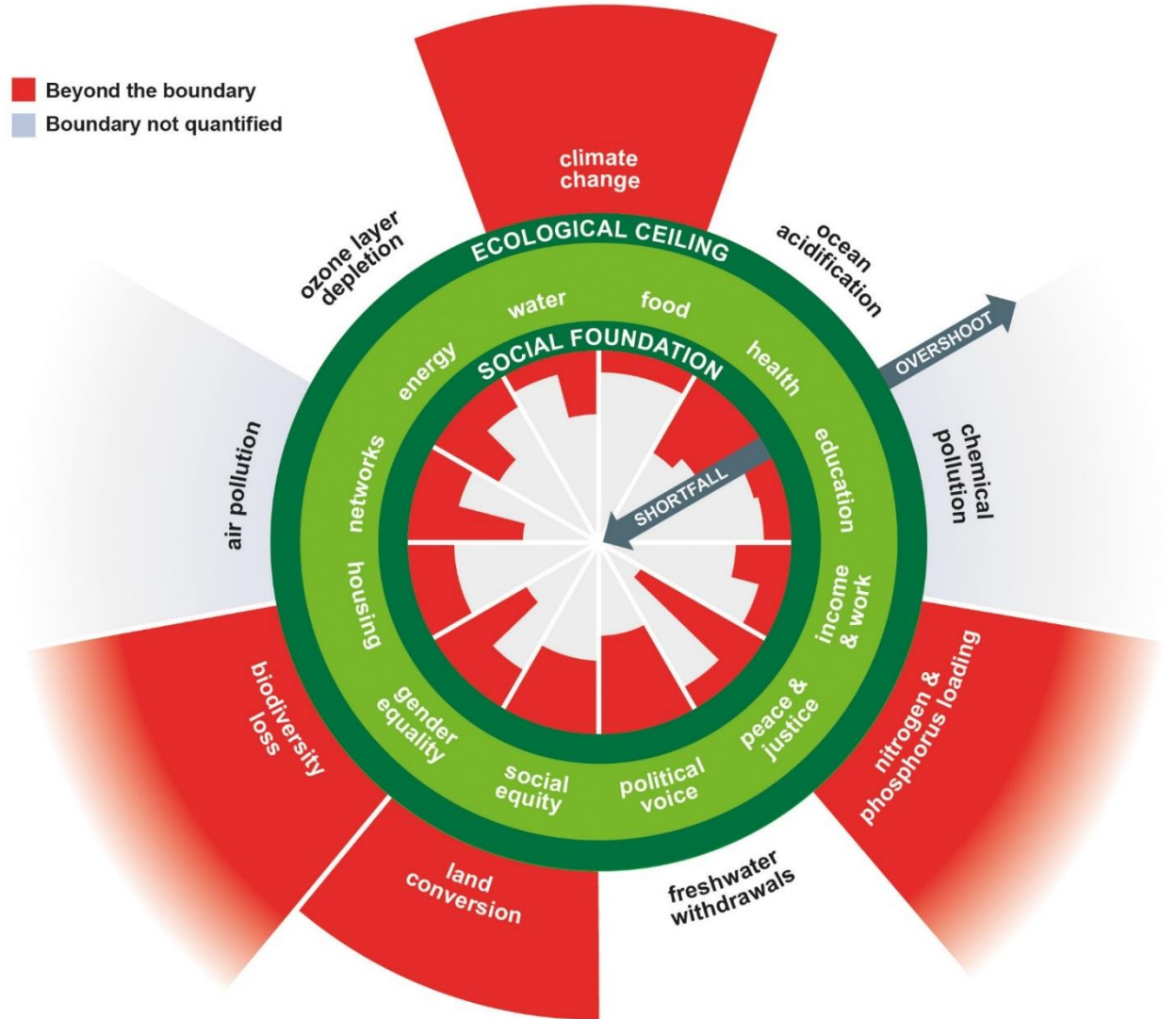
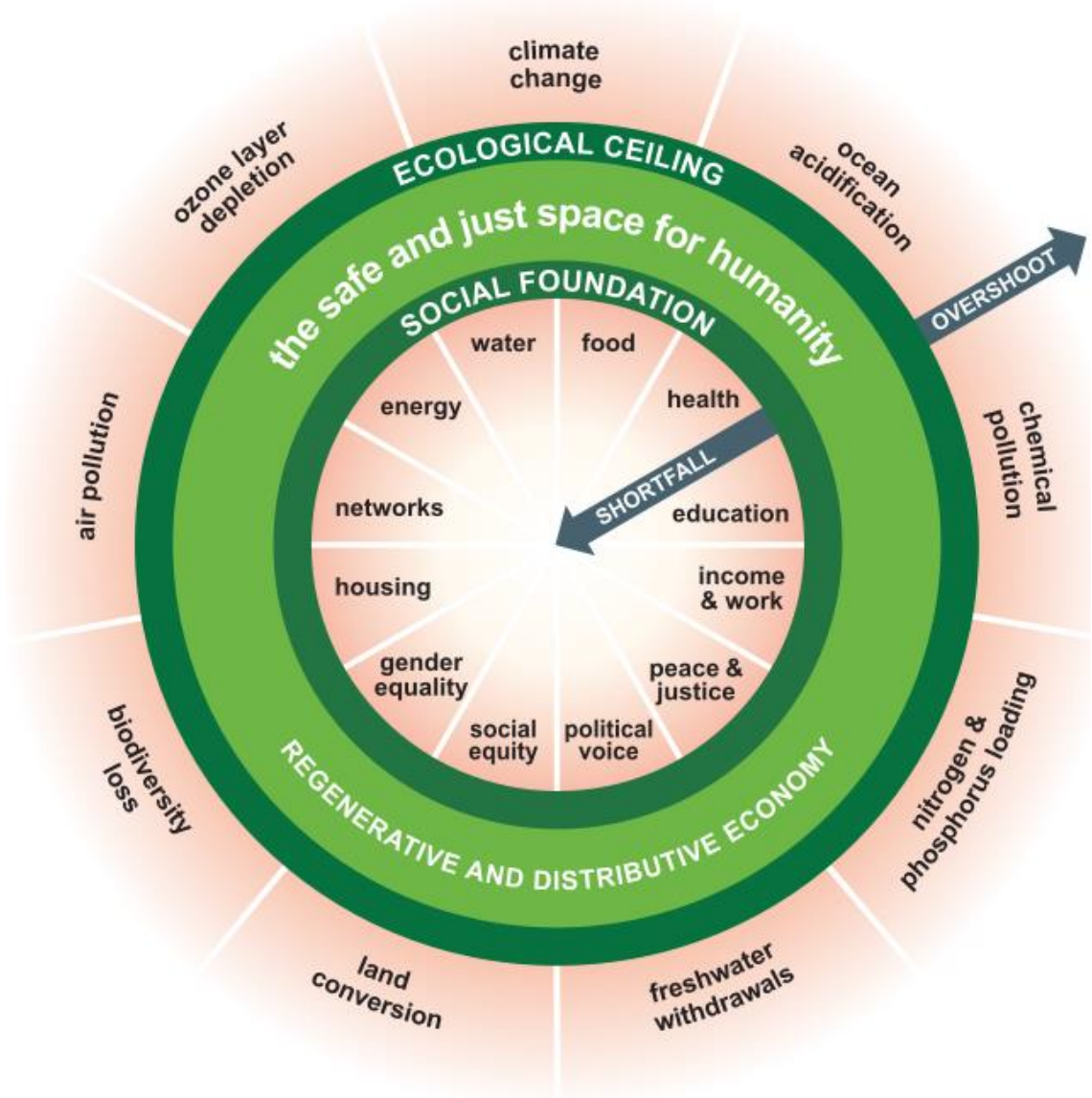

3. **PURPOSE:** Create school classes devoted to helping boys and young men find and pursue purpose in life including, life-long career development.
4. **MENTORS:** Encourage mentorship by creating programs and funding streams.
5. **HELP:** Help all youth looking for help. Create digital tools for boys and young men to easily find the help they need.
6. **STAFF:** Better compensate and support frontline staff work with boys and young men.
7. **INVESTMENTS:** Create long-term investments in programs for boys and young men.

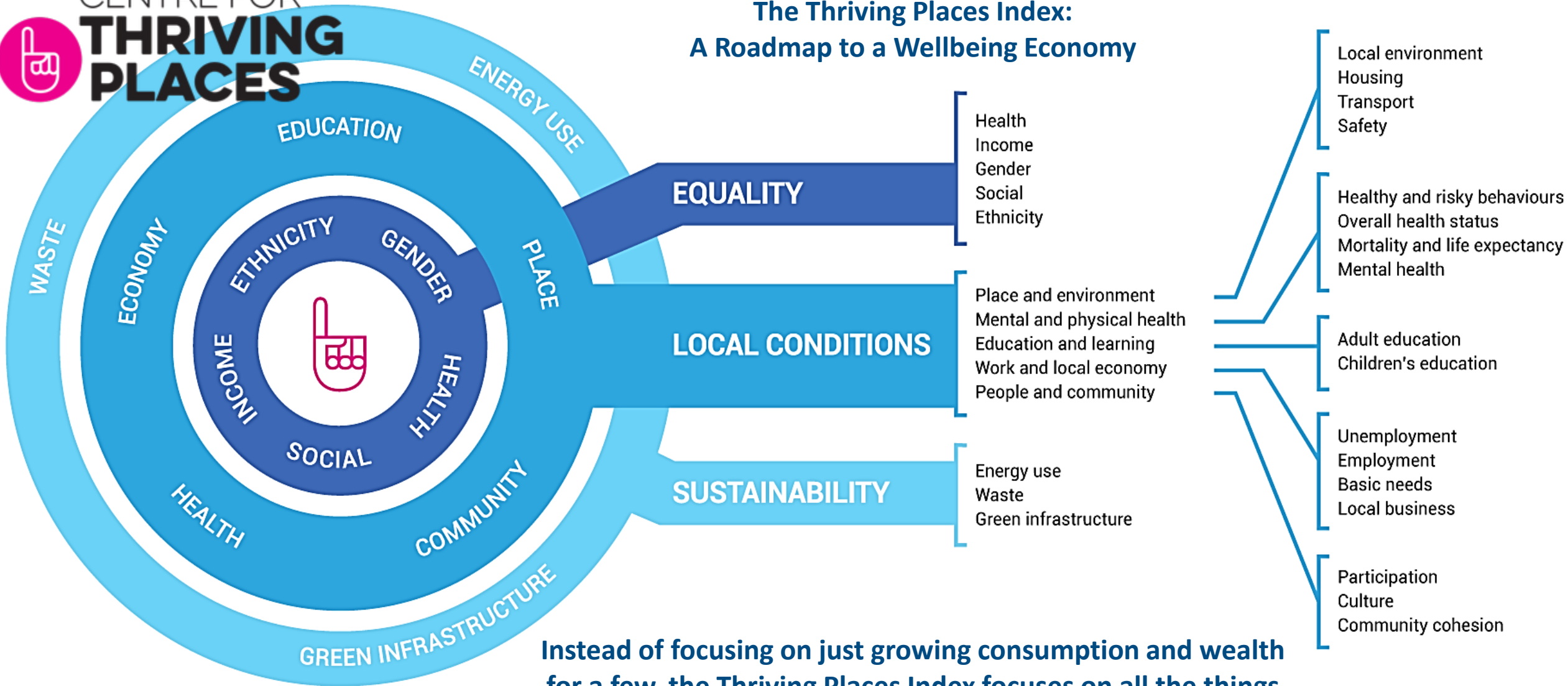

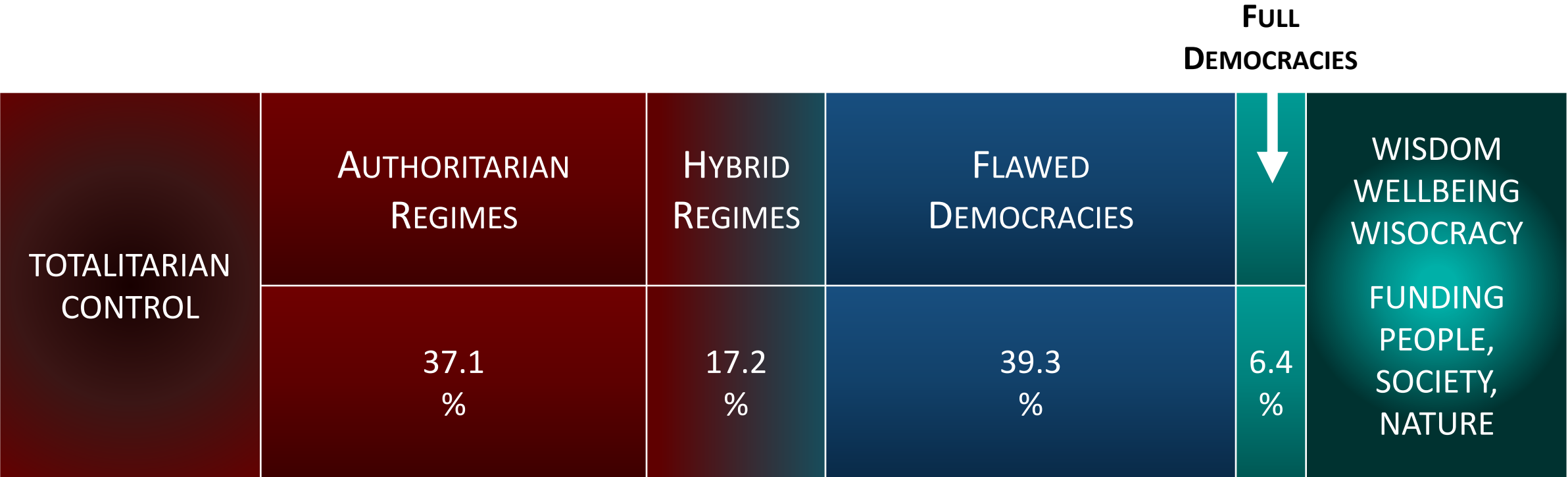

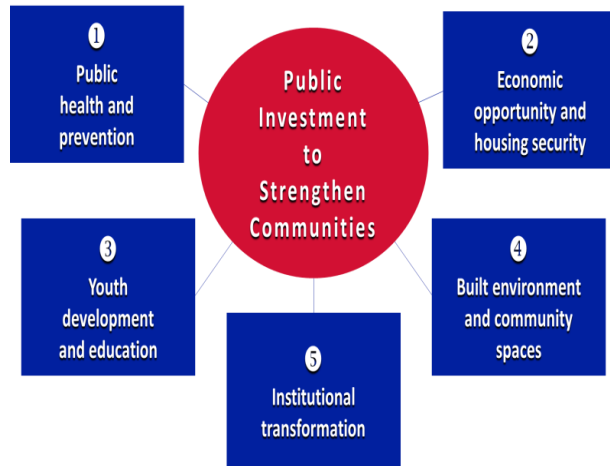

# Strengthening Communities



- In December 2022, I read articles on the BBC website about gangs taking over Haiti.
- It led me to do more research on the problems of Haiti and gangs.

# Transforming Gangs to Pro-Social Enterprises



- 1. Global gangs are proliferating. They grow around the world in a culture of corruption, crime, and violence, due to a lack of quality education and lack of opportunity, resulting in unemployment.**
- 2. The lack of quality education and lack of opportunities for young people are leading people to join gangs to make a living.**

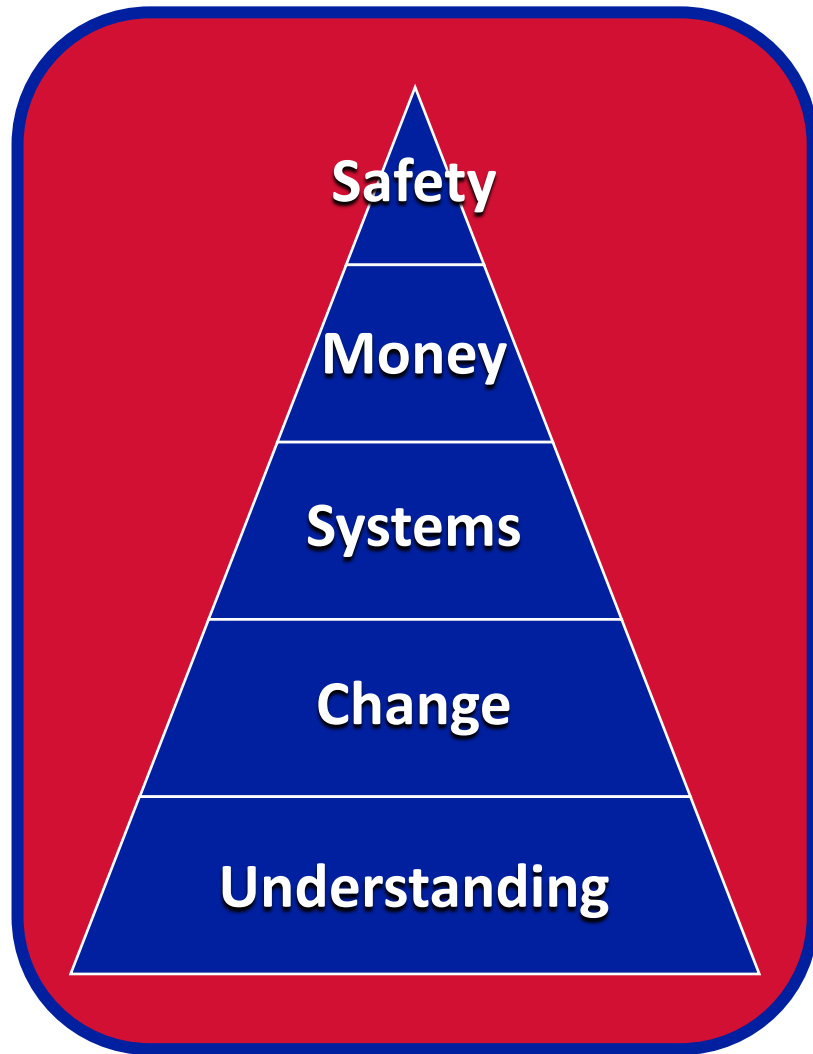


- 3. Gang members engage in militias, extortion, kidnapping, sex trafficking, selling guns and drugs, theft, and burglary as daily work.**
- 4. Policymakers, governments, and foundations can create Community Learning Labs for opportunities to evolve gangs into pro-social enterprises.**

# Why Gang Members Won't Use the Community Learning Lab



1. **UNDERSTANDING:** They don't know what a Community Learning Lab does.
2. **CHANGE:** Like many people, they are uncomfortable with what is new to them and uncomfortable with change.
3. **SYSTEMS:** They don't realize we can work to change the educational, cultural, political, and economic systems to benefit them.
4. **MONEY:** They need money from their present activities.
5. **SAFTEY:** They fear they will be disliked by their own gang members and members of other gangs and be harmed by them.

## Weakening Communities

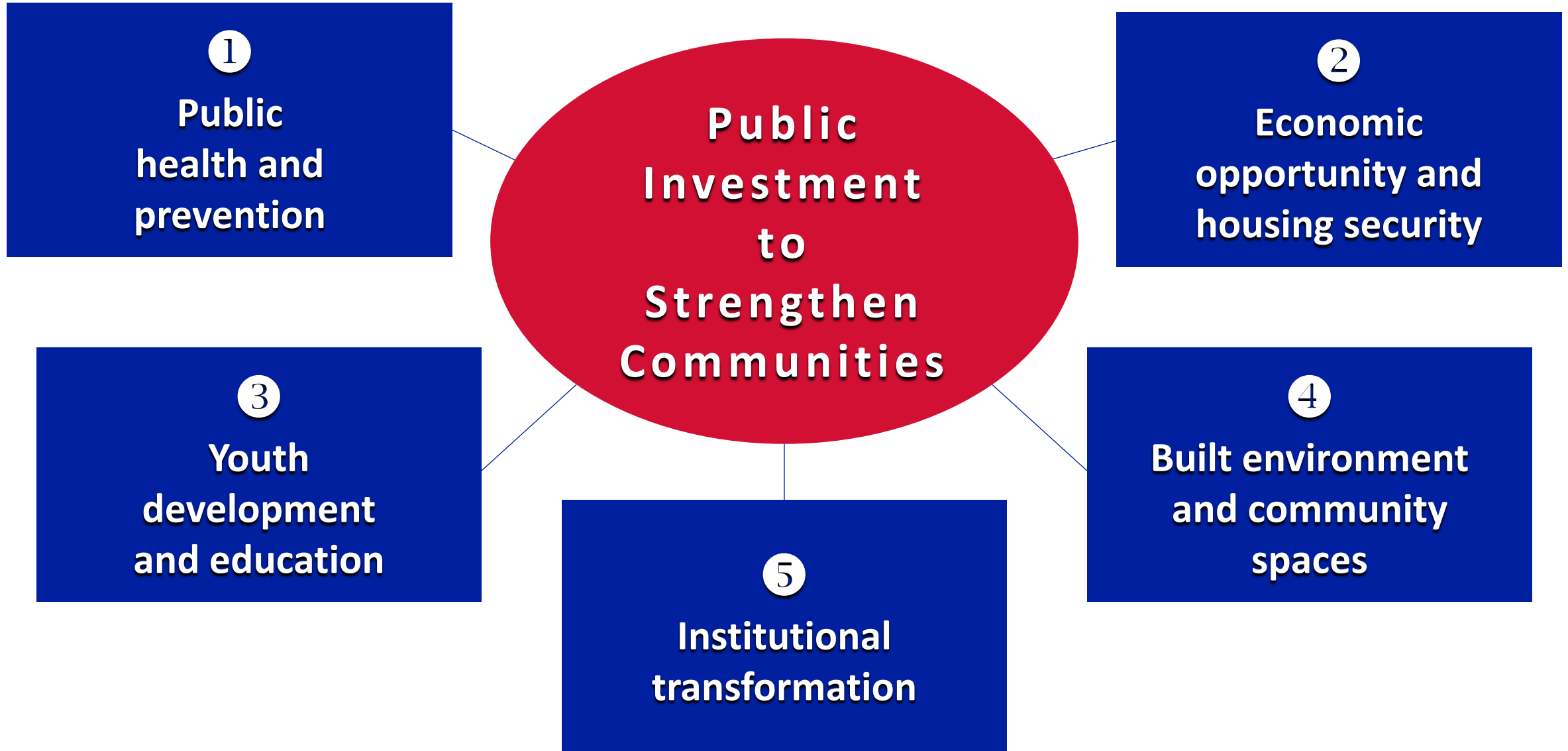
1. Low-income communities are vulnerable to gang infiltration and proliferation.
2. Gang members then terrorize young people and shop owners.
3. Young people then look for protection from gangs by joining gangs.
4. They then get involved with gangs for money through the sale of drugs and guns, extortion, and kidnapping.
5. Burglary, robbery, and violence then increase.

- **Built environment and community spaces to lower stress can significantly reduce crime.**
- **Increase grant funding for place-based neighborhood improvement projects.**
- **Transform abandoned homes and buildings and clean vacant lots.**
- **Create green neighborhood-led projects for “third spaces” such as parks, cafes, and community centers to lower stress & increase connections.**

## Institutional transformation

- **Provide sustainable and accessible funding for grassroots organizations.**
- **Enhance the capacity of community-based organizations.**
- **Create a community safety division at the Department of Health and Human Services for civilian agencies dedicated to community safety.**

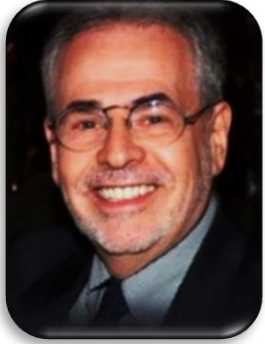
